### PADUCAH LODGE NO. 127 HOSTS KENTUCKY NATIONAL GUARDS 2113<sup>TH</sup>



On September 10th Paducah Kentucky's Post 1191, in conjunction with Paducah's Masonic Lodge #127, and a group of small business owners hosted the Kentucky National Guards 2113th Transportation Company's first family picnic after returning from Iraq earlier this year. With well over 300 people present some "good old boys" cooked up 242 pounds of hamburgers, pork loin, and polish sausage, 50 packages of hamburger buns, 30 cases of various soda, and gallons and gallons of coleslaw and potato salad. According to Dean Owen, trustee of VFW Post 1191 "to say it was an amazing event would be an understatement".

The 2113th unit returned from Iraq to a small town that is extremely appreciative of their sacrifice. Dean Owen, a primary organizer, states "on the memory of September 11

most of us get a huge knot in our stomach and a tear starts to well up in even the strongest man's eye, these are the guys who make that pain go away, they make us feel safe again, they are the heroes among us, we feel gratitude in being able to say thanks".

The event started when Larry McCullough, post commander, and Dean Owen, a local CPA, decided the post needed more focus on their mission. Dean or Larry often said "we have to be a place Veterans get more than cheap drinks, society will not reward our organization if that is our primary focus", they did not realize they were echoing the thoughts of the National and State leadership of the VFW. Larry was quick to set times for them to meet local unit Commanders, Family Support Groups and started asking "what do you need help with".

Just over 100 years ago, in a the small community of Clover Bottom, Kentucky, in Jackson County stood the Masonic Lodge of Indian Creek #614 Free and Accepted Masons. They received the petition of a man in his late forties and elected him to receive the degrees of Freemasonry. His name was Berry Henderson Powell and I wonder how proud he would be today if he knew that his 2nd great-grandson, Clinton Edward Powell - my father, and his 3rd great grandson Gregory Clinton Powell had followed his path to further enlightenment in Masonry. Could Brother B. H. Powell have ever envisioned that one of his descendants would ever be so honored as to be elected the 197th Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky Free and Accepted Masons? Our family primarily originated from East Central Kentucky within the counties of Clay, Owsley, Jackson, and Rockcastle and from this land my father's family moved to Richmond, Indiana where he met and married my mother, Sandra Kay Williams.

I was blessed to find my wife, Nancy Lyons, within the view of the Washington Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia and we chose the Northern Kentucky region to raise our family and have been blessed with two children, Caitlyn Rose and Garrett Gregory. This is our moment not only to shine as the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, but also to display our pride as being Kentucky Freemasons.

Our goal in the coming year is to build upon the foundation of our forefathers by enhancing the strength of our blue lodges and their visibility within our communities. This will be accomplished through two programs tailored to strengthen our blue lodge with 10 Masonic Leadership Conferences and enhancing our community awareness with a minimum of two National Masonic Model Programs within our Commonwealth.

It is my ardent desire that when a brother is asked if he is a Mason, that he would not only reply "Yes, I am a Mason", but that more importantly he would respond "Yes, I am a *Kentucky Freemason!*"

In this case the Family Picnic was the most pressing need. 'With the rearrangement of people, the recent deployment, and a very high operating tempo, this was going to be a difficult undertaking for us to take on, the VFW's assistance was invaluable, the event went off extremely well, and our soldiers really had a great time" according to Capt. Sayer, the units commanding officer.

The idea to tag team with small business owners and a local Mason's Lodge was Dean's idea, he states "most of these organizations have a very charitable spirit, but an older membership, this kind of event is a massive undertaking and takes a lot of manpower, it seemed like common sense to ask them to join us in hosting this group and share some manpower." Masonic Lodges face many of the same struggles our posts do, aging members and a need for stronger leadership, "our communities are all willing to jump in and help these units, there just has to be someone who takes a leadership role and punts . His advice to other posts is "just get out and commit to doing great things for these guys, ask for help from the community if necessary, and have faith, America's small towns are EXTREMELY patriotic, they will help in any way needed". Dean is also the treasurer at Paducah's Masonic Lodge #127, but states "these organizations all want to


help, they just need to know how, and in that environment, all we have to do is take on the leadership role.

This was also the VFW membership drive weekend, and VFW Post 1191 picked up 12 new members, members with recent combat experience. Larry McCullough said "These are the faces of the new VFW.. these guys need our help, and they want to help each other, there simply is no other organization in a position to help these guys transition back to civilian life."

The event sets forth a "recipe for success" for other posts to consider. Dean's recipe for success is pretty simple "take on a leadership role, ask for help, and commit to doing some great things for your own community. There are posts in almost every community where there is an Army Reserve or National Guard Unit, simply be proactive, and start helping these guys, they need the help, and the posts need to be helping."

