

Illustrious Brother Ernest Borgnine January 24, 1917 – July 8, 2012

Illustrious Ernest Borgnine, 33rd, Grand Cross, received the Screen Actors Guild Life Achievement Award for career achievement and humanitarian accomplishments during his sixty-year career. He was first cast as a hospital attendant in a Broadway production of *Harvey* and went on to appear in more than 200 films. He usually played a villain until his breakout starring role in 1955's *Marty*, for which he won an Academy Award for Best Actor. He made the transition to television comedy when he starred in *McHale's Navy*.



In 2000, Ill. Ernest Borgnine received his 50-year pin as a Mason in Abingdon Lodge No. 48, Abingdon, Virginia. He joined the Scottish Rite Valley of Los Angeles in 1964, received the KCCH in 1979, was coronated a 33rd Inspector General Honorary in 1983, and received the Grand Cross of the Court of Honour in 1991. The Long Beach, California, Scottish Rite dedicated their theatre to Brother Borgnine in May 7, 2011.

Most recently, this past March, Brother Borgnine appeared at the Scottish Rite Leadership Conference in San Diego, California.

Brother Borgnine died Sunday, July 8, 2012 at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles.

In 1946, I travelled with a friend down to a little town called Abingdon, Virginia, to see what the Barter Theatre had to offer. It offered nothing except hard work and board. My friend, not accepting the work they offered him, stayed one day - I stayed five years. In that time I grew to love the town and all it offered. The people, in particular, were simply marvelous.

Occasionally I would be assigned to go down to the printing shop and get posters made for the upcoming shows at the Barter Theatre. One day, in talking to the owner of the print shop, one Elmo Vaughan, I found that he belonged to the local Masonic Lodge, No. 48, in Abingdon. My father was also a Mason and had advanced to the Thirty-second Degree in Scottish Rite Masonry, and I told this to


Inducted into DeMolay International Hall of Fame

Lexington Lodge 1 – Passing of the Ring



care so much and work so hard for our youth. Thank you very much for what you do.



FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

A note from the Masonic Service Association of North America:

Year after year, we hear from participants that the Twain Award journey brought excitement and recognition to their Lodges. Many Lodges have already registered for this year's competition, but there is still time for more to get on board.

Below is information to register for the Twain Award.

NOTICE

Section 217 of the *Book of Constitutions* requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Constitutions or Laws of the Grand Lodge shall be submitted in writing and presented to the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communication

NOTICE

Section 12 (3) of the *Book of Constitutions* requires that an Elective Representative be a Permanent Member chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot attend the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the lodge seal.

SUSPENSIONS

Each year a few reports are received in this office of members being suspended on other than a Stated Communication of the Lodge-- most always on the last day of June. Section 176 of *The Book of Constitutions* specifies that the suspension of a member is to occur at the stated communication set in the summons and the suspension is complete at that time.

The suspended member may become reinstated the next day in accordance with Section 187, merely upon payment of the amount owing up to the time he was suspended. However, that does not alter or erase the fact that the suspension occurred,

and should be recorded as such.

Further, if the suspended member is a Plural Member, it is the primary responsibility of the suspending Lodge to notify the other Lodge(s) of which he is a member of the suspension in order for them to take appropriate action. As a follow-up the other Lodge(s) also receives a notice of the suspension from the Grand Lodge Office as soon as the information is received from the suspending Lodge.

YEAR-END ACTIVITY REPORTS

Beginning this year the reporting has changed for the Annual Returns. You will need to log in to the system and on your home page you will find alerts to the right of your screen. It will say "Run your Annual Return Report", once you click that it will pull up your Annual Return. You need to look it over and make sure it is correct. If there is something wrong with your report you are required to make the changes yourself.

These changes will have to be made by August 10, 2012 for them to count on your Annual Return.

Once changes are made and they have been approved run your Annual Return again and make sure that all changes have been made. Once your Annual Return is correct go to the bottom of the page and click "Testify your return report is accurate". Once this is done, it will send the Grand Lodge Office a notification and we will mark your Return as done. On August 10th, 2012 invoices will be sent to each lodge and you can send in your assessments to this office as normal or you can call and pay by Credit Card. We understand that things will be complicated this year because it is a new way to do things. The main focus should be the deadline for changes to your Annual Return-- Again that date is August 10th.

PLEASE if you have questions or problems contact us

BEFORE August 10th so we can help you. After the deadline we can help you but no changes can be approved for your assessments due to the Grand Lodge.

