First, we are seeing very high levels of interest from Lodges working to attain the Grand Master's Excellency Award this year. As promised, the award is attain-



After deliberating on this situation we will make two additional awards at Grand Lodge this year. First and second place awards will be given to those Lodges that complete the most overall points on the program above and beyond the minimal requirement. These first and second place awards will be given to the qualifying Lodges in each of Areas 1, 2 and 3. A little good

and beyond the normal Grand Master's Excellency Awards.



Journal. I do have one final note about the bicycle program. Brothers, I did utter those words and, although the numbers aren't in yet, I have been told by several people, who are in the know, to get out the training wheels.

Finally, I want to talk with you for just a minute, about the public perception of our Fraternity. I want you to ask yourself this simple question. Does your community, as a whole, know where your Lodge is located and does your community associate you with quality and good works? I mention this because another strong theme emerged from the Lodge surveys mentioned above. The theme was that the Blue Lodges of Kentucky need to be associated with a very important and noble effort that non-Masons

understand. The organization mentioned most often on the Lodge surveys that did a good job in this area were the Shriners. Your returned surveys said that the public generally understands that Shriners do good works for children and that their symbol, the FEZ, is a very recognizable and trusted symbol. Brothers, if our Masonic Square and Compass is not viewed in a similar light in every community in our state, it is critical that we make it so. This is the time and this is the place for us to educate those who are Masons in their hearts, but not yet Lodge members, what we stand for.

In closing, you are the best assembly of men in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. I know I speak for the entire Grand Line Elected and Appointed Officers when I say that we all appreciate you very much. Brothers, as we look to the future, I want you to continue to be PROUD KENTUCKY FREEMASONS!



Designs that Redirect by Howard Coop

On a beautiful Friday morning, October 27, 1972, we were traveling northward on an ancient highway, now modernized. Known as the Highway of the Patriarchs, that old road goes north from Jerusalem through Judea, Samaria, Galilee, into Syria, and around the Fertile Crescent to that land we now know as Iraq.

Just north of Nablus while going through the valley of Barley-Vale, someone on the bus yelled, "Look!" With that, words of our guide were ignored and all eyes were focused upon a strange sight, a camel caravan that was going south.

Immediately, I thought of another caravan that, probably, traveled that same road about two thousand years ago. Led by a star and coming "from the east," those in it, often called Wise Men, were on their way to Jerusalem where they stopped to pay respect to King Herod and seek further direction. After

conferring with Herod, they left Jerusalem and were led by the star to a house in Bethlehem where they saw "a child and his mother." "Kneeling down and worshipping" that child, "they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh," gifts that were worthy of a king. Then, "having been warned," their lives were redirected. They did not go back to Herod as he had asked them to do. Instead, they "returned to their home country by another route."

Masons are men who, in their Masonic journey, have been taught to be wise enough, in all situations, to discern and follow the designs that are written upon life's trestle board for them. Those designs are not meaningless markings but intelligent instructions that can, and sometimes do, redirect life and sent it on "by another route."

So mote it be.


