

What you will receive from us: When your information, user name and password are received and entered into the system you will receive a return e-mail from us confirming that your account has been created. If you do not receive our confirmation e-mail within 7 days please contact us. Later next year we will be offering

## GRAND LODGE OFFICE CLOSED

The Grand Lodge Office will be closed, Thursday & Friday, December 25 & 26, 2008, for the Christmas Holiday and Thursday & Friday, January 1 & 2, 2008 for New Years.

## LODGE SECRETARIES

Soon it will be time to elect and install the officers who will lead your lodge for the ensuing year. I realize, with all the activity, plus the holidays, which are so plentiful during this time of year, how easy it is to overlook some of the routine functions the lodge

Secretaries must perform to keep our records current.

Listed below are several items that should be taken care of as soon as the information is available.

## LIST OF LODGE OFFICERS AND MASONIC DIRECTORY FOR 2009

The next task facing the Grand Secretary's Office is compiling the Masonic Directory. At the end of November each lodge should have received a form on which to list the officers elected for the year, the address and telephone number[s] of the three principal officers and the Secretary. As soon as the officers are elected, please complete this form and send it to the Grand Secretary's Office as quickly as possible in order that we may process the information for the Directory. **DO NOT hold up the notice if a Junior Officer has not been elected or appointed at that time.** It is important that the Master and Secretary be listed in the Directory- any of the other officers may be reported at a later date as they are elected or appointed. Please note that you are to identify each officer by name and Lodge membership number. This procedure will reduce the opportunity for error in the Lodge Officer listing.

For the Directory to be meaningful, we must have it available as early as possible after the beginning of the new year. If the completed form from your lodge has not been received in the Grand Secretary's Office before **January 10, 2009**, there is a good chance the officers of your lodge will not be listed in the Directory. Please do not let this happen.

Also, on the same form, we ask that you furnish the exact address, or location, of your lodge so that it can be easily found from the information provided in the Directory. It has come to our attention a number of lodges have relocated -- or their address has been changed -- with the old address still listed in the Directory. Hopefully, with the information you provide, the new Directory can be brought up to date.

**You should have been sent, with your officers sheet a PRE-ORDER form for ordering the Directory. We have made arrangements for 1 (one) directory to be furnished to each Lodge, however, any additional Directories will have to be pre-**

**ordered from this office at cost. We have a quote from a printing company for the cost of printing, with the price being determined by the number ordered. The price caps at 500, 750 and 1000 printed. The cost to you will be determined at each of these caps. We will order only the number we receive pre-orders for. It is our advisement that if you want/need a Directory that you send your pre-order form in to the Grand Lodge Office in a timely manner.**

## IRS REPORTING FORM

Also, on the bottom of the Lodge Officers form mentioned above is a space to list the information required by the Internal Revenue Service from each Subordinate Lodge. The information received from the Subordinate Lodges is compiled in this office and a summary transmitted to the IRS. Failure on the part of a Lodge Secretary to respond may result in a visit from an IRS Representative -- and there are penalties involved that could be imposed for failure to report.

Be sure the form is signed by the Lodge Secretary and the seal of the Lodge is placed thereon.

the East in a very impressive manner.


After the conferring of the Alabama Degree, lunch was served and prepared by the ladies of Sunset Lodge members.



In late 2007, Mrs. Jordan injured her back and entered the Louisville Health Care Center for rehabilitation therapies to complete her recovery. She soon realized she would not be able to continue living independently. Mrs. Jordan was approved for Masonicare and moved to the Louisville Personal Care Center.

"I loved my apartment and did not think I would enjoy living anywhere else," Mrs. Jordan said. "When I got settled into my new home in the Personal Care Center, I was proved wrong."

Mrs. Jordan told the Communication how much she enjoys the Masonic Home lifestyle. "I love meals in the dining room," she said. "The food is fabulous, and I don't have to cook or clean up." An array of activities keeps residents engaged. "You Masons are not cheap," she reported. "You throw great parties with plenty of entertainment and gifts."

Mrs. Jordan said she was especially pleased with the staff. "The staff does not hover around, but they are always there when I need them."

"If you have not been to the Masonic Homes, you will be pleasantly surprised at the wonderful home you have given us," Mrs. Jordan said. "Thank you!"