The Post has committed to hosting the Families of Benton Kentucky's National Guard Unit who are deployed for Thanksgiving, and the Paducah National Guard and the Army Reserve Units for Christmas. According to Larry "this is a critical part of our mission, to help Combat Veterans and their family, I am not sure how much closer to our core mission we can get."



## BOB EVANS, 33° THE GALLIA COUNTY FARM BOY



Bob Evans  
Founder

Bro. Bob Evans grew his small twelve-stool diner into a successful chain of 590 restaurants by insisting on quality in everything he did.

Family car trips are the stuff of memories. "Are we there yet?" "That's my side of the seat!" "When can we stop? I'm hungry!" The latter plaintive cry, usually indicating that collapse from starvation is imminent, leads the driver to review highway signs with increased vigilance, looking for a restaurant that meets the varied dietary demands of the vehicle's occupants. If you happen to be traveling in one of the nineteen states from Kansas east to New York plus Mississippi and Florida, a Bob Evans Restaurant is the answer to your prayers.

This chain of 590 great restaurants was started by Ill. Bob Evans, 33°, from Gallia County in southeastern Ohio. The Evans have always been farmers, so Bob knew about producing superior food, and his mother taught him to appreciate good eating. She served the family cornbread and beans during the Depression, but it was good food of high quality, even if they didn't have much. In 1943, 25-year-old Bro. Evans bought his first restaurant for \$3,200—\$0 down and \$500 every six months.

The location of his first restaurant was near the Ohio River, just across from West Virginia, and led to his success. After World War II, there were few cars available, and Detroit factories shipped them on double-decker automobile carriers around the country. The state of West Virginia, however, didn't allow double-deckers on their highways. Manufacturers thus dropped off their new cars in Gallipolis, Ohio, where they would be picked up and driven through West Virginia into the South. Bob Evans' restaurant was near the drop-off point, and he kept it open 24 hours a day for the truckers.

Bob's wife, Jewell Evans, was his right hand when he started his restaurant. "I couldn't have done it without her," he said. "She's the best cook and has taste buds like you wouldn't believe. She can take one taste of something and tell you all the spices and flavorings in it." Bro. Steve Evans, 32°, Bob's son, said it took both his mom and dad to make a success of the restaurant, with his dad leaving the house before 4:00 a.m. each day for the restaurant, and his mom running the farm and raising the kids.

One of the problems that Bro. Bob had at the restaurant was getting good quality sausage; most was fatty and made from scraps. To remedy this situation, he started making his own sausage in 1948 from hogs raised on the Evans farm, but unlike other sausage makers, he used prime meat, including tenderloins and hams. The quality of his sausage was a hit with his customers, especially the truck drivers.

The drivers spread the word about the Bob Evans Restaurant and the quality of its food, especially the sausage, and they started buying buckets of sausage to take back home with them. Pretty soon the demand convinced Ill. Evans that he needed to get serious about producing sausage, but he would need financial backing for his factory. For this he turned to his father.

Bob Evans' dad, Bro. Stanley Evans, was a grocer and almost went broke during the Depression because he gave credit to people who couldn't pay their bills. Bob explained to him his plan to sell high-quality sausage for \$0.59 a pound—when regular sausage was selling for \$0.19! His dad, with years of grocery experience, said Bob's sausage would be too expensive, but he'd back the factory on one condition: it had to have large sliding doors on the end so it could be used to store tractors when the factory failed.

The original Bob Evans sausage factory operated only from October to April, because he couldn't afford air conditioning. He delivered his sausage in an old bread truck that

cost \$75 and was chilled each morning with blocks of ice. His modest equipment, however, was backed by an exceptional business philosophy: "Quality is long remembered after the price is forgotten." And the success of Bro. Evans' business philosophy had been confirmed over and over by his faithful customers throughout the eastern half of the country.

Bob Evans believes in Masonic principles 100% and is proud to be a Mason. He said, "You don't hesitate to trust Masons. Whenever they tell you something, you know it will be the truth." His father and everyone he knew as a boy were Masons. Ill. Evans had a lot of respect for the fraternity, and he said it was just natural for him to join. He was Raised in 1940 Morning Dawn Lodge No. 7, Gallipolis, Ohio, joined the Valley of Cincinnati, and received his 33rd Degree in 1997. Brother Masons always ate at Bob Evans' first restaurant, especially on their way to hunt, providing some of the crucial initial support for his business.

