Bill Cunningham – Supreme Court Justice Speaks at District Meeting





There are many things we are asked to do for our Lodges. You may be asked to serve as an appointed officer. You may be in charge of the grounds. You may be in charge of the meals. You could be the Degree Team Captain. There are so many things and I will not list them all, but I will list the most important responsibility you will ever be asked to do, and that is to serve on an **Investigating Committee**. I know you are thinking, I have heard this a million times. Over the last few months there have been newspaper clippings and anonymous letters received indicating we have Brothers who have been allowed to enter our Lodges who are not worthy to be there. The Grand Lodge Officers have been asked what we can do now to remove them. Some had convictions long before they applied for membership and some

since they have become members. I will ask the Masters what you have done to resolve the problems with your committee, have you spoke to them to see how this came to be. This will not only affect the Fraternity, but will destroy any respect you had with the community by allowing these men to enter your Lodge. Two years ago we gave you a great tool to use, **Info Check**, to assist in investigations. Some Lodges felt that it would cause us to loose candidates because of the \$25 cost. They also felt we were trying to interfere with the Lodges in the way they operate. I have said this before, we need to stop making members and get back to making Masons. It would be far better if we rejected a man for his criminal behavior than to not know it ever existed. The first function of a Lodge is to make good men good Masons. The good old boy investigating committee needs to come to a halt. I urge all Lodges to reinstate the **Info Check** investigation Report at this years Grand Lodge communication. And cease any and all good old boys investigating committee reports here forth. Your Lodge should have an investigation form to use as a guideline. If followed properly, this will stop some of those from entering our fraternity that are not entitled to become Masons.

Right Worshipful Rick Nation is working on the Masonic Unity Day at the Masonic Homes campus in Louisville on July 23. It will run from 10 am to 6 pm with food, entertainment, games for all. There will be tours of the Sam Swope Care Center. 


Masonic Education Schedule

WAIVER OF JURISDICTION-FEES RETURNED

Occasionally inquiries are made to the Grand Lodge Office concerning the return of fees when a waiver of jurisdiction is granted by a Lodge which has a higher initiation fee than the Lodge making the request for the waiver of jurisdiction.

Section 98(a) of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM deals specifically to this matter and states:

"In all cases where the fee of the Lodge granting the waiver of jurisdiction is greater than the fee of the Lodge requesting the waiver the candidate shall pay to the Lodge which asks the waiver a fee equivalent to the fee he would have been required to pay had he petitioned the Lodge which granted the waiver. Immediately after the candidate is elected and initiated, the Secretary of the Lodge receiving the waiver shall send the difference in fees to the Lodge granting the waiver."

Simply put, when a Lodge receives a waiver of jurisdiction in favor of a candidate from a Lodge having jurisdiction, where the initiation fee of the Lodge granting jurisdiction is higher than the initiation fee of the Lodge that is requesting the waiver, the candidate pays the higher fee and the difference in the fees must be paid to the Lodge granting the waiver.

Another misconception concerning waivers of jurisdiction, held by some, is a waiver is not necessary in cases where a Mason petitions for Dual or Plural membership to a lodge within a jurisdiction in which he does not reside. The thinking seems to be, since the petitioner is already a Freemason, he is free to join a lodge in any other jurisdiction without a waiver of jurisdiction being granted by the lodge holding jurisdiction by way of his residence. Not so! Section 99 of the *Book of Constitutions of the Grand*

Lodge of Kentucky very plainly states "A lodge that receives the petition and initiates a candidate, **or admits to membership a brother from a jurisdiction not its own** (my emphasis), in violation of the provision of sections 95-98, shall forfeit and pay the fees to the lodge which lawfully held jurisdiction, and be subject to having its Charter arrested, or such other penalty as the Grand Lodge may impose."

