

All members are encouraged to attend and be a part of the functions of your Society.



# Notes

## FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

“We’ve got to change”. “Masonry has to change”. “We’re stuck in the past”. “The older members of the lodge resist change”. No doubt we have all heard these remarks regarding Freemasonry at one time or another. What we may fail to realize is we have changed over time, slowly perhaps – but changed nevertheless. Certainly, the principles and tenets (Landmarks) of the Craft have not changed because they are unchangeable: however our modern day approach to the Fraternity, and the way we practice our Craft, has slowly changed from the way we approached and practiced it a century or so ago. Today we do not meet by a moon schedule, though a few lodges still do so. We no longer travel to lodge by horseback, though we do arrive via horsepower. We no longer struggle to see by moonlight, candle power, or gaslight – but by a constant light source, measured by candlepower (expressed in lumens) supplied by electric current. We no longer have to experience the uneven heat of a coal or wood burning stove to break the chill of the cold of winter, or the opening of vents and windows to get relief from the summer heat – but have the option of central heating and cooling technology to provide us with a comfortable environment during our lodge Communications.

So, considering the above facts, it becomes quite obvious that the Fraternity has succumbed ever so slowly to change over time. The fact it does change is a natural phenomenon since the world, and nature, does not exist in a static state – but in a dynamic one. One of the basic laws of dynamics (kinetics) is that an object in motion tends to remain in motion until influenced by some outside force. So it is with our Fraternity. The principles of Freemasonry remain in constant motion, the same as they were in the beginning; however, our approach to the practice of the Craft has been influenced by the slow change of society and the expansion of technology. So it becomes quite obvious, considering all the advantages available to us

in these modern times, that all change is not a thing to fear, and that the Freemasonry has done a reasonable job of meeting the challenges of changes in our society, while holding steady to the unchangeable tenets of the Fraternity.

Therefore, it appears, to me at least, it’s not change in itself which draws resistance from the membership – but is the pace and rate of drastic “change” over a short period of time. Slow change appears to come from slow and deliberate consideration of the need for change, one seen as necessary to address a situation that presents, or may present, a problem for the Fraternity. Many times a drastic, or quick, change seems to be directed more to the symptoms of a personal or particular problem instead of addressing the root cause of the problem, it is done in such haste as to not consider what ramifications the changes may have in the Fraternity as a whole. The old saying: “Act in haste, repent in leisure” comes to mind.

So, I think it most important we recognize and keep in mind the distinction between those changes that occur quite naturally in the Fraternity, and those that are sometimes suggested, in many cases, to address one personal or particular issue only. To do otherwise may not demonstrate the best example of good stewardship for our Fraternity, which is the paramount duty of not only the Grand Lodge leadership—but the Delegates assembled at the Annual Communications.

### NOTICE

**Section 217 of the Book of Constitutions requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Constitutions or Laws of the Grand Lodge shall be submitted in writing and presented to the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communications.**

### NOTICE

**Section 12 (3) of the Book of Constitutions requires that “An Elective Representative shall be chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot attend the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the lodge seal”.**

### WAIVER OF JURISDICTION- FEES RETURNED

Occasionally inquiries are made to the Grand Lodge Office concerning the return of fees when a waiver of jurisdiction is granted by a Lodge which has a higher initiation fee than the Lodge making the request for the waiver of jurisdiction.

Section 98(a) of the Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM deals specifically to this matter and states: “In all cases where the fee of the Lodge granting the waiver of jurisdiction is greater than the fee of the Lodge requesting the waiver the candidate shall pay to the Lodge which asks the waiver a fee equivalent to the fee he would have been required to pay had he petitioned the Lodge which granted the waiver. Immediately after the candidate is elected and initiated, the Secretary of the Lodge receiving the waiver shall send the difference in fees to the Lodge granting the waiver”. Simply put, when a Lodge receives a waiver of jurisdiction in favor of a candidate from a Lodge having jurisdiction, where the initiation fee

of the Lodge granting jurisdiction is higher than the initiation fee of the Lodge that is requesting the waiver, the candidate pays the higher fee and the difference in the fees must be paid to the Lodge granting the waiver (Section 98 (A) *Book of Constitutions*).

