Notes

FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

JOSEPH R. CONWAY,

A question often comes to the Grand Lodge Office about how much lodge information should be kept by the lodge Secretary. Our answer has always been to keep as much as you possibly can. Obviously, the personal information on the lodge membership is of utmost importance, both for the present and for future reference, and should be retained indefinitely. Some lodge Secretaries even keep other information on lodge members in their personal file when they distinguish themselves in the community, or in other ways. The same goes for other records such as lodge minutes, deeds, correspondence, insurance contracts, tax information, bequests, IRS information, etc. The history of the lodge is maintained in the minute book of the lodge proceedings and the membership records of the lodge, and these items should be protected and stored in a safe, secure and fire-proof location. Some item, such as cancelled checks, invoices, bank records, etc., may be destroyed when they are no longer useful. However, it is advisable to retain them as long as possible.

One basic item that should be preserved and filed properly is the original petition submitted for membership in the lodge, whether it is for the degrees or affiliation, and it should be filled out completely by the petitioner and the lodge Secretary. The importance of doing this was brought to my attention recently when a lodge member, trying to reconstruct the membership listing of his lodge for a new Secretary, called the Grand Lodge Office for information on the membership and records for his lodge. He could locate only a few items to assist him, and the information requested on the forms he did find was not complete, and consequently not of much use to him; apparently, the previous Secretary did not think doing so was a high priority. The petition forms, if filled out completely by both the petitioner and lodge Secretary, contains all the basic information on the individual member, and should be retained for future reference in cases such as the one noted above.

As Secretaries, we are all too familiar with the loads of paperwork that we are required to deal

with, and for the filing and maintenance of the same; however, with today's technology, it is much easier to record, maintain and store vital information, a worthy effort important to the preservation of the history of our lodges. So, be very conscious and selective in what you decide to discard or delete.

AWARDS ELIGIBILITY LIST

Each Lodge Secretary should receive the "Award Eligibility List" from the Grand Lodge Office in May for those eligible for the 50, 60, and 75 year Grand Lodge Veteran's Awards. You will be sent instructions with your list that will explain specifically how to fill it out. Please follow these instructions precisely.

The plateaus in time that a Brother must reach to qualify for these awards are significant, and the Grand Lodge Office wants to insure that those Brothers due the award receive it timely. So, we encourage you to give this review your close attention.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN LODGES

Just a reminder to each Lodge Secretary, if you are communicating with another Lodge within the Grand Jurisdiction of Kentucky in an official capacity, you may correspond directly with the said Lodge. However, any correspondence with a Lodge - **or Grand Lodge - other than the one within whose Jurisdiction your Lodge is located must be transmitted through both Grand Lodge Offices.**

This procedure is intended to insure that a complete record of the particular transaction is fully noted at each level. Following this policy also saves time in as much as Lodges, agreeable to Masonic Protocol, will not directly respond to correspondence from a Lodge outside their Jurisdiction - thus creating delays by stalling the correspondence.

Just remember, all out-of-state correspondence must be transmitted through the Grand Lodge Office.

MASONIC DIRECTORY

The Masonic Directories for 2012 are still available from the Grand Lodge Office. The price is \$10.00 each which is the cost of printing. In addition you will be

charged shipping and handling if we mail the Directory to you. A form is printed below for your convenience should you wish to place an order for one or more.

GRAND LODGE BLANKET INSURANCE

By this time, each lodge Secretary should have received a Memorandum of Insurance statement from the Grand Lodge Office, showing the type, amount and a general description of the coverage each of the items in the agreement provides. You should file the same and use it as proof of coverage if, as you are most probably aware, insurance is a complicated business to most of us; consequently, it is well-nigh impossible to prepare a general statement that would answer all the questions that may come to mind. However, if you find that you have specific questions concerning what is included in the coverage, and to what extent, you may call, either, this office, or contact;

The one insurance question we get most often in the Grand Lodge Office concerns insurance on the lodge building. The blanket insurance carried by the Grand Lodge does **not** in any way include coverage on a lodge building, either for liability or fire and casualty. **If your lodge owns a building, you must carry additional insurance to protect your membership.** Should that be the case, you should contact a local insurance agency to determine the plan best suited for the needs of your lodge.



The Kentucky Derby

TEN FASCINATING FACTS



The Kentucky Derby is sometimes called the "Most exciting two minutes in sports". That's because it lasts just about two minutes. But what a two minutes it is! Here's a bit of trivia to help you understand and enjoy "The run for the roses" even more:

- The idea for the Kentucky Derby was thought up by explorer Meriwether Lewis. In fact, the land where it is run was donated by his relatives, the Churchills— thus the name Churchill Downs.
- The fastest Derby ever was run by Secretariat in 1973. He ran the race in 1:59.4 and is the only horse to have ever come in faster than two minutes.
- Although most Kentucky Derby winners have been males –geldings and stallions– three fillies have won the race. They were Favored Regret in 1915, Genuine Risk in 1980 and Winning Colors in 1988.
- Willie Shoemaker was the oldest jockey to ever win the Derby. He was 54 when he rode Ferdinand to win in 1986.
- On May 2, 1970 Diane Crump became the first woman to ride in the Kentucky Derby.
- No matter when they are actually born, race horses are considered a year older on January first.
- Horses running for the roses lose an average of fifteen to twenty-five pounds during the race.
- An amazing total of eight Kentucky Derby winners have been bred by Calumet Farms in Kentucky.
- Racing rules hold that no racehorse may have a name that contains more than eighteen letters, so as to fit legibly on the racing forms.
- Presidential candidate Richard Nixon was in the house when the only Derby winner to be disqualified for cheating was busted in 1968.
