FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

JOSEPH R. CONWAY, P.G.M. Grand Secretary

As we were taught by our Instructors in the lectures of three Degrees of Freemasonry, we became acquainted with many “blanket” or “buzz” words that covers a broad area of a philosophy or description of a lifestyle and personal traits that define us as Masons. For instance, the three great Masonic Tenets of a Mason, Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. They are short words – but mean so much when applied to the fullness of the life of a Freemason. The same can be said for the Four Cardinal Virtues, which are Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, and Justice. Other such words freely used in our lectures which immediately come to mind are Honor, Rectitude, Morality, Propriety, Integrity, etc.

Though the words noted above refer to the positive side of Freemasonry, there are other words that suggest a negative connotation, words like Ignorance, Envy, and Superstition; words that describe the unholy conduct of the three misfits who brought shame to the Operative Masons at the building of the Temple. There are many other “blanket” or “buzz” words which can quickly paint a mental image in our minds—both positive and negative—and remind us of our duties and obligations as a Mason, the same way the symbols of our Order do, and serve to guide our conduct as a Freemason.

However, I think there is another such word not usually mentioned and is often overlooked in the lectures of Freemasonry--though maybe

not always ignored--which describes a protocol that is most important to Freemasons, and, also, necessary to make all those words noted above meaningful. The word is Discipline! For all Freemasonry is, it most certainly sets guidelines for its members to follow, and prescribes a discipline to practice self-control. We are admonished to exemplify orderly conduct; a discipline which should be the ultimate goal of every Freemason.

So, let's make Discipline as much a part of the vocabulary of Freemasonry as all the other “blanket words” with which we are familiar; and let's remember it's our personal discipline in striving to live by the Tenets of our Fraternity which keeps us the “point within a circle”.

YEAR-END ACTIVITY REPORTS

The office staff is gearing up at this time to verify the various lodge activities for the past year and to prepare the Annual Return information for each subordinate Lodge. With the exception of a few Lodges, the Monthly Activ-

ity Reports have been received promptly in the Grand Lodge Office insuring an accurate up-to-date account of each Lodge activity. I urge each Lodge Secretary to take care of this important duty as quickly as possible in order for the Grand Lodge Office to assemble the information for inclusion in the Annual Report and presentation at the Annual Communication in October. The sooner we have the information the quicker we can prepare the Annual Return of your Lodge for verification.

PLEASE NOTE: BECAUSE OF THE NEW SYSTEM CHANGE YOU NEED TO CLOSELY CHECK YOUR RECORDS WITH OURS TO BE SURE WE HAVE AN ACCURATE RECORD OF YOUR MEMBERSHIP. OTHERWISE, YOU MAY BE CHARGED FOR MEMBERS THAT ARE NOT YOURS. This check is critical since some members may have been pulled over twice, not pulled at all, or is not a member of your lodge as a consequence of being a plural member with a lodge out of state with the same lodge number as his Kentucky lodge. You must, also, make sure the membership count for your lodge is correct, (that is the totaled queried and present membership match). Please refer any questions you may have to the Grand Lodge Office.

The Annual Returns should be ready to mail

from the Grand Secretary's office the last week in July and, as Secretary, you should receive them around August 1, 2011. **IF YOU DO NOT RECEIVE THE ANNUAL RETURN FOR YOUR LODGE BY AUGUST 10TH, YOU ARE INSTRUCTED TO NOTIFY THE GRAND LODGE OFFICE!** Remember the deadline to return the verified Annual Returns to the Grand Secretary's Office is September 1, 2010. Payment of Lodge Assessments are also due at the same time. Late payment of Assessments and receipt of Annual Returns will cause a \$1.00 per day penalty for each discrepancy to be levied until each are received in the Grand Lodge office.

The office staff and I express to each Lodge Secretary our appreciation for your dedication and efforts in keeping our records accurate and up-to-date.

A Masonic Cornerstone Laying service was held in Camp-ton, Kentucky on Sunday, June 5th, 2011. The building being dedicated was the new Wolfe County Judicial Center. The service was presided over by our Most Worshipful Grand Master Donald Yankey. The Significance of Freemasonry *by Howard Coop*

As Independence Day is observed, as it always is, on July 4, nine men – John Hancock, Benjamin Franklin, Joseph Hewes, William Ellery, William Hooper, Robert Treat Paine Jr., Richard Stockton, George Walton, and William Whipple – should be remembered.

