FROM YOUR GRAND SECRETARY

At this writing (early January), another Holiday Season has passed and left us with its “down side”—credit card payments, returning of undersized/oversized gifts, bathroom scales indicating an overindulgence of holiday repasts and, probably, some already broken New Year’s Resolutions. But, after that emotion begins to ebb, we start to relish all the pleasant memories that we shared with our families and friends during this annual Season of caring, sharing and giving. Also, this is an appropriate time to pause and give thanks to our Creator for all his goodness and loving kindness to his creatures here on earth.

However, at this time of the year it’s all too easy to feel gloomy because of the short days, sparse sunshine, bone-chilling weather, bare trees and the lack of green grass, colorful flowers, and still the prospect of another month or so before we begin to see the situation improve. But improve it will, and spring will come with all its freshness, and promise of beauty. As we enjoy the beauties of spring when it does arrive, it would be thoughtful to give a measure of “thanks” to the gloomy Season just past for giving us thankful hearts and a stronger appreciation for the welcome change of the Season.

LODGE AND TAXES

Contrary to what many believe, the Grand Lodge of Kentucky and its constituent Lodges do not classify under Federal, State, County, or City Tax Codes as charitable organizations and are, therefore, liable for various taxes that apply according to various tax laws. The IRS classification for the Grand Lodge and Subordinate Lodges is 501 (C) (10) Fra-

ternal Non Profit and as such, does not relieve them from paying certain taxes such as property taxes, sales taxes, unemployment taxes, income taxes (in certain cases), and probably others that do not readily come in mind.

Each year I report to the IRS the active lodges under charter of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky and the category of the income level of each lodge as it is reported by each on the Grand Lodge database. However, this report does not relieve each lodge from filing its own annual report to the IRS prior to the 15th day of the fifth month following the close of the fiscal year of the lodge. If the gross income level of the lodge is less than \$50,000.00, the 990N report must be made online. If the income level is more than \$50,000.00, the report must be made on either the 990EZ or 990 long form.

Since the tax codes are so complex, I am somewhat reluctant to advise Lodges on their tax situations and/or liabilities. Therefore, if I have created any doubts in your mind about individual Lodge tax responsibilities, I suggest that you contact either the IRS or a reliable tax consultant to clear up any questions that may come to mind.

GRAND MASTER’S DECISION

Section 33 of the Book of Constitutions requires the Grand Secretary to have a copy of every opinion made by the Grand Master printed immediately in the Masonic Home Journal. In compliance with the above requirement, I am causing the same to be printed as follows:

Dear Mr. Caudill:

In response to your correspondence of November 1, 2013, concerning your suspension by Hazard Lodge No. 676 for NPD, I can find no reason to interfere with what has been done regarding the same. The reasons for my decision are as follows:

1. Every member of the Fraternity is advised on Initiation that his dues and assessments are due and payable in advance on January 1 each year (Book of Constitutions, Section 154). Therefore, it is incumbent upon the Mason to assure he stays current with his dues and assessments.
2. There is approximately a six month grace period from January until the June communication at which time the brother is subject to suspension for NPD. During the grace period, the brother should be aware he is not current with his dues and assessments and should make arrangements to pay them.
3. The Secretary affirmed a notice to appear to show cause why you should not be suspended NPD was sent to you by regular first-class mail to your address of record by him, all he is required to do by the Book of Constitutions (Section 176).

Consequently, it is your responsibility to furnish conclusive proof he did not do so before you would have a case, and your correspondence did not contain any such proof. Therefore it appears the Secretary acted accordingly and the suspension NPD is valid, and in order for you to become reinstated you must submit a petition for the same to Hazard Lodge No. 676, as required by the Book of Constitutions (Section 187).

Should you have any questions regarding the above, you

may refer them directly to me or through the Grand Lodge Office.

Presidents' Day:

Origin as Washington's Birthday

The story of Presidents' Day date begins in 1800. Following President George Washington's death in 1799, his February 22 birthday became a perennial day of remembrance. At the time, Washington was venerated as the most important figure in American history, and events like the 1832 centennial of his birth and the start of construction of the Washington Monument in 1848 were cause for national celebration.

While Washington's Birthday was an unofficial observance for most of the 1800s, it was not until the late 1870s that it became a federal holiday. Senator Steven Wallace Dorsey of Arkansas was the first to propose the measure, and in 1879 President Rutherford B. Hayes signed it into law. The holiday initially only applied to the District of Columbia, but in 1885 it was expanded to the whole country. At the time, Washington's Birthday joined four other nationally recognized federal bank holidays—Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Independence Day and Thanksgiving—and was the first to celebrate the life of an individual American. Martin Luther King Jr. Day, signed into law in 1983, would be the second.

The tree's a champ

Residents, staff and visitors to the Homes' Louisville campus always notice the stately beauty of the trees. The large Red Elm behind Davies Hall caught the eye of Grounds Director Donna Hibbs, who thought it might be one for the record books.

She invited Kentucky State Forester Diana Olszowy to visit the campus and take official measurements. Sure enough, the Red Elm measured 282 inches in circumference and a soaring 90 feet in height, with an average crown spread of 82.6 feet wide. It was declared the largest Red Elm tree in Kentucky, edging out the previous record-holding tree in Taylor County.

Our tree is recognized among Kentucky's Champion Trees at <http://forestry.ky.gov/ChampionTrees>. The Red Elm is on its way to being named the largest Red Elm by American Forests' National Register of Big Trees, scoring a total of 392.63 points. Currently, the largest Elm of this species, located in Indiana, scored a total of 382 points.



A majestic Red Elm on the Louisville is the largest of its species in the state, and may be the biggest in the nation.

The next National Register of Big Trees will be published in mid-March and will likely include the Homes' Red Elm.