This faith in brother Masons is illustrated by Bob's story about Ill. Harlan Sanders, 33°, founder of the Kentucky Fried Chicken restaurants. The two Masons met at a food show where Bob was selling his sausage and Harlan was frying chicken. Bro. Sanders' booth was so small that he didn't have room to sit down, so Bro. Bob let him rest his feet in his booth. After talking with Harlan about his ways with chickens, Bob decided to purchase a Kentucky Fried Chicken franchise from the "Colonel," just the third one sold.

KFC franchising was so new then that Harlan didn't even have contracts prepared. The two Masonic brothers sealed the deal the way Masons have for centuries—with a handshake. Bob Evans agreed to buy his spiced flour from Harlan Sanders and to pay him \$0.07 for each chicken fried. Bob Evans gave his support to a brother Mason at a critical time and helped launch the success of Kentucky Fried Chicken.

When asked what made his own restaurant a success when so many others have tried and failed in the same business, Bob Evans said he always watched the quality of the food, the meat, and his people. Bro. Jeremy Dewitt, 32°, Assistant Manager of Bob Evans Restaurant No. 1, added "Farming is physically hard, but running a restaurant is mentally hard." Bro. Bob not only brought an obsession with quality to his restaurant, but also had the business sense that made it wildly successful.

A good way to tell that you have achieved stature in an industry is when your competitors use your management philosophy to train their own employees. Bob Evans is very proud that one of his restaurant maxims is framed on the wall of McDonald's "Hamburger University": "The most expensive way to get rid of bad food is to sell it."

Bob Evans retired as president of Bob Evans Farms in 1986, and literally went out to pasture. He returned to his farm roots and started studying grasses and dairy cattle with Ohio State University. He's working to breed cows that will produce milk ten months a year and then be idle for two months, thus giving dairy farmers two months relief from the constant care of their herds. He is also working to develop a grass that grows all year long and is green during the winter. This would eliminate the need for hay, barns, tractors, and fuel. Such a grass hybrid would revolutionize dairy farming!

One of Bro. Bob's proudest moments came when President Ronald Reagan was speaking at Ohio State University with tens of thousands of people on hand. Bro. Bob had been working in the agriculture campus and was in his farm clothes with typical barnyard muck on his boots. While he was mingling with the vast crowd with no thought of ever getting inside the stadium to hear the president, a Secret Service agent came up and tapped him on the shoulder. He said, "Are you Bob Evans? The president wants to meet you." So here was the Gallia County farm boy, dirty from working on the farm, being asked to meet with the President of the United States.

There can be no doubt that Ill. Bob Evans, 33°, is a success!

## FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

Congratulations to the recently installed Most Worshipful Grand Master, Gregory C. Powell and to his corps of officers, both elected and appointed, for the 2006—2007 Masonic Year. Each Masonic year brings new challenges that the Fraternity and the Grand Lodge Officers must deal with, while at the same time continuing to deal with those problems and challenges from years past that are still unresolved. To meet these challenges effectively will require employing new solutions and innovated thinking on the part of the Grand Lodge Officers and the team selected by the Grand Master, along with the support of every lodge, lodge office and member of this Grand Jurisdiction. There is no doubt that when this new Masonic year ends next October, the Fraternity will have benefited from the efforts and enthusiasm of the Grand Master and his administration.

Several recent movies, books and TV programs (The DaVinci Code, National Treasurer, etc.) have generated a lot of public exposure for—and interest in—the Fraternity lately. While the media have not portrayed Freemasonry in a negative light, as is the case with most fiction writers, they occasionally take literary liberty with the facts. The Masonic Information Center has prepared a statement for the Craft when responding to queries from those who may not be familiar with the Fraternity. It is printed below, by permission.

(Masonic Information Center, Volume 13, Issue 3/September, 2006, A Communication of the Masonic Service Association of N.A.)

Freemasonry is a highly respected, centuries-old-fraternity dating from – at least – the time of the stoneworker's guilds of medieval Europe, making it an attractive topic for legitimate research and for wild speculation. Recently, the Masonic fraternity has been woven into the plotline of a number of fictional movies and books that put

Freemasonry back into the realm of popular culture. The privacy associated with the fraternity has been exploited as secretive, and popular culture has been given inventions of fantasy such as the following myths about Masonic identity: Freemasonry as a Guardian of the Holy Grail; keepers of an enormous fortune; a sinister force, who together with the Jews, are involved in a plot to take over the world; a threat to religious freedom; or a group of men who somehow must have something to hide. Although entertaining concepts, these false interpretations fail to present the authentic purposes of the Masonic order. Purposes that are found in its system of values based upon the following cornerstones: the dignity of man and the liberty of the individual; the right of all persons to worship as they choose; the formation of democratic governments, and the importance of public education.




