





“I Didn't Know That.....”

Since receiving many favorable remarks on the partial reprint of the 1965 Committee on Masonic Education Report” (MHJ November 2023 issue), perhaps it is wise to offer the balance of the Report. The first section in the November issue is a clear and concise description of Freemasonry. Part two here shown, sets forth how to properly disseminate quality material and information to the officers and brethren. As it was the previous, this section is taken from Kentucky historian and author John W. Bizzack's new book, *The Canker Worm on the Rose*, but it can also be found in the 1965 Kentucky Grand Lodge Proceedings. The spelling and punctuation in the 'Report' below, is as close as possible to the 1965 original.



COMMITTEE ON MASONIC EDUCATION (Continued)

For such to reach all or a majority of members, the material for teaching must be available to him, and he must be available to receive it.

The first impression is often a lasting one. The early contacts in Masonry are often the ones that can more readily be continued.

To properly present a lasting and strongly-influencing impact on the mind of the new Mason, we can not too strongly urge that all officers and members attempt to present the ritual as perfectly and as seriously as possible; maintaining a dignity that they will be aware of the serious and inspiring side of Masonry; a decorum in the meetings of the lodge, but always to extend a warm feeling of friendliness to make one feel welcome, and a sincere attempt to obtain the participation of all for a more united effort.

During the time the candidate is receiving his degrees, and the instruction in those degrees, he is exposed to the influence of his instructor and the current officers. Majority of candidates manifest a healthy curiosity regarding the teachings of Masonry during that time, asking many questions and demonstrating that he is searching for light and knowledge.

At that time, the instructor and officers can well serve Masonry by being a competent teacher to the new candidates.

For this purpose, of course, it is necessary that those men shall be well informed. The groundwork of increasing Masonic education depends on the study entered into by the candidate, the instructor, the officers, as well as the members.

We visualize certain projects or programs which would aid us all in learning more of Masonry and of imparting the same to others.

Readiness and ability on the part of the officers to answer questions and give information to new Masons; this necessarily requiring study and thought on their part.

Developing a program of Masonic subjects to be discussed at stated meetings, which could be informative and could add to the interest at stated meetings.

Formation of discussion or study clubs in individual lodges.

Encourage discussion of Masonic subjects in HI-12 and related clubs when membership is composed only of Masons in good standing.

Encourage lodge officers to study the “Book of Constitutions”, that they will be better versed in Masonic rules and regulations.

Encourage lodge officers to cause the “Book of Constitution” to be read frequently at lodge meetings to impart the information to the Craft.

Encourage the promotion of “Lodges of Research” to spread Masonic knowledge.

Personal contact with members to promote attendance; to divide responsibilities by appointing others on committees, or degree work, to stimulate co-operation, and to make them aware that they are all important and necessary parts of the lodge.

To develop historical facts relating to individual lodges.

To present historical information relating to our own and other Grand Lodges.

To disseminate Masonic information from other Masonic Journals.

Eventually the problem resolves itself into the procedure of reaching the individual Mason, and we believe that this can be done best through the actions of the officers and personnel of the individual lodges and through study groups, seeking the goal of spreading the teachings of Masonry to the members, that they will so understand Masonry that each in his daily life will be such an example of how a Mason should live, and act, that their light will shine out before the world.

The above report was approved and became very popular among the Craft with many lodges adopting at least part of the report. However, over time interest in the remedy waned, and unfortunately the problem did not resolve itself.



See colorful slides of new, shallow-draft steamboats as they appeared on the river, the armored gunboats of Ulysses S. Price discusses the many ways that Americans have used the river throughout history, and he provides insight on the Army Corps of Engineers' continuing efforts to provide safe, navigable channels and to control major flooding. New "Riverport Authorities" have acquired international status, linking highways, rails, and airports to the river. Complete with maps, charts, portraits and pictures, this slideshow is sure to educate. Price even brings a model "New Orleans boat" for display—a floating warehouse complete with sweeps, livestock, whiskey barrels, "hemp rope", and more. Great for classrooms of all levels, historical societies, museums and book clubs.


