

By the time this issue of the Masonic Home Journal is delivered the first of the District Meetings, will be upon us, with several more to follow during the remainder of the month. The line Officers along with the Treasurer and Secretary of each Lodge within the District should attend the meeting. Other Lodge members who aspire to an office in the Lodge should, also attend; for they can learn much that will be helpful to them should they succeed and become Lodge Officers.

There is much to learn—both good and bad—from the experience of others and there is no sense in reinventing the wheel each year when it concerns Lodge leadership and the needs of the Fraternity. Well informed and knowledgeable Officers at the Lodge level is the most crucial element in insuring a vibrant and progressive Grand Lodge. The elected and appointed Grand Lodge Officers of any jurisdiction are only the visual examples of the combined health and strength of the Lodges within that jurisdiction.

Consequently, somewhere along the line in seeking equilibrium, each Grand Lodge will reach a point of diminishing returns where the weakest Lodges overcome the effort of the more successful Lodges, and the Fraternity as a whole suffers as the result. Therefore, each Lodge in the Grand Jurisdiction of Kentucky—each officer and certainly, each member should, no, must-- make their best efforts to insure that the Lodge of which they are a member strives to the utmost to be on the positive side of the equation so as not to detract from the efforts of others.

So make sure you are on the

right team to move your Lodge forward and not one for whom some Brother has to carry part of his load.

MASONIC DIRECTORY

Lodge Secretaries, you should soon receive a Masonic Directory for your use. Additional Directories may be purchased from the Grand Lodge Office at cost plus mailing charges.

Again this year several Lodges that failed to submit the list of officers elected and appointed will not be listed in the Directory, and several others were late in submitting the list. This oversight on the part of those Lodges makes the Directory late in completion and less useful to those who may wish to visit or contact those Lodges not listed than it would be otherwise.

Each year it is my hope that we can have all Lodges report the newly elected and appointed Officers prior to January 10 and have 100% of the Lodges included in the Directory. Again, this year we didn't make it-- Maybe next year!!!!

THE FIRST ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE



The first St. Patrick's Day parade took place not in Ireland but in the United States. Irish soldiers serving in the English military marched through New York City on March 17, 1762. Along with their music, the parade helped the soldiers reconnect with their Irish roots, as well as fellow Irishmen serving in the English army.

Over the next 35 years, Irish patriotism among American immigrants flourished, prompting the rise of so-called "Irish Aid" societies like the Friendly Sons of Saint Patrick and the Hibernian Society. Each group would hold annual parades featuring bagpipes (which actually first became popular in the Scottish and British armies) and drums.

In 1848, several New York Irish Aid societies decided to unite their parades to form one New York City St. Patrick's Day Parade. Today, that parade is the world 's oldest civilian parade and the largest in the United States, with over 150,000 participants.

Each year, nearly three million people line the 1.5-mile parade route to watch the procession, which takes more than five hours. Boston, Chicago, Philadelphia and Savannah also celebrate the day with parades involving between 10,000 and 20,000 participants.
