GRAND MASTER'S MESSAGE

As we enter the month when we celebrate the birth of one of our most infamous Masons, Brother George Washington, I decided it would be appropriate to reflect on our heritage by exploring an old book entitled, "The

Lodge of Washington, a History of the Alexandria Washington Lodge, No. 22, A.F.&A.M. of Alexandria, VA." I obtained this book through my wife's side of the family in Alexandria, VA. This book dates back to 1899 and I found an interesting footnote entitled "The Stuff Grand Masters Are Made Of."

Brother Taylor, Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence of the Grand Lodge of Nevada in his Report for 1872, tells the following good story: "While the genial Hopkins was Grand Master here, he made a business trip to a mountain town in California, and there visited a Lodge. Being, of course, as a Past Master, seated by the side of the Master of the Lodge, the latter, during a lull in the business of the Lodge, fell into conversation, and asked Brother Hopkins if he knew Brother Abell (Grand Secretary of California). Brother Hopkins

said he did, and thereupon proceeded to pay some well-deserved compliments to the ability of Brother Abell as a Grand Secretary. 'Yes, indeed,' said the Worshipful Master, 'I tell you it takes a mighty smart man to be a good Grand Secretary, but any ____ fool can be a Grand Master!' Brother Hopkins heartily responded, 'that's so!' but he did not disclose his official capacity to the Worshipful Master, who never knew what a 'palpable hit' he might have made, if Brother Hopkins had only been 'that kind of man.'" I wonder how true this sentiment would reign today if poised to the Grand Craft of Kentucky?

Originally chartered as Alexandria Lodge, No. 39 under the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania, they had two Masters serve until April 28, 1788, when the Pennsylvania Warrant was surrendered, and a new Charter issued by the Grand Lodge of Virginia, under the name and designation of the Alexandria Lodge, No. 22, in which General Washington was appointed Worshipful Master; and at the annual election of officers, on the 20th of December, 1788, Washington was re-elected to the office of Worshipful Master for the year commencing with St. John's Day (December 27th), 1788. So now you know why St. John's Day is so prominent in our history as the Grand Lodge of Kentucky.

Be proud of our Kentucky heritage and stand tall as a KENTUCKY FREEMASON!



FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

As the birthday of the Father of our Country and our Masonic Brother George Washington is celebrated on February 22nd, many lodges are preparing to host a lodge program commemorating the event. Also during the month of February, a day is set aside to remember and honor all past Presidents of the United States for their service to our Country. And while we generally remember Brother George Washington as the "first" President, there were fourteen others who served as President, either of the Continental Congress, or the "United States" under the Articles of Confederation, before Brother Washington was elected to office on April 6, 1789, under the Constitution of the United States of America.

An interesting article, written by John R. Nocas, MPS (P.M., S.C.R.L.), appeared in the February, 2005 issue of the Southern California Research Lodge, F&AM Newsletter about the fourteen Presidents who served our nation in the Continental Congress, and later under the Articles of Confederation, four of whom were Freemasons, before George Washington was elected President of the United States. Brother Nocas termed these fourteen "OUR FORGOTTEN PRESIDENTS." I would dare say that he picked an appropriate heading for his article and brought an interesting fact to our attention, of which I feel comfortable in saying, that not many of us, if indeed any of us, were aware.

The fourteen Presidents listed in the article are:

Brother Peyton Randolph (1774) Virginia
Henry Middleton (1774—1775)
South Carolina

***Brother John Hancock** ((1775—1777)
Boston

Brother Henry Laurens (1777—1778)
South Carolina

John Jay (1778—1779) New York

Samuel Huntington (1779—1781)
Connecticut

Thomas McKean (1781) Delaware, May
have been a Freemason, but no proof.

John Hanson (1781) Maryland, First
President under Articles of
Confederation

Elias Boudinot (1782—1783) New Jersey

Thomas Mifflin (1783—1784)
Pennsylvania

Richard Henry Lee (1784—1785) Virginia

***Brother John Hancock** (1785—1786)
Reelected, but resigned in May, 1786,
because of ill health.

Nathaniel Gorham (1786—1787)
Massachusetts

Brother Arthur St. Clair (1787) Governor
of Northwest Territory

Cyrus Griffin (1788—1789) Virginia

*You will note that Brother John Hancock is listed twice, having served as both President of the Continental Congress and, later, as President of the "United States" under the Article of Confederation.

The first seven listed served as Presidents of the Continental Congress; the last eight listed served as Presidents of the "United States" under the Articles of Confederation.

LODGE LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE

Sometime ago I asked our local insurance carrier, Accordia of Kentucky, to furnish this office with a general summary of the two types of insurance coverage, provided by the Grand Lodge Blanket Insurance Coverage, that is the most common concern of most Lodges. Since the information is still current, I think it would be beneficial to print it again, as follows:

RE: 1. Liability Insurance

2. Workers Compensation Insurance

As you know, your Lodge is provided Liability Insurance Coverage by a master policy through Grand Lodge. That policy covers your normal Lodge activities, whether they occur in your building or elsewhere (Examples: Parade, Picnic, etc).

The policy, however, is not meant to cover operations not usual for a Lodge. If, for example, you hold a regular Fish Fry, your Lodge should have a separate Liability Policy to cover the operation. Additionally, if you let other groups use your Lodge, you need separate Liability Coverage.

The Grand Lodge also provides a workers' compensation policy to cover the employees usual to a Lodge. Typically your Lodge may have a person doing clerical work or general maintenance of the Lodge facility. The policy is not designed to cover people who are hired to do other work not closely affiliated with the operation of the Lodge. If, for example, the Lodge owns farm property, and hires individuals to work on the farm, your Lodge should purchase its own workers compensation policy to cover those employees. Remember, the Master Workers Compensation Policy is provided to cover the employees that are usual to the operation of your Lodge.

Each January a "Memorandum of Insurance" certificate, summarizing the coverage each Lodge has, is mailed to each Secretary. Note that this insurance covers only Lodge activities- it does not extend coverage to the building. If the Lodge owns the building, additional Liability coverage is a must in order to protect the Lodge and its membership against liability claims.

If you have specific questions regarding the Insurance coverage, you may direct them to either the Accordia Agency (James Solley) at the number listed below, or this office- whichever best suits you.



fitness facilities and also may reserve the center for special events. Along with a catering kitchen, the center also includes a parlor, conference room and gathering room.




