

JIM GOBLE, ZEBULON LODGE NO. 273 HONORED



James E. Goble, of Prestonsburg, a 61-year-plus member of Zebulon Lodge No. 273, is the Junior Past Master of the Lodge — and also the Senior Past Master.

Goble was first elected Master of the Zebulon Lodge in December 1951, and served the lodge as Master in 1952. Curtis Clark, of Harold, was elected Master of Zebulon Lodge and was installed on January 6th, 2007. He died on May 7th, and Goble was elected to serve the remainder of his term, which ended January 5th, making him the Junior Past Master. Jason Bentley, of Prestonsburg, has been elected and installed to serve as Master for 2008.

Herman C. Porter, of Allen, a 68-year member and the Senior Past Master of

Zebulon Lodge, died on Jan. 2nd, at the age of 102, at which time Goble became the Senior Past Master of the lodge.

During the 55 years between his service in 1952 and his election in 2007, Goble served the Grand Lodge as District Deputy Grand Master, served Zebulon Lodge for 47 years as secretary, retiring in 2007 and also served under Past Grand Master Roger Barnett as Grand Pursuivant in 2001-2002. He currently holds the office of Tiler in Zebulon Lodge and is an active member in the York Rite Masonic Bodies.

Goble, 88, and his wife, Marie, who turned 88 on Jan. 8, have one son, three daughters and three grandsons.

FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

At this writing (early January, another Holiday Season has passed and left us with its "down side" - credit card payments, returning of undersized/oversized gifts, bathroom scales indicating an overindulgence of holiday repasts and, probably, some already broken New Years Resolutions. But, after that emotion begins to ebb, we start to relish all the pleasant memories that we shared with our families and friends during this annual Season of caring, sharing and giving. Also, this would be an appropriate time to pause and give thanks to our Creator for all his goodness and loving kindness toward us.

At this time of the year it's all too easy to feel gloomy because of the short days, sparse sunshine, bone-chilling weather, bare trees, the lack of green grass and lovely flowers. And the prospect of another month or so ahead before we begin to see the situation improve. But improve it will, and Spring will come with all its freshness, and promise of beauty. As we enjoy the beauties of Spring, when it does arrive, it would be thoughtful to give a measure of "thanks" to the gloomy Season just past for giving us thankful hearts and a stronger appreciation for the welcome change of the Season.

LODGE OFFICERS REPORTING FORM

The Book of Constitutions requires each subordinate lodge Secretary (Section 92 (7)) to report to the office of the Grand Secretary the names of the officers selected and/or appointed, along with the other information requested, prior to January 10th. The other information requested is the addresses and phone numbers of the principal officers of the lodge, location and directions to the

lodge hall, and the financial information required by the IRS.

This report must be received timely in order for the office staff to prepare the report which must be submitted to the IRS in March of each year. If your lodge is not included in the report submitted from the Grand Lodge Office, you may be contacted by the IRS to submit an individual report for the Lodge.

Another reason to submit the information timely is to allow sufficient time to prepare the Masonic Directory as early as possible in the new year, in order to make it as useful as possible. If, for some reason, your lodge does not have all the stations filled, don't hold up reporting what officers you do have by January 10th; you may report any lodge officers, not filled at the time, at a later date.

Just remember, a Directory that does not have every lodge listed, with all the information requested, renders the publication less efficient than it would be otherwise, and denies information to those who use the Directory to plan visits, and who wish to correspond with other lodges.

GRAND LODGE BLANKET INSURANCE

By this time, each lodge Secretary should have received a Memorandum of Insurance statement from the Grand Lodge Office, showing the type, amount and a general description of the coverage each of the items in the agreement provides. You should file the same and use it as proof of coverage if, as you are most probably aware, insurance is a complicated business to most of us; consequently, it is well nigh impossible to prepare a general statement that would answer all the

questions that may come to mind. However, if you find that you have specific questions concerning what is included in the coverage, and to what extent, you may call, either, this office, or contact;

The one insurance question we get most often in the Grand lodge Office concerns insurance on the lodge building. The blanket insurance carried by the Grand Lodge does not in any way include coverage on a lodge building, either liability or property. If your lodge owns a building, you must carry additional insurance to protect your membership.

Should that be the case, you should contact a local insurance agency to determine the plan to suit the needs of your lodge.

As the New Year dawned, the Masonic Homes' presence across Kentucky increased 30 fold with the addition of our new District Ambassadors. These volunteer Ambassadors will serve as Masonic Homes' representatives, giving Masons across Kentucky a District contact for information about the Homes.

"Kentucky Masons want to stay connected with the Homes, and we needed help providing that connection," said Masonic Homes' VP of Fraternal Relations Bruce Lott. In mid-2007, the search began for 30 volunteers to serve a two-year term visiting lodges in their districts. By autumn, Lott had recommendations and nominations for potential ambassadors. By December, ambassadors had been named for every district except 6 and 14, and a pair of real-life fraternal brothers had signed on to serve district 11.

Ambassadors will bring a Masonic Homes presence to each district, providing information about program initiatives and future plans, as well as information about residents who are affiliated with local lodges. Ambassador orientation provided an inside view of how the Masonic Homes lives its mission from the business and caring perspectives. Ambassadors toured the Louisville and Shelbyville campuses, meeting management staff and seeing programs first-hand. "We wanted them to have the inside track to information about the Homes," according to Lott. "When the Ambassadors can't answer a question or concern about the Homes, they now know who can."

While the Ambassador Program's main goal is connecting the Homes and Masonic lodges, Lott hopes it generates greater interest in the Homes among Masons. "The more brothers across Kentucky know about their Homes, it is more likely they will want to take a more active role," he said. Ambassadors will be encouraging lodges to adopt a resident and visit a Masonic Home property annually.

Ambassadors also will be listening to learn about concerns brothers may have about the Homes and specific ways they want to help. "Our Ambassadors are the eyes and ears of the Masonic Homes in lodges across Kentucky," Lott said. "Their commitment will strengthen the special bond the Masonic Homes shares with every Kentucky Mason."