\*\*\*\*\*

Another misconception concerning waivers of jurisdiction, held by some, is a waiver is not necessary in cases where a Mason petitions for Dual or Plural membership to a lodge within a jurisdiction in which he does not reside. The thinking seems to be, since the petitioner is already a Freemason, he is free to join a lodge in any other jurisdiction without a waiver of jurisdiction being granted by the lodge holding jurisdiction by way of his residence. Not so! Section 99 of the *Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky* very plainly states “A lodge that receives the petition and initiates a candidate, **or admits to membership a brother from a jurisdiction not its own** (my emphasis), in violation of the provision of sections 95-98, shall forfeit and pay the fees to the lodge which lawfully held jurisdiction, and be subject to having its Charter arrested, or such other penalty as the Grand Lodge may impose.”

## Grand Lodge Officers perform cornerstone ceremony at Miralea



In a ritual that is as old as Masonry itself, the Grand Lodge officers ceremoniously dedicated the cornerstone of the Miralea community on the Homes' Louisville campus on a sunny April Sunday.

"Since our founding in 1867, Masonic Homes has led the way in providing services that people needed," CEO Gary Marsh told the more than 200 people in attendance. "Today, in 2012, we are again at the forefront of innovation with development of Miralea, the first life care community in Kentucky."

Masonic Homes began marketing Miralea in early 2011. Within six months, all of the 90 apartment residences and 12 patio homes were presold. The \$43.8 million development was financed through a sale of Kentucky Economic Development Finance Authority bonds. Construction is scheduled for completion in October 2012.

Homes' Board Chair and Grand Secretary Joe Conway said the Miralea cornerstone ceremony signals the dawn of new services at Masonic Homes. "In a few short years, we have moved the Masonic Homes from being an excellent provider of senior care to leading the way for others to follow," Conway said. "We are honored to carry this great heritage of service into the future."

## Veteran Memorial Service For Brother Hugh Elliott WW II Veteran U S N and U S Air Force



On Saturday, April 21, 2012 a memorial service was held for Brother Hugh Elliott At Highland Memory Gardens Cemetery, 276 Landis Lane, in Mt. Washington, Kentucky.

Brother Elliott was a member of McNeil Lodge No. 586 in Lebanon, Jct., Kentucky. He was also a member and Past Master No. 829. Brother Elliott had been a Master Mason for over 53-years and served the Grand Lodge of Kentucky as District Deputy Grand Master.

On January 11, 2012, Brother Elliott and his two grandsons, Conner Lyn Elliott, age 7 and Austin Daniel Elliott, age 9, perished in a house fire in Lois, South Carolina.

Their bodies were returned to Kentucky, where a funeral service was held on January 16, 2012, but Brother Elliott was never given a Military Funeral Service or presented the American Flag to cover his casket at the service, even though he served in the U S Navy and U S Air Force during World War II. All military

records had been lost in the fire. The Kentucky Honor Mission Team 12 and the Missing in America Project, took it upon themselves to honor this Veteran and his grandsons with a full military service at the grave site on April 21, 2012, at 1200 hours at Highland Memory Gardens Cemetery.

Official Honor Guard was conducted by the Middletown VFW Post 1170. Color Guards were the U S Navy, Kosair Legion of Honor Men of Military, as well as the Boy Scouts of American. (Brother Elliott served as a Scout Leader for over 20-years). The American Flag Line was conducted by the Warrior Watch Riders. Many honored guest, including, family, friend's military personnel and Masonic Brothers of several area Lodges were in attendance.

The service was officiated by the Kentucky Honor Mission Team 12 with Brother Walt Oster and Dale LeMond, Regional Director from the Missing in American Project.

American Flag Etiquette

Federal law stipulates many aspects of flag etiquette. The section of law dealing with American Flag etiquette is generally referred to as the Flag Code. Some general guidelines from the Flag Code answer many of the most common questions:

- The flag should be lighted at all times, either by sunlight or by an appropriate light source.
- The flag should be flown in fair weather, unless the flag is designed for inclement weather use.
- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should not be used for any decoration in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halyard.
- The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind placed on it, or attached to it.
- The flag should never be used for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.
- When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously.
- The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.
- When a flag is so worn it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.
