

SEEKING NOMINATIONS

The Annual Meeting of Masonic Homes Kentucky will be held on Monday, Oct. 16, 2023. Five Directors will be elected to serve a three-year term.

To be eligible for election to the office of director, you must be a Kentucky Master Mason. Directors are expected to attend bi-monthly Board meetings every third Wednesday, serve on assigned committees and perform other duties as assigned by the Chair of the Board or Executive Committee. Directors serve without remuneration and must own a Life Membership or Honorary Life Membership (\$250) to Masonic Homes Kentucky. Members are also encouraged to make a contribution to Masonic Homes Masonicare program each year of their service.

To be considered for nomination to the Board of Directors, you must submit a current resume including: name, address, current occupation, phone number, education and work experience, previous board experience, organizational offices held, references and Masonic affiliation and history. Brad Shipp has been making custom “rusty nails” from railroad spikes to present to Lodges when the educational program is presented. Bro. Ed Meredith wrote an original piece that accompanies the program. Below is the text of that original work. *Pictured are Brothers Brad Shipp and Ed Meredith presenting Pewee Valley Lodge’s Worshipful Master Chuck Eiler with a customized rusty nail.*

THE RUSTY NAIL

The nail is most often associated in the Christian tradition with the crucifixion of Christ, and thus symbolizes his passion. The nail also represents the Cosmic Axis, or Axis Mundi, the pillar around which the heavens rotate. The image has also given rise to such expressions as, “to hit the nail on the head,” which means that the thinker has precisely analyzed the issue. This nail in its oxidized state also symbolizes the brothers in your lodge who have toiled in the quarries for betterment of mankind. The oxidation or rust is merely superficial and signifies its interaction with the world within which it operates. Much like the brother in lodge who has taken his solemn oath many years ago, he still has much to offer this ancient and honorable fraternity and his working tools, while rusty, are still functional. Beneath the rust is the tried-and-true steel that binds the timbers of the superstructure of our temples. His passion for the craft need only be tapped into by inquiry. How many of us fail to reach out to those seasoned brothers who have the experience and the knowledge of the workings of the lodge. It is unsurprising as to why they do not feel useful. We have viewed them by their outward appearance, missing the knowledge that lies within. Let this nail remind you and your lodge of the benefit of each and every brother. To remind us of our obligations that we made on that sacred altar and let it reinvigorate our efforts to ignite the passions of those brothers who feel that they have done their time and that their work is finished.



In the early 1950s in Colorado, the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States initiated a program to help children with speech and language disorders. The results obtained from this program led to the establishment of the RiteCare Scottish Rite Childhood Language Program (SRCLP) clinics to provide diagnostic evaluation and treatment of speech and language disorders, as well as learning disabilities.



Today, there are SRCLP clinics, centers and special programs operating or planned for children and therapists located throughout the United States. Each facility is staffed by speech-language pathologists or other trained personnel. Through the support of Scottish Rite Members, these clinics, centers and programs continue to increase.

The value of this philanthropy has long been apparent. Tens of thousands of youngsters across the United States have been helped significantly. With the good work of dedicated clinicians and parents, the Scottish Rite has achieved successes that could only be imagined a few years back. Children who might have remained educationally behind for a lifetime can now talk, read and lead productive lives.

Inquires on age groups and program offerings in specific areas should be addressed to the Director of the local Scottish Rite Facility. Equally important, all services are available regardless of race, creed, or the family's ability to pay.

In the Orient of Kentucky, your Valley has such a program and all monies raised for that program stays in the Valley. These RiteCare programs in your Valley are a 501 (C) (3). Please do you want you can to support this valuable program for our children.



HENRY COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL AFJROTC

The Scottish Rite, Valley of Louisville, were honored to award Cadet Second Lieutenant Skylor Wright the Jack London Supreme Council Award for the Henry County High School Air Force JROTC program. This medal depicts the heraldic logo of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry and the words "JROTC Education and Americanism," which call attention to two of the major focal points of the Scottish Rite.



Why does the Scottish Rite, Valley of Louisville, present the Jack London Supreme Council Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC/JROTC) Medals/Awards to deserving students? Simply said, "few inventions could be more happily calculated to diffuse the knowledge and preserve the memory of illustrious characters and splendid events, than medals." These words, written in 1787, expressed the feelings of our Continental Congress when in March 1776, they instituted the tradition of medals. Medals and awards, whether military or civilian, can recognize bravery or gallantry, heroism, or, in the case of the Jack London Supreme Council ROTC/JROTC medals/awards, "Education and Americanism," which call attention to two of the major focal points of the Scottish Rite.

The Scottish Rite and its members help communities across the nation every day through scholarships, the RiteCare Scottish Rite Childhood

Language Program, the Scottish Rite for Children Hospitals, and the Jack London Supreme Council ROTC/JROTC Medal/Awards Program. Dr. J. Phillip "Jack" London, 33°, was the Executive Chairman and Chairman of the Board of CACI International Inc (NYSE) from 2007 until his death in January 2021. He was a Navy veteran, graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, 33° Scottish Rite Mason a strong advocate for ROTC programs.

