

To view your Annual Return you will need to log into the system and on your Home page you will find ALERTS on the right of your screen. It will say "Run your Annual Return Report", once you click that it will pull up your Annual Return. You need to look it over and make sure it is correct. If there is something wrong with your report you are required to make the changes yourself. If you find that you cannot make the changes please contact Jamie at the Grand Lodge Office at 502-893-0192. Again your changes have to be made BY JULY 10, 2017. Once the changes are made and they have been approved, run your Annual Return again (*Click on reports then click on Annual Return*) and make

sure that the changes are reflected, once it is correct go to the bottom of the page and click "Testify you return report is accurate". Once this is done, it will send the Grand Lodge Office a notification and will mark your return as done. The amount at the bottom of the page is the amount due for your Annual Return.



Also in attendance was the United States Marine Corps League – Greenbo Detachment #1345 who were on hand to honor the flag and play “Taps” as the flag was being lowered.


The Boy Scouts of America, Troop #165 presented the lodge with the flag, folded and in a display case. Jay Nance, Scout