Zoneton Lodge 964





Masonic Homes of Kentucky dedicated a Sam Swope Care Center household in honor of the late Kentucky Governor and U. S. Senator A. B. "Happy" Chandler, Sr.

Perhaps best known for his public service and stint as commissioner of professional baseball, Chandler was a 71-year member of the Masonic fraternity. "It is with great appreciation for his dedication to the commonwealth of Kentucky and his fraternal involvement that we name this household The Chandler House," said Masonic Homes' President and CEO Gary Marsh.

A portrait of Chandler was unveiled by Chandler's grandson, U.S. Congressman Ben Chandler. "My grandfather would be particularly proud of this honor," said Congressman Chandler. "It represents two things that were very important to him: being a Mason, and health care for the welfare of the people of this Commonwealth."

Happy Chandler served as Kentucky's 44th governor, serving two terms from 1935 to 1939 and again from 1955 to 1959. He was elected U.S. Senator in 1940 before serving as Commissioner of Major League Baseball. He established the medical school at the University of Kentucky, which is named in his honor—the Chandler Medical Center.

Chandler's Masonic resume' includes membership in Landmark Lodge No. 41 in Versailles, Scottish Rite and Oleika Shrine. He was also a member of the York Rite and Knights Templar.

Chandler died in Versailles in 1991.

Elmo. He was pleased, and sensing his pleasure, I asked him if maybe I could join. He said nothing, continuing his work, and a short while later, I took my posters and left.

The next time I saw Elmo, I asked him again about joining the Masonic Order - again he said nothing - and again my work took me away. We became good friends and finally one day I passed by and again I asked if I could join the Masons. Instantly, he whipped out an application and I hurriedly filled it out. I didn't learn 'til later, that in those days, you had to ask three times.

I was thrilled! Not only was I going to be the first actor ever in Lodge No. 48, but I could just imagine my father's surprise when I would spring the old greetings on him! I wanted only to surprise my Dad - and was I surprised, when after I was made an Entered Apprentice, I found I had to remember everything that happened to me at that event and come back and answer questions about it!

I was assigned to a dear old man of about 92 years of age who, I felt, must have been there when the Lodge first started. He was really of the old school - and he started me out with the foot-to-foot, knee-to-knee and mouth-to-ear routine of teaching.

Besides doing my work for the Barter Theatre and a little acting to boot, I was also going to that dear Brother for my work in Masonry. I would tramp all over those lovely hills and work on my "Whence came you's" and one day - oh, one fine day - I stood foot-to-foot with my Brother and answered every question perfectly! I was ecstatic! I was overjoyed and couldn't wait to get to Lodge to show my ability as an Entered Apprentice.

After I quieted down, that dear Brother said, "You've done fine, but aren't you really only half started?" I couldn't believe him! I knew my work; what else was there? He said "Wouldn't it be better if you knew all the questions too?"

I couldn't believe my ears! All that hard work and only half done? He gently sat me down foot-to-foot, knee-to-knee and mouth-to-ear and taught me all the

questions. That didn't come easy, because I was almost doing the work by rote, but with careful listening and by really applying myself, I was soon able to deliver all the questions and answers perfectly! The night that I stood in front of the Lodge and was asked if I were ready to answer the questions of an Entered Apprentice, I respectfully asked if I could do both - questions and answers. I was granted that wish and later found that I was the second man in my Lodge to have ever done so! I am truly proud of that, never having demitted, I am still a member in good standing in Abingdon Lodge No. 48.

I tell this story not for the merit it might gain me, but to tell you that learning the Entered Apprentice obligation taught me a great lesson in acting as well: that before I ever attempt to do a part I should work, rehearse, feel, almost live that part to know what I am talking about!

As I've advanced in Masonry, I have found we are an elite group of people who believe in God, country, family and neighbours. We work hard to help our fellowman; and through our charitable work, such as support for the Childhood Language Disorders Centers, we have made it possible to help many children grow into good American citizens. We should always be proud of the Order we belong to. Where in all the world do you find so many great men and Brothers who have helped the whole wide world? But - we are hiding our light under a bushel basket!

Recently I attended a dinner for a friend, and I ran across a Brother who identified himself in a hushed voice. I asked why he spoke in a whisper when talking about Masonry, and suddenly I realized he wasn't the only one who had ever done that. I speak out loud about Masonry to everyone! I'm proud of the fact that I belong to an organization that made me a better American, Christian, husband and neighbour; and all it took was a little self-determination by going foot-to-foot, knee-to-knee, and mouth-to-ear!


