





“I Didn’t Know That.....”

While recently reading *The Canker Worm on the Rose*, the latest book by Kentucky Masonic author John W. Bizzack, I came across the “1965 Committee on Masonic Education Report.” He had included in this book, along with several additional Grand Lodge reports on Kentucky Masonry. The 1965 committee consisted of three Past Grand Masters, Chairman John R. Dawson (1963-64), Albert C. Hanson (1946-47), and Edwin E. Freshney (1950-51). Being an octogenarian, I came to know the high regard the Masons of Kentucky had for each of these three distinguished Past Masters. It was my pleasure to sit in lodge with two of the committee, so this was of a personal interest to me. However, it is the clear and concise description of Freemasonry in the first section of the ‘Report’ that caught my eye. I am sure you will agree that this section says as much about the authors, as it does their description of what Freemasonry truly is. The spelling and punctuation in the ‘Report’ below, is as close as possible to the 1965 original.



In all the ritualistic areas of Masonry, there are many openly and directly declared teachings, but the stimulating challenge of Masonry lies in its hidden meanings, the thoughts behind the words, the philosophy hinted or suggested, which to truly comprehend, requires much study and silent reflection.

Masonry teaches a way of life, guide to our footsteps that will lead to a better awareness of a future life, and preparedness for that existence; a guidepost for our attitude toward our fellowmen, and above all a beacon to follow in our own lives, that we may better comprehend our duty to God, our fellowmen, and ourselves. We realize that many men who enter into Masonry are enthused and appreciative of its sublime doctrines, but are never active in participation.

Others are perhaps more active, but not inclined to study and delve into the hidden recesses the more obscure phases of its philosophy.

We are faced with the consideration of how all Masons could be reached to better understand as much as possible, what Masonry truly is and the great capabilities which could be possible.

We realize the great field of Masonic Education that is around and about us all. To truly spread Masonic knowledge, we would have to reach the common man. Can this be done through individual contact, through individual lodges, through Masonic publications?

For such to reach the majority of members, the material for teaching must be available to him, and he must be able to receive it.

COMMITTEE ON MASONIC EDUCATION

Past Grand Master John E. Dawson (808), Chairman, presented the report which was approved.

When we consider the subject of Masonic education, we might first reflect on the subject of what Freemason really is, what it teaches, and what are the goals of Freemasonry and Free Masons.

Freemasonry is a society or association of men, united together with certain bonds of interest and certain beliefs.

It is an organization which expects to welcome good men, and through its influence, to make them better men.

It unites men on a common level, and teaches the principle of universal brotherhood.

Membership is permitted only to those who have a sincere belief in one God, the Creator of all, and the realization that all men are children alike of one Father and members of one family.

The Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons is the oldest of all existing institutions or fraternities, and it continued its existence through the centuries, not merely because of the opportunity for men to promote pleasant associations and satisfy their gregarious tendencies, but because Masonry offers the opportunity for study and philosophical considerations; for reflections concerning life, mankind, and the origin of creation.


