Greetings My Masonic Family!

I hope everyone will enjoy the month of August with its beautiful weather and glorious scenery our Creator has provided us. The bountiful trees, peaceful rivers and lakes, vast farmlands and of course, majestic mountains, I believe Kentucky truly is a magnificent state and it makes me proud to be a Kentucky Mason.

Brothers, this leads me to the question, “What makes a Mason?” If I were to pose this question to some of you, perhaps your response would be related to your ritualistic experiences. Some might assert that their obligations make them a Mason or that striving to be more charitable is the key. We are often told that being a Mason is signified by what we invest back into the Fraternity and that is what determines what we get out of it. What exactly does that mean to each of you? Are you truly invested into this wonderful Fraternity and if so, by how much? SCOTTISH RITE ROTC & JROTC PROGRAMS


Summer vacation is over and schools are back in session, which doesn't mean much to most of us unless you have a school -age child at home, or your commute is affected by school traffic. But there is a Scottish Rite program of which you may not be aware that benefits students enrolled in JROTC (Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps) or ROTC (Reserve Officers Training Corps).

Commencing in 1998 and approved by the Assistant Secretary of Defense, the Supreme Council, Southern Jurisdiction, initiated a program of recognition for outstanding Junior ROTC students. This initiative recognizes high school youth enrolled in the JROTC unit for their scholastic excellence and patriotic Americanism efforts. The award consists of a medal, ribbon and a certificate suitable for framing. The medal depicts the heraldic logo of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, and by the words "JROTC Education and Americanism" calls attention to two of the major focal points of the Scottish Rite. This award recognizes one outstanding cadet in the second year or second to last year of their commitment to a unit. The award cannot be bestowed on a cadet in his/her first or last year of the program.

The Cadet must: Have contributed the most among cadets on campus to encourage and demonstrate Americanism by deeds or conduct during participation in extracurricular activities or community projects, Have demonstrated academic excellence by being in the top 25% of his/her academic class, Have demonstrated outstanding leadership by exhibiting qualities of dependability, good character, self-discipline, good citizenship and patriotism, Have not previously received this award. The DAI/SAI or other senior service official or the head of the school (or both) will make the selection.

Commencing in 2002, and approved by the Assistant Secretary of Defense, the Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, instituted a similar award for ROTC cadets. Like the JROTC Award Program, the recipient receives three recognitions: a certificate suitable for framing, a medal, and a ribbon. The Professor of Military/Naval Science will make the selection.

Requests for the award should be sent to the nearest Scottish Rite Valley of the Southern Jurisdiction. With 30 days prior notice of the presentation ceremony, whenever possible the Scottish Rite Valley which provided the award will select and provide a presenter. Perhaps you know of a deserving young person who qualifies for this award.

“I Didn’t Know That.....”

It has been over 11 years (April 2011) since the early 18th century “Copiale Cipher” was broken, studied and six months after, released to the public. Discovered in 1970, in a German Library, cryptologists found it unworkable to decipher or even a possible hoax, until Swedish Scientist Christiane Shaefer and University of Southern California specialist in machine translation, Dr. Kevin Knight, met at a conference. Shaefer had received the manuscript several years earlier as a challenge from a friend to find a solution to the mysterious, but beautifully bound, 75,000 word, 105 page, manuscript. “Copiale 3” and “Philipp 1866” were on the cover page, un-coded, and it would offer a big clue to the language of the manuscript.


Knight began the intensive work of translating the symbols into a format which the computer could understand. ‘Copiale 3’ seemed to indicate that this was ‘copy three’, and the German spelling of ‘Philipp’, with two end “p”s, suggested the possible language. 90 characters plus Greek and Roman letters, made up the pages, and proved difficult to decipher, until it was realized that the Roman characters were no more than spaces in the code, placed to throw one ‘off the tract’. Multiple symbols were also used for the same word. Slowly it came together and the first 16 pages were deciphered and translated into English.

