Brother Effinger was a Past Grand Almoner of the Supreme Council, Emeritus member of the Masonic Homes of Kentucky, Past Treasurer of International DeMolay, a member of the Rizoph Shrine Temple, past Sovereign of St. Barnabas Conclave, member of St. Bernard Conclave, Madisonville, Kentucky. Past Substitute Grand Master of Royal Order of Scotland, and an active member of the York Rite bodies.







The Grand Lodge Office will be closed on Friday, December 24, and Monday, December 27, for the Christmas Holiday and Monday, January 3, 2011 for New Years.

Lodge Secretaries

Soon it will be time to elect and install the officers who will lead your lodge for the ensuing year. I realize, with all the activity, plus the holidays, which are so plentiful during this time of year, how easy it is to overlook some of the routine functions the lodge Secretaries must perform to keep our records current. Listed below are several items that should be taken care of as soon as the information is available.

List Of Lodge Officers and Masonic Directory for 2011

The next task facing the Grand Secretary's Office is compiling the Masonic Directory. At the end of November

each lodge should have received a form on which to list the officers elected for the year, the address and telephone number[s] of the three principal officers and the Secretary. As soon as the officers are elected, please complete this form and send it to the Grand Secretary's Office as quickly as possible in order that we may process the information for the Directory. Please note that you are to identify each officer by name and Lodge membership number. This procedure will reduce the opportunity for error in the Lodge Officer listing.

For the Directory to be meaningful, we must have it available as early as possible after the beginning of the New Year. If the completed form from your lodge has not been received in the Grand Secretary's Office before January 10, 2011, there is a good chance the officers of your lodge will not be listed in the Directory. Please do not let this happen.

Also, on the same form, we ask that you furnish the exact address, or location, of your lodge so that it can be easily found from the information provided in the Directory. It has come to our attention a number of lodges have relocated -- or their address has been changed -- with the old address still listed in the Directory. Hopefully, with the information you provide, the new Directory can be brought up to date.

IRS Reporting Form

Also, on the bottom of the Lodge Officers form mentioned above is a space to list the information required by the Internal Revenue Service from each Subordinate Lodge. The information received from the Subordinate Lodges is compiled in this office and a summary transmitted to the IRS. This information is required in order to keep your lodge under the blanket exemption IRS tax code for the Grand Lodge of Kentucky. Be sure the form is signed by the Lodge Secretary and the seal of the Lodge is placed thereon.

However, under a recent policy adopted by the IRS, and in addition to the above, it is my understanding that each lodge MUST file an electronic 900-N form to the IRS before the 15th day of the 5th month following the close of the fiscal year.

NOTICE OF POTENTIAL SCAMS

Several reports have been received in the Grand Lodge Office of solicitations for funds being made, mostly on the internet, by individuals claiming to be a Mason and in need of temporary assistance. Should you be contacted by someone claiming such a Masonic connection, be sure to verify his identity and Masonic membership before responding.


