

Grand Master's Message

We have worked long and hard together over this past year and I wish to pass on some words of wisdom that were passed to me. As my time as Grand Master shortens, it becomes even more important that I leave the Craft better than I found it. I am excited about passing the torch to Right Worshipful Brother Don Yankey who will do greater things for the Craft, and a Grand Line who live by the tenets of our Fraternity. Next month I will publish my Grand Master's address and recommendations so that all may have due notice before Grand Lodge. I am in hopes that by doing this; it will save time and resources that will be needed for important issues we will be discussing this year at our Grand Communication.

I have given much thought to the articles I have written this year and would like to recap some of them with a list of what I feel will help your Lodge grow and prosper.

1. Study the mystical meanings and working tools of our Ancient Craft and apply them in your own life on a daily basis and in your Lodge at all times.
2. Confer the 1st degree in full form, meaning all three sections, with exemplary dress attire, and in an impressive manner always remembering that this degree constitutes the cornerstone on which the initiate's future Masonic life will be guided.
3. Ensure that the Lodge has an adequate dues structure to support day to day operations and fulfill all Masonic obligations to our distressed Brothers, their Widows, and Orphans. Nothing is so discouraging than to see a Lodge doing fundraisers to pay routine bills, so raise dues if needed.
4. Keep petty quarrels and squabbles

out of the Lodge. It should be a safe haven of refuge for higher thoughts and nobler deeds. It is best put that we should attempt to "out humble" one another, then we cannot materially err.

5. When electing a Master, make sure that he is one who can lead the Lodge, and that the ones who elected him are ready to follow. The Master must superintend his Lodge at all times, for it is his duty to protect the heritage handed him. Nothing will derail a Lodge faster than one whom cannot give "good and wholesome" instruction and is sloppy, crude, or abrasive.

6. Attempt to hold each other accountable for actions taken in and out of the Lodge. Every deed, be it good or bad, is a reflection on our Lodges, and hence all Masons. Do not be afraid to confront someone in a Brotherly fashion while in the sanctity of our Lodges, and admonish each other to honor the obligations made at our sacred Altar.

7. Utilize the new background checks while investigating a potential candidate, and be careful not to grant admission until it is apparent they are worthy and well qualified before allowing admission. Again I will state, Masonry is not a right, only a privilege reserved for the worthy few.

8. We all need to stop being selfish, cheap, and worry about someone else for a change instead of ourselves. Our own worst enemy is in the mirror every morning but the sweetest sound to our ears usually is our own voice. Sometimes, a lot can be learned by listening rather than incoherent rambling or bragging about how long we have been in the Fraternity, what honors we have received, or what we think should or could be done to make it

the way our pet prejudices would have it be.

9. Take care of and love one another like they are your own family, especially our widows. They are the ones most vulnerable and helpless during the darkest hours of their lives. Masonic charity MUST start at home, and then spread outward from our Lodges. If a Brother is sick, prayers are needed, but a visit will warm his soul. We must all go the extra mile and put aside laziness or selfishness, otherwise we are no different from the profane.

10. Finally, attempt to replicate excellence, not mediocrity or deceit. Study the constitution, our ritual work, and learn that true knowledge and understanding is a lifetime pursuit. Don't settle for second best in our Lodges or in our own lives because Kentucky Masons have always given the highest and best they can offer when called on. Look well to the East my Brothers and always remember we are all on a laudable pursuit, which differs to each one of us as it is a personal journey of enlightenment.

Actions and not words are the only thing that will cement our future my Brothers. Heed well the words of the Ancients as they cry out to us. Let us all open our minds, hearts, and souls and they will guide us through a wonderful Masonic life.

As we move into the “lazy hazy days of summer”—and school is out for the duration—many families are taking the advantage of the opportunity to plan a vacation, or to plan various trips and numerous activities during the pleasant days of summer. However, in the Grand Lodge Office, at this time of the year, our activity picks up considerably as we close our reporting year, prepare for the annual audit, and begin to assemble the Annual Report for the Annual Communication in October. This year we will, for the second year, be using new computer system to assemble the data and generate the Annual Return for each lodge. Hopefully, we now have all the “bugs” out of the system—but the reality is we expect a few glitches to surface, even though we have tried to anticipate any remaining problems that may have been overlooked. For that reason, we strongly urge each lodge Secretary to review their Annual Return carefully for any errors that may still exist.

As more and more lodge Secretaries access the online program, I am confident they will find the new system much more efficient than the old one, much easier to submit your monthly reports, easier to retrieve information and make corrections, and to communicate

with the Grand Lodge Office. The added beauty of the new system is that all the current information we have for your lodge on file in the Grand Lodge Office is instantly available to you on your computer screen at home.

NOTICE

Section 217 of the *Book of Constitutions* requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky shall be submitted in writing and must be received in the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communication.

YEAR-END ACTIVITY REPORTS

The office staff is gearing up at this time to verify the various lodge activities for the past year and to prepare the Annual Return information for each subordinate lodge. With the exception of a few Lodges, the Monthly Activity Reports have been received promptly in the Grand Lodge Office insuring an accurate up-to-date account of each Lodge activity. I urge each Lodge Secretary to take care of this important duty as quickly as

possible in order for the Grand Lodge Office to assemble the information for inclusion in the Annual Report and presentation at the Annual Communication in October. The sooner we have the information the quicker we can prepare the Annual Return of your Lodge for verification.

The Annual Returns should be ready to mail from the Grand Secretary's office the last week in July and, as Secretary, you should receive them around August 1, 2010. IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THE ANNUAL RETURN FOR YOUR LODGE BY AUGUST 10TH, YOU ARE INSTRUCTED TO NOTIFY THE GRAND LODGE OFFICE! Remember the deadline to return the verified Annual Returns to the Grand Secretary's Office is September 1, 2010. Payment of Lodge Assessments are also due at the same time. Late payment of Assessments and receipt of Annual Returns will cause a \$1.00 per day penalty for each discrepancy to be levied until each are received in the Grand Lodge office.

The office staff and I express to each Lodge Secretary our appreciation for your dedication and efforts in keeping our records accurate and up-to-date.


Moyers Circle is home to Care Center
