Notes

FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

While the “social media network” (Facebook, Twitter, etc.) has been around on the internet for a while, and has become a fast growing phenomenon with many making use of the technology, it is still in the infancy stage and going through a learning curve. There are many great benefits to be gained from this technology such as instant and mass world-wide communication, making friends, exchanging ideas, learning of other cultures, and is a positive addition to the modern technological tools we have available at our fingertips for good. However, there is also a down side. Since the internet is not private, the potential for using the technology for doing mischief is always prevalent, as witnessed by the number of incidents of cyber-bulling, slander, and alleged disclosure of privileged, private, and confidential information by some using the “social media network”.

On several occasions during the past few months, calls from concerned members of the Craft have been received in the Grand Lodge Office about the propriety of some of the material being posted on the internet by the “social media network” medium regarding what they consider private and confidential Masonic information; i.e. reports of conferral of degrees, membership suspension information, etc. Their one overriding question was how does the *Book of Constitutions* deal with the matter? While the *Book of Constitutions* doesn't address the matter specifically, it does so in general. According to Roscoe Pound, secrecy is one of the six recognized fundamental landmarks of Freemasonry (number five by H. B. Grant), and is a universally recognized tradition of the Fraternity. As Freemasons, we have all taken an oath to abide by the landmarks, established customs and traditions of Freemasonry,

and are admonished to act accordingly.

Consequently, while there are many things we as Masons may share with the public—on the internet or otherwise—we should be very cautious about maintaining our privacy and not going over the line; thereby unwittingly violating our oath and obligation.

NOTICE

Section 217 of the *Book of Constitutions* requires that all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the Constitutions or Laws of the Grand Lodge shall be submitted in writing and presented to the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communication

NOTICE

Section 12 (3) of the *Book of Constitutions* requires that an Elective Representative be a Permanent Member chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot attend the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the lodge seal.

SUSPENSIONS

Each year a few reports are received in this office of members being suspended on other than a Stated Communication of the Lodge-- most always on the last day of June. Section 176 of the *Book of Constitutions* specifies that the suspension of a member is to occur at the stated communication set in the summons and the suspension is complete at that time. Once suspended NPD, a petition for

reinstatement must be submitted by the suspended member (Section 187 *Book of Constitutions*).

Further, if the suspended member is a Plural Member, it is the primary responsibility of the suspending Lodge to notify the other Lodge(s) of which he is a member of the suspension in order for them to take appropriate action. As a follow-up the other Lodge(s) also receives a notice of the suspension from the Grand Lodge Office as soon as the information is received from the suspending Lodge.

YEAR-END

ACTIVITY REPORTS

Last year the reporting had changed for the Annual Returns. Again this year you will need to log in to the system and on your home page you will find alerts to the right of your screen. It will say “Run your Annual Return Report”, once you click that it will pull up your Annual Return. You need to look it over and make sure it is correct. If there is something wrong with your report you are required to make the changes yourself.

These changes will have to be made by August 10, 2013 for them to count on your Annual Return.

Once changes are made and they have been approved run your Annual Return again and make sure that all changes have been made. Once your Annual Return is correct go to the bottom of the page and click “**Testify your return report is accurate**”. Once this is done, it will send the Grand Lodge Office a notification and we will mark your Return as done. On August 10th, 2013 invoices (the back page of your Annual Return) should be accurate for each lodge and you can send in your assessments to this office as normal or

you can call and pay by Credit Card. We understand that things will be complicated again this year because it is a new way to do things. The main focus should be the deadline for changes to your Annual Return- Again that date is **August 10th**.

PLEASE if you have questions or problems contact us BEFORE August 10th so we can help you. After the deadline we can help you but no changes can be approved for your assessments due to the Grand Lodge.





She also entertained service personnel at Fort Knox.

Today Mrs. Walker shares her cheer and positive attitude. "When I see others in the hallways, I try to smile and hope that it spreads," she said. And she is happy to sing the praises of Masonicare. "I don't worry about where I'm going to live or how I will be cared for," Mrs. Walker said. "Masonic Home is a nice, safe place to live and I've enjoyed it for 27 years."



Tips on Beating the Heat

- Decrease physical activity and try to exercise in the early morning or early evening.
- Wear loose, light colored cotton clothing and wear wide brimmed hats or umbrellas for shade.
- Drink plenty of water.
- Eat light meals.
- Avoid alcohol.
- Cool down with air conditioning, showers, baths, and swimming.
- Keep the sun out of your home by adjusting blinds and awnings.
- Use the basement during the hottest hours.

- Use circulating fans to lower temperatures in living spaces, but when temperatures exceed 95°F, a fan may not help. Fans may even increase heat stress in very hot weather and should be used to blow hot air directly onto the body.
- Don't leave children and pets unattended in closed vehicles because temperatures can reach dangerous levels.
- Individuals with chronic health problems should minimize activities to avoid extra stress on those systems.



- Extra caution should be taken for the elderly, infants and children.
- Don't increase salt or potassium intake or take salt tablets without a physician's authorization.
