

The 217th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM, will be held at the Galt House, Louisville, beginning at 8:30 a.m., Monday, October 17, 2016. Louisville is on Eastern Daylight Time.

The Master's Duty: To attend the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge. If unable to attend, to see that his Lodge is represented. Section 89 (6).

SECTION 12 (2). Representatives to Grand Lodge are the Master, or, in his absence the Senior Warden, or in his absence the Junior Warden, or in the absence of the Master and Wardens, the Secretary, by virtue of their respective offices. If they cannot attend:

SECTION 12 (3). An Elective Representative shall be chosen by ballot from the members of his lodge, to represent it in case its Master, Wardens or Secretary cannot attend the communication of the Grand Lodge, and such representative shall be given a certificate of his election over the Lodge seal. An Elected Representative must have the Certificate in his possession or have it prefiled in the Grand Lodge office or he will not be registered.

Failure to have your Lodge properly represented at two consecutive Annual Communications of the Grand Lodge may cause your charter to be arrested. (Sec. 89 [6]).

If you have lost or misplaced the certificate a duplicate may be ordered from the Grand Secretary.

The Master should see that a representative is elected. This makes five men eligible to represent your Lodge. One or two should always be on stand by, ready to go at a minute's notice should the one who is supposed to go cannot do so.

PAY, FORFEITURE OF PAY, **ROLL CALL AND PENALTIES** AT ROLL CALL

SECTION 68. Double Pay or Pay Without Service. No Brother shall receive pay in a double capacity, nor per diem for the time he is not actually in attendance, unless lawfully excused, during the sittings of the Grand Lodge, or a committee thereof.

SECTION71. *Representatives, Receipts in Full Shown.* Each representative shall exhibit to the Grand Treasurer the receipt of the Grand Secretary in full for all indebtedness of his Lodge to the Grand Lodge before he shall be paid mileage or per diem.

SECTION 72. *No Pay If Indebtedness Remitted.* No representative shall receive pay if his Lodge has not paid in full its indebtedness to the Grand Lodge, or if its dues have been donated or remitted; nor shall payment be made to one who vacates his seat without permission of the Grand Lodge.

SECTION 73. Pay Forfeited At Roll Call. Whenever the roll is called, every representative or other member who is entitled to mileage and per diem, must answer for his Lodge, or to his name if not a representative. If any fail to answer he shall forfeit, or if paid, shall refund the amount of his mileage and per diem. If he fails to do so, it shall be charged to his Lodge, which may collect it from him as dues.

The Grand Master or the Grand Secretary shall be the only officers with authority to excuse a representative from answering the roll call and then only for good cause shown by written request on a form provided.

SECTION 74. Answering for Another at Roll Call. Any brother who shall answer for another at any roll call shall forfeit his mileage and per diem and be guilty of un-Masonic conduct.

Committee on Credentials will begin registering Representatives Sunday, October 16, at 1:00 p.m., at a place so designated. Register upon arrival and avoid the rush on Monday morning. *Registration will close promptly on Tuesday, October 18, at 9:00 a.m.*

A Current Dues Card will be necessary to register.

Visitors: Master Masons in good standing in their Lodge are welcome and urged to attend any or all sessions of the Grand Lodge.

Motel: Do not delay, write or phone the hotel for reservations before the dead-

line. Be sure to state date and hour of your arrival when writing and that you are attending The Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F&AM.

Election of Grand Officers. Tuesday morning, October 18 at 10:00 a.m. Each elective Grand Officer, Past Grand Master, and the Representative from each subordinate Lodge shall have one vote and no more; Past Masters shall have one vote collectively. No one shall vote by proxy (Section 20). MEMBERS ENTITLED TO VOTE WILL RECEIVE A VOTING FOB WHEN THEY REGISTER. SHOULD YOU LOSE YOUR FOB, YOU WILL FORFEIT YOUR **VOTING RIGHTS. DUPLICATE FOBS** WILL NOT BE ISSUED. FOBS ARE TO BE RETURNED AT PER DIEM PICK-UP. IF YOUR FOB IS NOT RETURNED OR LOST YOUR LODGE WILL BE FINED \$100.00.

Mileage and Per Diem: Each representative shall exhibit to the Grand Treasurer the receipt of the Grand Secretary in full for all indebtedness of his Lodge to the Grand Lodge, before he shall be paid mileage or per diem. (Sec-tion 71). Be sure you contact your secretary and have this receipt in your possession before leaving home for the Grand Lodge.

Paymasters: Grand Treasurer, F. Keith Dreier, PGM and his assistants will begin paying mileage and per diem Tuesday at noon.

Roll Call of Representatives-Warning:

The last business of the Grand Lodge shall be to call the roll of members entitled to mileage and per diem. If any one entitled to mileage and per diem fails to answer without having been lawfully excused by the Grand Lodge, he shall forfeit, or if paid, shall refund the amount of his per diem. If he fails to do so, it shall be charged to his Lodge, which may collect it from him as dues. (Section 73).

