MASONIC LIBRARY AND MUSEUM ASSOCIATION COVINGTON SCOTTISH RITE

“I Didn’t Know That.....”

“*Music teaches the art of forming concords*”, as the Seven Liberal Arts section of the Fellowcraft Lecture goes, “*so as to compose a delightful harmony, by a mathematical and proportional arrangement of acute, grave and mixed sounds*”. The “Seven Liberal Arts” has been a part of Masonry well before the first Grand Lodge. Education which was the study of the Liberal Arts during the Middle Ages, became a path to rationalize and understand the universe, the heavens, the divine creation of God; and therefore a prerequisite to understand and get closer to God. “*These be sciences seven, Who useth them well he may have heaven*” (Regius Manuscript circa - 1390).

The seven branches were re-divided into the Trivium and the Quadrivium. The Trivium “a place where three roads meet”, consisted of grammar, rhetoric, and logic, all focused on language. The Quadrivium “a place where four roads meet” consisted of arithmetic, astronomy, geometry and music, or in general, the application of mathematics. In the middle ages, all educated people were expected to be proficient in the Latin language and its three branches of the Trivium. Following several years of schooling, they could go on to study the higher levels of mathematics or Quadrivium. Completing the Trivium was what we would today call a Bachelor’s degree, while completing the Quadrivium would be like a Master of Arts degree. Both were harmonious with the required study of Theology.

Freemasonry’s connection with the ‘Seven Liberal Sciences’ dates back to the polychronicles (see MHJ, March, 2019) which subject matter was used to author the first of the Old Charges, viz: The Regius Manuscript, circa -1390, and the Cooke Manuscript, circa - 1440. They revealed an old legend of two pillars that preserved the ‘secrets’ of the Arts and Sciences through Noah’s Flood.

Some knowledge of the Quadrivium would prove most important to the medieval Freemason. Arithmetic is the oldest and most elementary part of mathematics and certainly used by both Apprentice and Fellow, while medieval Astronomy, could discern the times for planting and harvesting, and the seasons for the best building times. Coming from the heavens, this information was considered divine.

Geometry is concerned with size, shape and position of a structure and was regarded as the sum total of the Seven Liberal Arts. It is more than improbable that operative Masons were taught the actual Seven Liberal Arts. These were reserved for only the very few Universities. Most of the populace was illiterate, including even priests, kings, and nobility. However, Masons built the great medieval cathedrals and needed to learn something of the Quadrivium to do so. Thus some knowledge of Astronomy, Arithmetic, and Geometry was required, and Musical instruments and singing could serve as relaxing exercise to fraternize together as Brothers. This education is what set them apart from other Craftsmen.

By the eighteenth century, Speculative Freemasonry continued to pursue the emphasis on education, with geometry and masonry considered synonymous, while also retaining on to the Seven Liberal Arts, as well as the two pillars. “Let there be Light” became a common phrase in Masonic ritual as it is today.



“*Musik that techitha man the crafte of song in notys and organ & trompe and harp and all othur pteynnyng to hem*”, so states the Cooke Manuscript, Circa - 1440. Music has always important to both the operative and speculative Mason. The singing of songs or playing of musical instruments was a dominant at lodge functions. A study of the Masonic songs is in its self, a study of Masonic culture and more emphasis should be put on this subject. Kentucky’s very first Constitution printed in 1808 lists 23 odes, anthems and songs to sing at lodge meetings. A song “To a Mason’s Health” before the Grand Lodge organized in 1717, later appeared as “The Apprentice Song”.

Masonic Lodges have always been an attractive to musicians; from composers and Brothers Mozart, Bach, and Haydn, to Irving Berlin, Duke Ellington, and March King, John Philip Sousa; from Jazz players W.C. Handy, Dizzy Gillespie, Duke Ellington, to Count Basie, Lionel Hampton, and Paul Robeson; from Jazz singers Al Jolson, and Louis “Satchmo” Armstrong* to ballad singers, Nat King Cole and Burl Ives; from singing cowboys Roy Rogers and Gene Autry to country music stars Roy Acuff, Eddie Arnold, Roy Clark, and Mel Tillis; and our Brother songwriter-singers, Lionel Ritchey, Kris Kristofferson and Brad Paisley. *(some have questioned recently Louis Armstrong’s membership).

Room does not allow a complete list of famous Masonic musicians, but one would be surprised at the well-known Rock Stars that belong to the Fraternity. However, it must be remembered that the singing of Masonic songs at a Masonic Lodge does not require one to be a famous singer, have a great voice or even carry a tune, but does require brothers to join together and celebrate Freemasonry in fellowship and song, sharing the joy of the Lodge with each other. It is sad that this celebration of fellowship is now overlooked by all but a small number of American Lodges.What do you think?