The Supreme Council ROTC/JROTC Medals/Awards, named in Jack London's honor, are approved by the Assistant Secretary of Defense and are awarded during the Spring Semester of Jefferson County Schools and the University of Louisville. Any member of the Scottish Rite, Valley of Louisville, can present this award (consisting of a medal, ribbon and certificate) by contacting the Bro. F. Clay Ackiss, Chairman, Scottish Rite ROTC/JROTC Committee.

"I Didn't Know That....."

We have always been proud of the Masonic Library of Covington Scottish Rite. From the beginning, we have taken satisfaction in maintaining a complete Masonic Library, with the latest quality books that Masonic authors had to offer; shelved next to many old time favorites, some well over 100 years old!

Your Library has a good grouping of anti-masonic books and maintains several other volumes that reveal the truth behind this type of publication. The library does not shy away from the fanciful work in so-called Masonic origins, some even written by Masons. All titles are important. We do carry the "25 most important masonic publications written since the millennium," and handle many masonic titles from our Kentucky wordsmiths. Available also for you to read are some very excellent masonic books written by superb authors of the past, including works on Masonic History, Ancient Religions, Paraphernalia, Philosophy, Jurisprudence, women in Masonry and more. This brings us to our "Jewels of the Library."

How many of you have heard of Catherine Sweet, a young lady from Princess Furnace (Princess, KY) in Eastern Kentucky? It seems at the age of 16 years, she was caught by her uncle listening in on a Masonic Lodge meeting, as she had for approximately one year. She was obligated in the three degrees to keep her silent, but barred from attending lodge meetings. She later married B.B. Babbington, later a Mason and had two sons that were Masons. She travelled across several states with her family, talking 'masonic' to any 'bright mason' she met, and occasionally used 'secret signs' to secure assistance when needed. Obviously, Catherine Sweet Babbington is the reason for "lady mason" legends in those several states in which she traveled. Masons believed she was a Mason!

She later died in North Carolina in 1886, where her obituary reads "at the time of her death she was the world's only lady mason." Several years later, her son, J. B. Babbington would write a 50 page booklet, "*Biography of Mrs. Catherine Babbington: The Only Women in the World to become a Blue Lodge Mason.*" We have a rare 'third edition' of his booklet in our library. Read it and decide for yourself.

We also have Robert Freke Gould's original four volume edition of his "*History of freemasonry*", printed in London in 1887, as well as the revised American edition printed in 1936. An ardent Masonic writer, Gould is accepted as one of the first of the 'realistic school.' R. F. Gould

rose to the rank of Grand Sr. Warden of Grand


Lodge of England, and was the second Master of the famous Research Lodge, Quatuor Coronati #2076. He is renowned and referenced by Masonic scholars even today, for his research.

Your library also has one of the most important books ever written for new Master Masons, "*The Builders: A Story and Study of Freemasonry*"

by Rev. Joseph Fort Newton. Although written over 100 years ago, this book is with few exceptions, as pertinent today as it was when it was written in 1914. It is in every sense, a 'jewel' of the library.

A very important book in our hands is the 1870 edition of the Scottish Rite Ritual, "*The Inner Sanctuary Part 1, The Book of the Lodge of Perfection*" containing the 4th thru 14th degrees. It was presented to Delta Lodge of Perfection, Covington, at its inception in 1885. It is signed by Brother Albert Pike 33°. At that time, each Valley was limited to only one such ritual. The book was found in a very rough condition, but 'thank you' to a very generous benefactor, it has now been repaired and completely restored.

Rev. Charles G. Finney (1892-1895), a would be lawyer, who claimed to have been made a Mason early in life, was converted to Christianity and became a Minister. He says the realization came, Freemasonry wasn't for him. From 1824 for about 10 years, he became a somewhat popular, and wrote and printed several sermons. He was also a principal in the "Second Great Crusade" and advised his fellow Ministers, to try "new measures to stir up emotional excitements." He served as the second president of Oberlin College in Ohio (1851 - 1865).




In 1869, no longer a prominent figure, Finney authored "*The Character, Claims and Practical Workings of Freemasonry*," an anti-masonic book. Today, anti-masons point to Finney as confirmation of their abuse, even though the book was printed back in 1869. We do carry this book in our library.

The Library recently obtained an extremely rare copy of "*Freemasons Monitor or Illustrations of Freemasonry*," (circa 1803) by Thomas Smith Webb. This edition is particularly important because it predates Kentucky's "*Masonic Constitutions; or Illustrations of Masonry*" printed in 1808. A comparison study of the two books will hopefully be made soon.

One other book recently procured, is a 'signed' copy of Dan Brown's exciting novel, "*The Lost Symbol*." This is a fun read for sure, but please tell your friend who wants to petition your lodge, that this book is a NOVEL and certainly not the same as your lodge!!But it is still a fun read!!!