To be excused one must obtain an excuse slip from the Grand Secretary or Grand Master stating day and time of excuse. Any time not served will be deducted from per diem unless authorized by the Grand Lodge to be paid in full.

TO THE DELEGATES OF GRAND LODGE OF KENTUCKY

At the 217th Grand Lodge of Kentucky Annual Communication we will be using an Electronic Voting system or EVOTE. Each Delegate will receive in their packet a voting FOB. Each one of the EVOTE fobs will be scanned to your Lodge number and you are responsible for that unit. If you lose the EVOTE Fob there will be no replacement and you will be unable to vote and your Lodge will be fined \$100.00 for replacement. Fobs are to be returned at PER-DIEM pickup location at the time you receive your Check.



o Mote it Be by Howard Coop

Forever, I will remember Tuesday evening, March 24, 1953. That was a little over sixty-three years ago and the first communication of Lancaster Lodge # 104 that I was privileged to attend after being raised two weeks earlier to the sublime degree of a Master Mason. Prayer by the chaplain, Brother Elmer Ray, was part of the opening of that communication. I was not, in the least, surprised by that prayer, for I had been a member of other organizations and invocations always opened their meetings. What surprised me was the loud and enthusiastic response of all the brothers at the end of that prayer when, in unison, they affirmed, "So mote it be."

That response flooded my mind with memories. It reminded me of the many times during my childhood and youth when, in a little country church, I had heard members of the congregation shout "Amen" either in agreement with what had been said or at the end of a prayer. By that loud "Amen," I knew that those folk meant to say, "So may it be!" My first thought was: My Masonic brothers have it all wrong! They are using the wrong word! Instead of saying, "So mote it be!" they should be saying, "So may it be!" In a short time, I learned that, without exception, every prayer in the Lodge, by the chaplain or by anyone else, always ended with all the brothers declaring in unison, "So mote it be."

Intrigued by that odd combination of words, I began to seek more light about them, and my research was interesting, and it was not in vane. I soon discovered that "So mote it be" has a long tradition in Freemasonry. The use of that archaic affirmation goes back several centuries.

"So mote it be!" is "So mot hyt be!" in original Middle English. These are words from an ancient manuscript of obscure origin that is known as the Regius Poem. That manuscript is recognized as the oldest Masonic manuscript in existence, and it is accepted by Masonic scholars as the earliest of what is known as "the Old Charges," a group of ancient manuscripts that explain the legendary and historic beginnings of the craft of Freemasonry and set forth the rules of conduct for members of the craft.

That old poem has been called "a poem of moral duties," and it lays out the responsibilities of a Mason that, it says, is to be "steadfast, trusty and true." But, in all probability, the old poem is best known as the Halliwell Manuscript.

The Regius Poem became known as the Halliwell Manuscript one hundred seventy-seven years ago after James Orchard Halliwell, not a Mason but a distinguished English scholar of the nineteenth century, gave an address entitled "The Early History of Freemasonry in England." Halliwell gave that address before the Royal Society in London at its biennial session in 1838-1839. In that address, Halliwell assigned 1390 A.D. as the date of the origin of the Regius Poem, a date with which most Masonic scholars agree.

The Halliwell Manuscript, or Regius Poem, is now in the King's Library, a part of the British Museum. It is included in a royal collection of books and pamphlets that is recognized as "one of the most important" collections in that library.

Originally written in Middle English on 64 vellum pages, the Regius Poem was composed in rhymed couplets. It is divided into fifteen parts, called points in the old poem, and it consists of 5,358 words that are divided into 794 lines or 397 couplets.

To those who are interested in Masonic history, the Regius Poem offers helpful suggestions about the early beginnings of the craft of Freemasonry. For example, near the beginning, the Regius Poem says that Euclidian geometry, which it defines as "the seventh science...that can separate truth from falsehood," was counterfeited and called masonry. In lines 18 through 24, the poem declares:

> In that time, through good geometry, This honest craft of good masonry Was ordained and made in this manner, Counterfeited of these clerks together; At these lord's prayers they counterfeited geometry, And gave it the name of masonry, For the most honest craft of all.

Whatever else the Regius Poem says about Freemasonry, twice it uses the words "So mote it be" to end a prayer.

Lines 631 and 632 declare:

Grant me the bliss without end; Amen! Amen! So mote it be!

Then, at the end of the poem, lines 793 and 794 declare:

Amen! Amen! So mote it be! So say we all for charity.

The use of "So mote it be!" has been a part of Freemasonry since the beginning of the craft. Therefore, for about 626 years, at the end of every prayer in a Lodge of Freemasonry, loudly and enthusiastically, Masons have, in unison, declared in modified Middle English dialect, "So mote it be!" They do so to express their agreement with, and approval of, the prayer that has been offered to Almighty God who, in Freemasonry is called either the Supreme Architect or the Grand Geometrician of the Universe.

Note: I deeply appreciate the invitation by Grand Master Bumgardner to submit a piece each month during his tenure. Since this is the last, and his last, I thought it would be interesting to look at SO MOTE IT BE.
