Recently Thomas DeVenny Lodge No. 928 at Freeburn, Kentucky was faced with a dilemma that eventually proved what *True Masonry* was all about. The Lodge Hall itself is on the second level of the building with no handicap ramp, although it does have a staircase lift, but this was not suitable or accessible for one of their newest members, Brother J.D. Daughtery.

As most Lodges within the Commonwealth, the finances for construction of such a ramp were almost out of reach as well. But, through the joint efforts of the members of Thomas DeVenny Lodge No. 928 and Stone Lodge No. 890 of Belfry, Kentucky, sev-



eral donations were made relieving the Lodge of those expenses and all the construction work was performed by members of the two Lodges, working together. Brother J.D. Daughtery, although confined to his wheelchair, helped as he could. This was a remarkable yet pleasing experience for the members of both Lodges, exemplifying what *True Masonry* is all about, sharing and caring for one another.

We want to thank all that participated in any way for this accomplishment and encourage other Masonic Lodges to work and contribute to each other as well.



Notes FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

As we move into the “lazy hazy days of summer”—and school is out for the duration—many families are taking advantage of the opportunity to plan a vacation, or to plan various trips and numerous activities during the pleasant days of summer. However, in the Grand Lodge Office, at this time of the year, our activity picks up considerably as we close our year, prepare for the annual audit, and begin to assemble the Annual Report for the Annual Communication in October. This year we will be using an entirely new computer system to assemble the data and generate the Annual Return for each lodge, and we are hopeful that all goes well—but the reality is we expect a few glitches to surface, even though we have tried to anticipate any potential problems that may emerge. For that reason, we strongly urge each lodge Secretary to review their Annual Return closely for any errors, more especially in cases where the same member may be reported twice (under two different names i.e. initials and last name, and first name and last name, etc): The new system will prevent this type error from occurring in the future, even if, in the case of plural membership, he is reported to the Grand Lodge Office from multiple lodges.

Once all the “bugs” in the system are dealt with, and more and more lodge Secretaries access the online program, I am confident all of us will find the new system much more efficient than the old one, much easier to submit your monthly reports, easier to retrieve information and make corrections, and to communicate with the Grand Lodge Office. The added beauty of the new system is that all the current information we have for your lodge on file in the Grand Lodge Office is instantly available to you on your computer screen at home.

GRAND LODGE OFFICE CLOSED

The Grand Lodge Office will be closed Friday, July 3, 2009 in observance of Independence Day.

Section 217 of the Book of Constitutions requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky shall be submitted in writing and must be received in the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communication.

SERVICE AWARDS

By now you should have received, or will

soon be receiving, your 50 & 60 year service award pins and 50 year service award cards. If you do not receive them by the 2nd week in July please contact one of the office staff at the Grand Lodge Office (502-893-0192). As soon as you receive the Service Awards from the Grand Lodge Office, they may be presented to the recipients immediately. **The eligibility of each recipient has already been certified and the awards should be presented as soon as possible after they are received.**

YEAR-END ACTIVITY REPORTS

The office staff is gearing up at this time to verify the various lodge activities for the past year and to prepare the Annual Return information for each subordinate Lodge. With the exception of only a few Lodges, the Monthly Activity Reports have been received promptly in the Grand Lodge Office insuring an accurate up-to-date account of each Lodge activity. I urge each Lodge Secretary to take care of this important duty as quickly as possible in order for the Grand Lodge Office to assemble the information for inclusion in the Annual Report and presentation at the Annual Communication in October. The sooner we have the information the quicker we can prepare the Annual Return of your Lodge for verification.

The Annual Returns should be ready to mail from the Grand Secretary's office the last week in July and, as Secretary, you should receive them around August 1, 2009. **IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THE ANNUAL RETURN FOR YOUR LODGE BY AUGUST 10TH, YOU ARE INSTRUCTED TO NOTIFY THE GRAND LODGE OFFICE!** Remember the deadline to return the verified Annual Returns to the Grand Secretary's Office is September 1, 2009. Payment of Lodge Assessments are also due at the same time. Late payment of Assessments and receipt of Annual Returns will cause a \$1.00 per day penalty for each discrepancy to be levied until each are received in the Grand Lodge office.

The office staff and I express to each Lodge Secretary our appreciation for your dedication and efforts in keeping our records accurate and up-to-date.
