AN ENCOURAGING WORD:

Remember and be Grateful?

Wednesday, July 14, 1976 was a solemnly impressive day that will forever be remembered.

With the Koolau Mountains behind us and rows of monkey pod trees around us, we stood in Punch Bowl crater, known to the Hawaiian people as Puowaina, a name that means "the Hill of Sacrifice." A massive series of stairways with eight marble walls called the "Court of the Missing" that contains the names of 18.093 American service men and women who are missing in action carved upon them was beside us. With what appeared to be a sea of white crosses in front of us, we looked across Punch Bowl Cemetery. Known as the Arlington of the Pacific, "about 53,000 World War I, World War II, and Vietnam War veterans and their descendants," including 22 recipients of the Medal of Honor, have been buried there.

After a few well-chosen words, spoken in hushed tones by our guide, there was total silence...and a few tears. Then, after a moment, the guide led us to the edge of that sea of crosses and pointed out two

of them, the first serviceman killed on December 7, 1942 during the infamous attack on Pearl Harbor, and Ernie Pyle, the famed Pulitzer Prize-winning news correspondent of World War II, who was killed by enemy fire on April 18, 1945 during the Battle of Okinawa. From the standpoint of weather, it was a beautiful day in Hawaii, but for a group of American tourists, it was a sad and gloomy day.

Where were you, and what did you do on Veteran's Day? It may be a day of leisure for you, so you probably won't be in Arlington Cemetery, Punch Bowl Crater, or any cemetery anywhere, but you will be somewhere. And wherever you are, you can stop for a moment and remember...

Remember the freedom you enjoy. It is precious, but it is not free. It cost dearly. Many servicemen and women made it possible. Some of them walk by our side every day. But in countless cemeteries around the world, others, many others, have white crosses marking their graves. Remember and be grateful.



The 217th Annual Communication marked the end of Grand Master Cloyd Bumgardner's service on the Homes Board of Directors. William "Bo" Leach's term also ended, as Mike Yount was elected to the board.

During his service as Grand Master, Brother Bumgardner worked with lodges and individuals to raise more than \$18,000 for his Here in Spirit campaign to enhance the worship environment for all residents at Masonic Homes, regardless of faith tradition. The Here in Spirit funds will provide protective coverings for all Chapel windows in Shelbyville, as well as large print Bibles and new communion ware for Masonic Home of Louisville, and audio/visual equipment to display photographs and videos during funeral services.

Grand Master Bumgardner's campaign offered a unique opportunity for Masons to contribute to spiritual programming at Masonic Homes, regardless of where they live, and it inspired gifts from many others throughout Kentucky. Homes Ambassador Ronnie York of Beech Bottom Lodge No. 788 worked with District 22 and other lodges to secure enough money to buy more than 70 large print Bibles for our residents. Scott Lodge No. 702 donated Communion ware to be used during the religious services, presented by District 20 Ambassador Keith Murphy. Louisville's High Twelve Club was among the campaign's contributors, providing \$1,000.

The Homes also recognized Brother Virgil T. Larimore as 2016 Friend of the Homes. Brother Larimore is a Past Master and current Secretary of Lewis Parkland Lodge No. 638, Past Grand Treasurer of The Grand Lodge of Kentucky and Homes Board Member Emeritus. As a board member for more than 30 years, many as treasurer, he offered his expertise in commercial banking and a passion for providing quality care and services to Homes residents. His leadership has a lot to do with the success of where the Homes are today.