ANNUAL RETURNS

Before the end of May you should have received a packet from the Grand Lodge Office containing:

1. A form asking for information on members you may have in the Masonic Homes of Kentucky.
2. A form certifying the representative of your lodge at our Grand Communication in October (in case the Master or one of the line Officers can not attend).
3. A representative post card for you to complete and return to this office. Please fill this out and return with the person who will be representing your Lodge—even if he is an elected representative.
4. Instruction sheet for checking Annual Returns.

I urge you to take care of this quickly, to assure adequate time to review and record the results before Grand Lodge.

Also, sometime in the latter part of July, you will receive a computer printout of your membership and the lodge's Annual Return. Please check this information very carefully for accuracy and return the Annual Return to the Grand Lodge as quickly as possible. It is not necessary to send the Annual Return and payment for the assessments to Grand Lodge at the same time. As soon as the Annual Return is received (after you have checked and corrected it, if necessary) we

can then assemble the information in ample time to have it available to the membership at Grand Lodge. You may forward your check for assessments prior to September 1, deadline. **It is very important the June Monthly Activity Report be received in the Grand Lodge Office as soon as practical after the end of the month-before the tenth of July deadline, if possible.**

The Office Staff hopes to have the yearly statistical information of each lodge entered into the computer and the Annual Returns completed by the last week in July. I know I can depend on the continued cooperation of the dedicated lodge secretaries of this Grand Jurisdiction to do their best to preserve and maintain a complete and accurate record of their lodge activities.

NOTICE OF REJECTION

Just a reminder to each lodge secretary to report to the Grand Lodge Office, **on the proper form**, any petitioner for the degrees who has been rejected by your lodge. I am not sure all lodge secretaries are aware they should report this activity. However, this information could be valuable to another lodge, should the one rejected attempt to petition another lodge at a later date.

In case you do not have any of the Notice of Rejection Forms, you may order them from the Office of the Grand Secretary.

Official Out-Of-State Correspondence

Just a reminder, all official correspondence between Grand Jurisdictions must be transmitted through the Grand Lodge Office. This includes all request for demits, reinstatements, transfers, affiliation, waivers etc. Consequently, if you correspond directly with a Lodge in another jurisdiction on any of the above mentioned transactions, they will be delayed until such time as the

proper Masonic protocol is established.

However, a member of a Lodge of a sister jurisdiction, even though he may now reside within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, is at liberty to correspond directly with his Lodge.

So, please remember to observe proper Masonic protocol in dealing with all official out-of-state transactions and/or correspondence.

The Grand Lodge office will be closed Monday, July 4, 2011 to observe Independence Day.

AN ENCOURAGING WORD: THE EFFECT OF KIND WORDS

Usually, there are few surprises when I open my e-mail each morning. Most of the time, the messages I receive in abundance are considered worthless trash, and I delete them without wasting valuable time to read them. Yet, one morning recently, there was a very pleasant, noteworthy, and unexpected exception. When I opened my e-mail, I found a vastly different message. It was short and to the point. Words were not wasted, but for me, the message was significant. An individual whom I have seen only one time in a rather unusual encounter sent me a special message consisting of a very few well-chosen words to express genuine appreciation for a simple thing about which I thought little. When I read that message, the extremely kind words of appreciation from a person I hardly know touched my heart deeply. Although they were few in number, those kind words had a profound effect. They lifted my spirit and made my day much brighter and a lot more pleasant.

All of my life I have heard persons quote the old adage: "Words are cheap." They are cheap, and words are easily spoken. But they are powerful, and kind words are even more powerful. Blaise Pascal, French philosopher of the seventeenth century, said, "Kind words do not last much. Yet they accomplish much." They can radically alter the mood of an individual, and they can radically change the direction of a human life.

As far back as twenty-five hundred years ago, the power of kind words had become proverbial. Their power is expressed in two well-known proverbs. One of them says, "A gentle tongue," that is, kind words, "can break a bone," and the other one says, "A gentle answer," that is, kind words, "turns away wrath."

Words are cheap and easily expressed. But kind words are powerful, and they can accomplish much that is good. So, speak kind words often. Spirits will be lifted, and life will be made better.