## Congress renews IRA gift opportunity

If you will reach the age of 70½ by December 31, 2009, and have a traditional or Roth IRA, the federal government has re-opened a window of opportunity for 2008 and 2009 that allows you to do more for the Masonic Homes of Kentucky and other causes you love.

Similar to the 2007 IRA charitable rollover legislation, the 2008 law allows citizens who are at least 70½ on the day the distribution is made to request their IRA administrators to make distributions directly to charities, including the Masonic Homes.

This transfer can be counted toward your required minimum distribution if you choose. If the gift is from a traditional IRA, it will not be counted as a taxable distribution to you. An individual is allowed to make distributions of up to \$100,000 to charities in any given year.

If you are over 70½, or will be by December 31, 2009, we encourage you to consider this renewed opportunity to make a significant difference in those cared for by your Masonic Homes.

The economic chaos in our country has inspired me to write this letter.

Looking at the failure of our representatives to do what the constitution says is their responsibilities, has caused me to reflect on how many Brethren in our Masonic Fraternity are also not fulfilling the duties which by tradition they have accepted responsibility.

It has been a blessing and a curse, that during my entire Masonic journey, I have had to travel away from my home and lodge. The blessing is that during my journey, I have had the opportunity to visit lodges in twenty-one states across the country and a lodge in Windsor, Ontario, Canada. I have served pro-tem in many of the lodge chairs during my visits.

The curse is the only office I ever held at Apperson is Junior Deacon. It is my ambition to serve as a memorable Worshipful Master.

Over several years, I have had the misfortune to see many lodges falling into apathy. The cry of our leaders that our membership is going down has led many lodges to make changes that over time are going to prove dire for our fraternity. Oh yeah, I can see you now- shaking you heads, not us! Brethren, you are right. Apperson Lodge has for many years, had a wonderful tradition as a traveling lodge. For many years, I looked at the flags and memorabilia on the walls at the top of the stairs, and have always been proud of our tradition. I continue to be proud of that tradition today and having been a part of that same tradition and to carry it further down the years.

When I look at the success of our Lodge, I reflect on why we have been so successful. The answer I always come back to is two-fold. First, we have always guarded our door well. Secondly, the men we have traditionally allowed to come in our doors have already looked into their hearts and knew themselves to be Masons!

***This is the true key to our success!***

Our tradition has always come down to these two questions: "What

does it mean to be a Mason?" and "Does membership in a Masonic lodge make you a Mason?" The answer to these questions is as different as the number of men reflecting on them. To the men who are not reflecting on them, I ask, "Why are you here." The fraternity came to me from other men who added to our shared experience, and I hope by the time I see the great celestial lodge, I will have added to this experience as well. You may ask yourself how I am able to do this since I rarely attend lodge. The answer is; it is unusual that I do not attend a lodge somewhere on my trips. Often serving as an officer or taking part in our Masonic ritual work.

When I began to learn my memory work, my Mentor Brother Kenny, worked in mine reclamation and I worked as over the road truck driver. When Brother Kenny was home and I was home, he gave me all the learning and encouragement I could hold. Because of our difficult work schedules, it took me longer than some to complete the three degrees. The friendship we forged during this time is still strong today- fifteen years later.

When Brother Mark Tucker was serving as Worshipful Master, the Grand Senior Warden came on an official visit. During that visit, he gave the G lecture. Now it is true the reason he did this, is we did not have anyone in lodge prepared to do it. The Grand Senior Warden stepped up without any preparation whatever, and gave the lecture cold. To be sure, when I arrived that day, if asked, I would have said I was already doing my part. Seeing and hearing that brother do more, inspired me more than anything else ever had before. I sat there and knew in my heart, I wanted to be a ritualist like him. On that day, I began to learn the Master Masons Lecture.

Craftsmen, I will not say it was easy, because it was not. What I will say is that over the six months I spent learning it, I met many wonderful Masons who not only encouraged me, but gave me the most special gift of all-their TIME. I want to add to this, that the many ovations I have received and the rewards some Brethren have presented me for my ritual work, these are treasured memories that I keep close to my heart. However, my true goal, to inspire other men of the Craft, to find the beautiful wonders of Masonic ritual work, seems to be less successful. I had hoped that another Craftsman would find inspiration and follow my example. I know Brother
