We are now in the "Dog Days" of summer. Did you ever wonder where that phrase came from? During August, Sirius, the brightest star in the Northern Hemisphere, rises with the sun. Sirius is the main star in the constellation, Canis Major, or the Big Dog. The Big Dog has followed Orion the Hunter faithfully across the skies for a millennium. What, you ask, does this have to do with Masonry?

The lessons taught in the Fellow Craft Degree are profound. Usually, the Entered Apprentice Degree and the Master Mason Degree get most of the attention, but the Fellow Craft Degree teaches the attainment of knowledge.

Never stop learning my Brothers; never stop improving yourself in Masonry.

The Staircase Lecture says in part: "ASTRONOMY is that sublime science which inspires the contemplative mind to soar aloft and read the wisdom, strength, and beauty of the Great Creator in the heavens. How nobly eloquent of our God is the Celestial hemisphere! - spangled with the most magnificent heralds of his infinite glory! They speak to the whole universe; for there is no speech so barbarous, but their language is understood; nor nation so distant, but their voices are heard among them. The heavens proclaim the glory of God; The firmament declareth the works of His hands. # Notes

On November 23, 1866, a small group of forward-thinking Kentucky Masons met at Fourth and Green Streets in Louisville and adopted a resolution agreeing “to form ourselves into a society for the purpose of erecting in or near the city of Louisville a Widow and Orphans’ Home and Infirmary”. The result of their efforts was the first Masonic Home of its kind in the United States and, most probably, the world. Their initial effort, over time, has evolved into the three Masonic facilities of today: the Louisville Campus; the Shelbyville Campus; and Spring Hill Village in Taylor Mill, Kentucky. All Kentucky Masons from 1866 until the present time have every right to take pride in the part they have played in building, maintaining, and improving the original physical structures—as well as in the newer facilities which have been erected, such as the Sproutlings, the Swope Care Center and Miralea Retirement Community (which is being expanded at the present time)—and for bringing our Masonic Homes to the level of services they are able to provide our membership and Residents today. The seed first planted by that group of committed Masons when the first Masonic Home was built in 1868 has served as a model for the construction of many other Masonic Homes throughout the United States, and probably beyond.

While the original mission of the Masonic Homes remains the same as in the beginning, the evolution of time and progress has changed the expanding needs of our members and residents. Today, in keeping abreast with progress, our Masonic facilities are at the forefront in adapting to these changing

needs of our membership, and are very serious about continuing the Masonic Tradition of Caring so well established by Kentucky Masons and the Masonic Homes of Kentucky. So, if you haven’t had the opportunity to visit one of the Masonic facilities for a while, please do so as soon as you do ... I feel confident you will be pleased at what you see!

### SUSPENSIONS

Each year, a few reports come to the attention of the Grand Lodge Office about members being suspended for non-payment of dues on a date other than a Stated Communication of the lodge (usually on June 30). *The Book of Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F. & A. M.* Section 176 specifies the suspension of a member for non-payment must be done at a Stated Communication of the lodge. Consequently, the suspension is complete once the vote to suspend is taken at the Stated Communication; it cannot be delayed to a later date.

### NOTICE

Section 217 of the *Book of Constitutions* requires all motions on resolutions pertaining to amendments of the *Constitutions or Laws* of the Grand Lodge to be submitted in writing and presented to the Office of the Grand Secretary no later than August 15, prior to the Annual Communication.



This summer's annual Make-A-Wish Walk for Wishes was extra special this year, because Sproutlings Pediatric Day Care & Preschool student Addie Laine McDonald is 2014's Honorary Wish Child. Addie is in the Squirrels class and her mom, Amanda McDonald, is a CNA at Sproutlings.

Amanda and her husband learned through ultrasound that Addie only had one kidney, intestinal defects and other medical issues. After several surgeries, Addie's doctor recommended her for Make-A-Wish. When the Wish-Granting

volunteers visited, Addie wished to go to Florida and experience the Sesame Street Safari of Fun including lunch with Elmo.

The integration of medically fragile children and typical children at Sproutlings has helped Addie mature, according to Amanda. "Addie doesn't view herself as different at all," Amanda said. "Even if Addie did not have medical challenges, I would want her to be at Sproutlings."

Team Addie Laine + Sproutlings raised \$9,216 for the Make-A-Wish Walk for Wishes in June, with more than 75 staff and families participating. That granted another of Addie's wishes: to fund another child's wish experience.




