A little over a year ago, I had the honor and privilege to captain a flight in which we had a military escort on board serving in one of his highest roles, which was of escorting the remains of one of our fallen heroes home for the last time. I found the parallels between politics in Masonry and politics on fighting was quite similar in the fact that when one of our boys comes home for the last time, no one asks your opinion on party affiliation or position on the current war our men and women are fighting for us today. No ill will arose, no off comment was made, there was no disrespectful gesture displayed; just an awesome respect arose from the 140+ passengers bound for Florida on a sunny day in Atlanta, Georgia. Peace and harmony prevailed that day.

You see, when I made an announcement over the PA that one of our fallen heroes was heading home and was under military escort, you could have heard a pin drop on that aircraft. Time stood still as I told them that I would appreciate them remaining in their seats so that the escort could disembark the plane first to go down to the ramp and guard the casket. Not a soul moved, except to thank the military man who had volunteered

to be his friend's escort home. Needless to say, there were not many dry eyes in the cabin of that aircraft that day.

As I then accompanied the military escort to the ramp and we arrived at the cargo hold containing the casket, I asked about our hero and where he came from. He said that he was his best friend in Coast Guard training and they had just completed training and his friend had said that he didn't feel well and died shortly after. You see, his friend had found out during training that he had cancer and didn't want anyone to know. All he wanted to do in this life was to complete his training and serve his Country proudly. He left behind a young wife with two small children.

The baggage cart arrived shortly after, and the honored casket; containing the remains of our fallen hero, was gently placed on the cart. If you have ever seen baggage handlers work, they don't know what gentle is, but they did that day. I asked the driver to take good care of his cargo and his escort and the driver replied, "No problem Captain, he is one of ours!" as he pointed to a military lapel pin that he proudly wore on his employee uniform.

Could you ever be more proud to be an American at that moment? How many times have you felt the same way when we confer the last sad rites for a fallen Masonic Brother? Remember, as a Kentucky Freemason, You Will Always Be One Of Ours!!!

Each Lodge Secretary will receive the "Award Eligibility List" from the Grand Lodge Office in early May for those eligible for the 50, 60, and 75 year Grand Lodge Veteran's Awards. You will be sent instructions with your list that will explain specifically how to fill it out. Please follow these instructions precisely.

The plateaus in time that a Brother must reach to qualify for these awards are significant, and the Grand Lodge Office wants to insure that those Brothers due the award receive it timely. So, we encourage you to give this review your close attention.

**COMMUNICATION BETWEEN
LODGES**

Just a reminder to each Lodge Secretary, if you are communicating with another Lodge within the Grand Jurisdiction of Kentucky in an official capacity, you may correspond directly with the said Lodge. However, any correspondence to a Lodge - or Grand Lodge - other than the one within whose Jurisdiction your Lodge is located must be transmitted through the office of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky.

This procedure is intended to insure that a complete record of the particular transaction is fully noted at each level. Following this policy also saves time in as much as

Lodges, agreeable to Masonic Protocol, will not directly respond to correspondence from a Lodge outside their Jurisdiction - thus creating delays by stalling the correspondence.

Just remember, all out-of-state correspondence must be transmitted through the Grand Lodge Office.

THE MASONIC LIFE OF HENRY CLAY



In his political career Clay used his excellent negotiation skills to earn him the title "The Great Compromiser," and "The Great Pacifier." Clay is perhaps best known for "The Missouri Compromise." The agreement was to let Maine be admitted as a free state and Missouri enter as a slave state, thereby keeping the balance of both slave and free states even.

As for Clay's Masonic contributions; a fabulously written article in the Virginia Masonic-Herald Brother Christopher L. Murphy writes, that Clay received his three Masonic degrees in The Lexington Lodge #1 around 1801. He rose to become Master of the Lodge, the Grand Orator, and later rose to become, Grand Master of the Lodge of Kentucky.

Also, according to Murphy, Clay held Masonic conferences within the Senate chambers. In fact, records show this was the only Masonic conference on record to be held within the chamber. Although Clay loved and valued the Masonic teachings and principles, he became a supporter and Secretary of State under John Adams, a noted and outspoken anti-Mason, Clay never deviated from the teachings of the fraternity. Clay actually paid a compliment to Freemasonry, "I would not denounce and formally renounce it (Freemasonry) to be made President of the United States." Therefore according to Murphy, "knowing Henry Clay's passion, dedication, and complete personal commitment to that goal, what he said is probably one of the greatest compliments ever paid to the Masonic Order." Unfortunately, the records of Lexington Lodge #1 were destroyed during the Civil War thus making any solid research on Clay virtually impossible.

Henry Clay passed away June 29, 1852 at the National Hotel in Washington D.C. due to complications with tuberculosis. According to the Henry Clay Estate website, "Just before the hour of noon, "The Great Compromiser" drew his last breath. At that point his life became a completed major chapter in the political history of the United States. Henry Clay had lived through and served in some political position for a half a century. No single statement would adequately cover his active public life."

There is much mystery surrounding the life of Henry Clay (1777-1852). This influential figure of both Kentucky and American history is known for many accomplishments. Born in Virginia, Clay served as a member of the Kentucky Legislature, its speaker; was Counsel for the Bank of the United States, member of the U.S. Senate, Speaker of the House of the U. S Representatives, founder and leader of the Whig party, and was Secretary of State. However, people don't know about his impact on Freemasonry, or its impact on Clay himself.

Clay was born in Hanover County, April 12, 1777, in a district known as "The Slashes." His only formal education was three years of public school. It was his step-father, Captain Henry Watkins, who secured a clerk position in the Virginia Court of Chancery. Through his diligence and hard work ethics Clay gained the attention of George Wythe, signer of the Declaration of Independence, first law professor in the U.S and father of Jurisprudence. Wythe served as mentor to the young Clay guiding his reading and education in law. He later practiced law under Robert Brooke, and was licensed to practice himself.

Clay moved to Lexington, Kentucky and quickly gained widespread recognition due to his success as a lawyer and excellent public speaking skills. From 1803-1807 Clay served on the Kentucky State Legislature and taught law at Transylvania University at Lexington. In 1808, Clay became Speaker of the House, and in 1810 Clay was called to fill an unexpired term for John Adair in the U.S. Senate.

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


