# Notes

## FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

As the old adage goes "You only have one opportunity to make a first impression". With that thought in mind, and if we are so inclined, every avenue should be taken to make sure that impression is a positive one. Applying the above noted thought to our Masonic Order, the first opportunity to make a positive impression on a petitioner for the Degrees is made in the conferral of the Entered Apprentice Degree. While all Masonic Degrees when efficiently and completely conferred are important and meaningful to the candidate, the Entered Apprentice Degree stands out as special since the search for Masonic knowledge begins at that point, and if the candidate is not properly instructed, the Degree not fully and proficiently conferred, and he is not sufficiently impressed with what he sees, he may well decide not to continue.

Many lodges in the Grand Jurisdiction of Kentucky have over time expressed concern about Entered Apprentices who show no interest in advancing through the Degrees. Could the reason be they were not impressed in the beginning of their Masonic quest? I think this is a question each of us needs to ask ourselves. The structure of the Masonic Degrees is such that they lay out a life style and pattern worthy of any man to follow, and should inspire all to become a Master Mason and seeker of Masonic Light. We just need to make sure all who knock upon our doors get the full effect of the important tenets and virtues taught in our degrees, and that starts with a positive impression of the Fraternity gleaned by the candidate in the conferral of the Entered Apprentice Degree. So I encourage the Master and Officers of each lodge in the Commonwealth to make sure the Degrees are conferred completely and proficiently, putting added emphasis on the Entered Apprentice Degree for that **Positive First Impression!**

### AWARDS ELIGIBILITY LIST

Each Lodge Secretary should ELECTRONICALLY receive the "Award Eligibility List" report, or notice thereof, from the Grand Lodge Office in May for those eligible for the 50, 60, and 75 year Grand Lodge Veteran's Awards. You will be sent instructions with your list that will explain specifically how to fill it out. Please follow these instructions precisely.

The plateaus in time that a Brother must reach to qualify for these awards are significant, and the Grand Lodge Office wants to insure that those Brothers due the award receive it timely. So, we encourage you to give this review your close attention.



## Good news for Homes supporters

While the recent *American Taxpayer Relief Act* might be a mixed bag for some, for those with charitable interests there is good news. Now individuals at least 70 ½ years old can make a gift directly from an IRA to the Homes without paying income tax on the transfer. Individuals may give up to \$100,000 per person per year.

If you choose to give in this way, please ask your IRA custodian to make the check payable to Masonic Homes of Kentucky – not to you. If that happens, you may be subject to taxes on the amount, even though you might sign it over to the Homes immediately.

Even though you may not deduct the transfer as a gift, you can count what you give against the required minimum distribution individuals who have reached 70 ½ must take from their IRA.

Bottom line—it's a great way to live your obligation, especially if you do not need your entire distribution for living expenses. If you do, consider giving part or all of your IRA through your will. ## Your license to share the story

The special Masonic license plate is available at county clerk's offices. Ask for it when you renew.

Kentucky Masons are always looking for ways to tell the story of the Fraternity. A simple way to start the conversation is through the special Masonic license plate.

A new, specially designed tag was introduced in December 2012. When renewing your vehicle tag, you may request the Kentucky Freemason plate if you present a current dues card.

The cost of the tag includes a \$10 donation to Masonic Homes. Proceeds help the Homes provide care and services for our Masonicare residents.

The Kentucky Freemason plate also may be personalized with any combination of up to six letters and numbers. Ask your local County Clerk's office for details.

# MEMORIAL DAY

remembers those who died serving the United States Military

Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday of May. It was formally known as Decoration Day and commemorates all men and women, who have died in military service for the United States. Many people visit cemeteries and memorials on Memorial Day and it is traditionally seen as the start of the summer season.

### ***What do people do?***

It is traditional to fly the flag of the United States at half mast from dawn until noon. Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, particularly to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers place an American flag on each grave in national

cemeteries. Memorial Day is combined with Jefferson Davis' Birthday in Mississippi.

Memorial Day has become less of an occasion of remembrance. Many people choose to hold picnics, sports events and family gatherings on this weekend. This day is traditionally seen as the start of the summer season for cultural events. For the fashion conscious, it is seen as acceptable to wear white clothing, particularly shoes from Memorial Day until Labor Day. However, fewer and fewer people follow this rule and many wear white clothing throughout the year.

### ***Public life***

Memorial Day is a federal holiday. All non-es-

sential Government offices are closed, as are schools, businesses and other organizations. Most public transit systems do not run on their regular schedule. Many people see Memorial Day weekend as an opportunity to go on a short vacation or visit family or friends. This can cause some congestion on highways and at airports.

### ***Background***

Memorial Day started as an event to honor Union soldiers, who had died during the American Civil War. It was inspired by the way people in the Southern states honored their dead. After World War I, it was extended to include all men and women, who died in any war or military action.

Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day. The current name for this day did not come into use until after World War II. Decoration Day and then Memorial Day used to be held on May 30, regardless of the day of the week, on which it fell. In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed as part of a move to use federal holidays to create three-day weekends. This meant that that, from 1971, Memorial Day holiday has been officially observed on the last Monday in May. However, it took a longer period for all American states to recognize the new date.
