


## Kentucky Masons Make Presentation to Arizona Masons

## A TEMPLE MORE GLORIOUS

During the Masonic journey, every Mason is introduced to the idea that the three columns of Greek architecture---Doric, Ionic, and Corinthian---became symbolic of the pillars of Freemasonry---strength, wisdom, and beauty.

Freemasons were not there; therefore they were unable to work on King Solomon's temple in Jerusalem, and they "no longer build temples and cathedrals of stone." But they do "build spiritual temples of character, temples of upright manhood and integrity." So, they are engaged in an occupation that "is never in their future Masonic life to be discontinued." Therefore, day after day and year after year without ceasing, Freemasons expend their labor for one purpose: to "raise a superstructure perfect in all its parts and honorable to its builder" that is erected upon and supported by the pillars of strength, wisdom, and beauty.

That Masonic labor will lead to the construction of "a temple more glorious than that of Solomon---a temple of honor, of justice, of purity, of knowledge, and of truth."

That temple "shall exist when earth's proudest monumental piles shall have crumbled in dust, and the glory and greatness of earth shall have been forgotten." Then, the Mason who worked upon that temple will have become "an artist instead of a laborer" and his "daily toil" will have become "a joy instead of a task, and (his) life will have become "a blessing and inspiration to (all of) those who come in contact with" him.

To build a temple erected upon the pillars of strength, beauty, and wisdom, it is necessary to follow three simple, but basic, rules: (1). Always remember---and do---one of the first things taught in the Masonic journey: Before any undertaking, large or small, pause and invoke the aid of Deity. (2). After that experience, rise and discern---and faithfully follow---the designs written upon life's trestle board by the Supreme Architect of the Universe. (3). Then, use the tools of Master Mason to shape rough ashlar into perfect ashlar and lay those perfect ashlar in place with care.

An unanticipated \$182,810.50 bequest from the estate of member Brother James Willard Patmor will benefit Masonic Home of Louisville and Masonic Home of Shelbyville. The gift was made known after his estate was settled, and presented during the recent District Three meeting. "This was a wonderful surprise," said Bruce Lott, Vice President of Fraternal Relations, Masonic Homes of Kentucky. "We didn't know about his bequest."

Christopher Damron, current Master of Bigham Lodge 256, provided information on the Patmors: Originally from Marion, Ky., Patmor met his wife, Martha, in Evansville, Indiana. They owned and operated a parts business in Conyers, Georgia. Upon retirement in the late 1980s, they returned to Crittenden County, where he bought a tractor and did custom bush hogging. The Patmors were also both avid gardeners of flowers and vegetables. They were members of the Marion Baptist Church, where he was a deacon. After his wife had to move into a nursing home, he made daily trips there and fed Martha her meals. He continued gardening after her death in April 2014 and passed away at his home. The Patmors did not have children.

"This gift brings to mind the saying 'A rising tide lifts all boats,'" Lott said. "It's a significant help for many people. Gifts like this have a way of being transformative. This will help residents at both locations."