S. Brent Morris, 33°, G.C., a retired U.S. government mathematician, and recent guest of Covington Scottish Rite explained, “This is a homophonic cipher, or a substitution cipher with ‘variants’. In other words, low frequency letters (g, q, j, etc.), map to only one cipher character, while high frequency letters (a, e, n, etc.) can be represented by several cipher characters. The goal of such a cipher is to ‘flatten’ the frequency distribution of cipher characters. As just one example, in normal English ‘e’ is about 13% of all letters; with five cipher variants, each would appear about 2½% of the time”.

When Shaefer discovered that the character that was thought to be a ‘lip’ was actually an ‘eye’, it appeared the pages described an initiation ceremony of the “High Enlightened Oculist Order”, in which the candidate, surrounded by surgical instruments, is asked to read a blank piece of paper and, on confessing inability to do so, is given eyeglasses and asked to read it again. Then after washing the eyes with a cloth, followed by an “operation” in which a single eyebrow hair is plucked, the paper is switched and then, “Congratulations! Now you can see.” The “Oculists” used ‘sight’ as a metaphor for knowledge. It was believed at the time, the document had been created in the 1730’s. Another discovered copy confirms the ceremony described above.

‘Pig pen’ substitution ciphers appeared early France in the Masonic degrees. Later it was used in the English Mark Man/Mark Mason degrees, and is still used by some Grand Royal Arch Chapters. In days gone by, the Scottish Rite made use of numerous ciphers, but nothing so intricate as the Copiale Cipher.

Although the word ‘freemasonry’ was found in the interpretation of the manuscript, what was not found by the team, was that the manuscript actually contained an early German Freemasonic ritual of the symbolic degrees. Certainly masonic jargon hid much of this, as the manuscript described two officers as ‘younger provost’ and ‘older provost’, and



two more as door keeper and younger doorkeeper. How would the machine or any interpreter, decipher “The Lodge is tyled ‘?’ It would take someone familiar with early 18th century German Masonic ritual to discover this, and that someone was Illustrious Arturo de Hoyos, 33°, and Grand Archivist of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of the Southern Jurisdiction, who just happens to be a scholar in 18th century German documents, and noticed the Masonic similarities.

De Hoyes suggested replacing some of the translations such as “Eye Doctor” or “Oculist,” with “Maurer” the 18th century German word for “Mason” (which is still in use), and known Masonic ritual appeared.

Also included in the Copiale Manuscript, is the Scots Master degree. Scots Master Lodges existed in London as early as 1733, and they made ordinary Master Masons, ‘Scots Masters’. It is not known what consisted of this ceremony. The ‘Copiale 3’ states that the Scots Master is a new ceremony and may add some needed light.

In 1737, Pope Clement XII issued a Bull condemning Freemasonry. In 1740, the Mopses, which were an antagonistic group of both Catholic men and women, became active in Germany. The Copiale Manuscript mentions the ‘Mopses’ and possibly may be part of the reason for the need to hide Freemasonry under the name ‘Oculist’, and preserve the ritual in code. If true, that would date the manuscript near 1742, about the time the first Scots Master ritual became known. However, this is just a guess and the manuscript may well be several years later.

‘Freedom’s’ are espoused throughout this early ritual, well before the American Constitution and Bill of Rights. Although today’s ritual has changed considerably from the early or mid-1700’s, it is amazing how much substance of early Masonic thought that remains.

He told of how he conversed with one of the members from the Grand Lodge In Exile who had not been able to

communicate with his Masonic Brother who was also his biological brother for a great period. This conversation resonated loudly with me over the Independence Day Holiday. As I sat and conversed with family and with friends who have served in Our Nation's Military to continue to protect my rights I was extremely humbled and felt a greater sense of Nationalism, Patriotism and Fraternalism in knowing that our Founding Fathers concept of certain inalienable, God-given rights are still cherished and protected today.

Take a moment to reflect and reconsider just how lucky we are to have the rights of assembly and free speech. Rights that are crucial to our Fraternity. And then, take a second to offer devotions for our Masonic Brethren who do not enjoy the same rights and freedoms yet still proudly carry on our good works. Lastly, take a second to say "Thank You" to the veteran's past, present and future who secure these rights for us.

August 3, 1956, President Eisenhower signed a bill to pay tribute to the fallen unknown soldiers of the Korean War and World War II, by interring them with honors in a specially designated area in Arlington National Cemetery. 




