

JUST ONE CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE!

One particular day, I had the honor of visiting a Brother lying in a hospital bed in Lexington after we finished one of the Masonic Light Seminars. Several of us were in attendance and all who visited were profoundly impacted that day by the truth before our eyes, but none more than I. As I drove up the road toward another meeting I attempted to reconcile in my mind one simple question. Why was he not being taken care of or visited as he should have been, given the fact that he had been lying there for over two weeks? I plainly remember him weeping in sadness at the fact that his own Lodge had done little for him, and most of the Masons in that District had left him

there, alone. Some may have known of his circumstances, and some not, but in our age of Facebook, email, text messaging and the like I would think that the news should have spread rapidly. In darkness however there was light, as one cannot exist without the other. In a corner sat one lone Mason, tears in his eyes, who was ready to help, protect, and defend his Brother in any way needed. He had been by his side the entire ordeal. He was there for moral, physical, and emotional support. This lone Brother had shown his Masonic Light to all of us by being a man and honoring his word given at our Sacred Altar. He had mowed the sick Brother's lawn, prepared his ground for a garden, taken care of mundane errand running and anything else he or his wife had needed. That is "Masonry in Action" and this singular Mason proved to me that as long as one candle burns, darkness will never overtake the light.

I was told by a Past Grand Master that I cannot change the hearts and minds of over 45,000 Masons, and he is probably correct, although I disagree. What *I can* do is concentrate on those who are Masons in name and nature, not the so called "ring wearers". *I can* give esteem and thanks for the faithful few who stand up to the line and act like Masons should. *I can* learn from and stand in awe of just one Mason who makes a difference. I am still saddened by the entire incident, but also happy that a Brother was being looked after by someone who cared enough to do whatever, whenever, and wherever. I have heard that creed somewhere else and have seen it in action; it is

the same one that most firefighters follow. They don't leave a man behind, even if it means their own lives. We must ask ourselves if we are ready to do the same, and step out of the shadows into the brilliance of the true Light of Masonry. We must decide what we must do, take action on the idea, and follow through because failure to act is not acceptable any longer. Follow the example of this Good Brother for as I have been humbled, so should we all stand in amazement of the love shown that day. There has been enough talk and enough rhetoric regarding what it means to be a Mason when everyone already knows in their heart what it takes. I challenge every Mason in the Commonwealth of Kentucky to act like Masons or come once again to the Altar and be re-obligated. The Brotherhood needs each and every one of you, for it is the Fraternity we all revere and cherish. We have let the outside world creep into our Lodges but we have a chance to curtail it through our investigating committees and the ballot box. Help me get on with the business of assisting those who cannot do for themselves and those who are in need of what we can offer. Stand beside me now my Brothers, and together we can change the very fabric of history and strengthen the bonds of unity. If I did not believe that true Masons could take back our heritage, I would not be Grand Master, nor would I be a Mason.

Again Brothers, take care of each other and your widows, love one another, and take a stand with me for what is just, what is right, and what is true.

A couple of months ago I wrote an article for publication in the Masonic Home Journal (March 2010) about the multitude of anti-Masonic books that are available from book stores and the internet, and which attempt to defame the Fraternity with outright distortions—and, in many cases—outright lies. A few days after the publication containing the article was mailed to the membership, I received a phone call from a member who wondered why I hadn't followed up with some suggestions of books that portrayed Freemasonry in its true light. While realizing that each individual reader will determine for himself the ultimate worth of a book he chooses to read, and not claiming to be a qualified critic of Masonic literature or authors, there are several Masonic books I have found to be interesting and informative, and recommend for worthwhile reading.

Certainly, the two books by Brother John J. Robinson, *Born in Blood: The Lost Secrets of Freemasonry*, and *The Pilgrim's Path* are high on the list. The new novel by Dan Brown, *The Lost Symbol*, though a work of fiction, certainly displays Freemasonry in a favorable light, and debunks many of the myths used by anti-Masons in their attempt to smear the Fraternity and is highly recommended. Another interesting and informative book is *The Freemasons* by British historian Jasper Ridley, which is a comprehensive history of the Fraternity worldwide, and well worth reading. Another is *The Genesis of Freemasonry* by David Harrison, another British author, dealing with the origin of Freemasonry and its development in England.

The above listing is just a few of the many books about Freemasonry available for Masonic study, and, since Freemasonry is a progressive science, they are there to assist you in extending your Masonic knowledge. You are therefore encouraged, on an evening when you have the time, to pick up one and go with the author on an interesting and informative Masonic journey.

AWARDS ELIGIBILITY LIST

Each Lodge Secretary should have received the "Award Eligibility List" from the Grand Lodge Office in early April for those eligible for the 50, 60, and 75 year Grand Lodge Veteran's Awards. You will be sent instructions with your list that will explain specifically how to fill it out. Please follow these instructions precisely.

The plateaus in time that a Brother must reach to qualify for these awards are significant, and the Grand Lodge Office wants to insure that those Brothers due the award receive it timely. So, we encourage you to give this review your close attention.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN LODGES

Just a reminder to each Lodge Secretary, if you are communicating with another Lodge within the Grand Jurisdiction of Kentucky in an official capacity, you may correspond directly with the said Lodge. However, any correspondence with a Lodge - or **Grand Lodge - other than the one within whose Jurisdiction your Lodge is located must be transmitted through both Grand Lodge Offices.**

This procedure is intended to insure that a complete record of the particular transaction is fully noted at each level. Following this policy also saves time in as much as Lodges, agreeable to Masonic Protocol, will not directly respond to correspondence from a Lodge outside their Jurisdiction - thus creating delays by stalling the correspondence.

Just remember, all out-of-state correspondence must be transmitted through the Grand Lodge Office.

You should file the same and use it as proof of coverage if, as you are most probably aware, insurance is a complicated business to most of us; consequently, it is well nigh impossible to prepare a general statement that would answer all the questions that may come to mind. However, if you find that you have specific questions concerning what is included in the coverage, and to what extent, you may call, either, this office, or contact;

The one insurance question we get most often in the Grand Lodge Office concerns insurance on the lodge building. The blanket insurance carried by the Grand Lodge does **not** in any way include coverage on a lodge building, either liability or property. If your lodge owns a building, you must carry additional insurance to protect your membership.

Should that be the case, you should contact a local insurance agency to determine the plan to suit the needs of your lodge.