Those nine men were part of the group of founding fathers who prepared and signed the Declaration of Independence. That document, sometimes called "*the finest expression of the American ideal ever formulated*" and often referred to as "*the best known and the noblest of American State papers*" irrevocably broke colonial allegiance to Great Britain and became the cornerstone of a new and great nation. By signing that document, those men knew that they were risking their lives, their fortunes, and their sacred honor. Nevertheless, they acted, believing that what they were doing was right.

Those nine men were Masons. John Hancock, chairman of the group that prepared and signed the

Declaration, was a member of Merchants Lodge # 277 in Quebec and St. Andrew's Lodge in Boston. Benjamin Franklin was a member of St. John's Lodge # 115 in Philadelphia, Pa. The Lodge of which Joseph Hewes was a member is not known, but it is recorded that he was a visitor to Unanimity Lodge # 7 in Edenton, N. C. William Ellery was a member of St. John's Lodge in Boston, Mass. and St. Johns Lodge # 4 in Hartford, Conn. William Hooper was a member of Hanover Lodge in Masonboro, N. C. The Lodge of which Robert Treat Paine, Jr. was a member is unknown, but it is recorded that he was present in the Grant Lodge of Massachusetts at Roxbury on June 26, 1796. Richard Stockton was a Charter Member and Master of St. John's Lodge in Princeton, N. J. George Walton was a member of Solomon's Lodge # 1 in Savannah, Georgia. William Whipple was a member of St. John's Lodge # 1 in Portsmouth, N. H.



Those Masons, along with that which they did, bear witness to the significant contribution of Freemasonry in a crucial period of American history and the good Freemasonry can accomplish at any time when Masons, facing difficult situations, do that which they know to be right.

4th of July History & Trivia – Did You Know...

- ★ The major objection to being ruled by Britain was taxation without representation. The colonists had no say in the decisions of English Parliament.
- ★ In May, 1776, after nearly a year of trying to resolve their differences with England, the colonies sent delegates to the Second Continental Congress. Finally, in June, admitting that their efforts were hopeless; a committee was formed to compose the formal Declaration of Independence. Headed by Thomas Jefferson, the committee also included John Adams, Benjamin Franklin, Philip Livingston and Roger Sherman. On June 28, 1776, Thomas Jefferson presented the first draft of the declaration to Congress.
- ★ Betsy Ross, according to legend, sewed the first American flag in May or June 1776, as commissioned by the Congressional Committee.
- ★ Independence Day was first celebrated in Philadelphia on July 8, 1776.
- ★ The Liberty Bell sounded from the tower of Independence Hall on July 8, 1776, summoning citizens to gather for the first public reading of the Declaration of Independence by Colonel John Nixon.
- ★ June 14, 1777, the Continental Congress, looking to promote national pride and unity, adopted the national flag. "Resolved: that the flag of the United States be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."
- ★ The word 'patriotism' comes from the Latin patria, which means 'homeland' or 'fatherland.'
- ★ The first public Fourth of July event at the White House occurred in 1804.
- ★ The first Independence Day celebration west of the Mississippi occurred at Independence Creek and was celebrated by Lewis and Clark in 1805.
- ★ On June 24, 1826, Thomas Jefferson sent a letter to Roger C. Weightman, declining an invitation to come to Washington, D.C., to help celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. It was the last letter that Jefferson, who was gravely ill, ever wrote.
- ★ Both Thomas Jefferson and John Adams died on Independence Day, July 4, 1826.
- ★ The 56 signers of the Declaration of Independence did not sign at the same time, nor did they sign on July 4, 1776. The official event occurred on August 2, 1776, when 50 men signed it.
- ★ The names of the signers of the Declaration of Independence were withheld from the public for more than six months to protect the signers. If independence had not been achieved, the treasonable act of the signers would have, by law, resulted in their deaths.
- ★ Thomas McKean was the last to sign in January, 1777.
- ★ The origin of Uncle Sam probably began in 1812, when Samuel Wilson was a meat packer who provided meat to the US Army. The meat shipments were stamped with the initials, U.S. Someone joked that the initials stood for "Uncle Sam". This joke eventually led to the idea of Uncle Sam symbolizing the United States government.
- ★ In 1941, Congress declared 4th of July a federal legal holiday. It is one of the few federal holidays that have not been moved to the nearest Friday or Monday.
