

“I Didn’t Know That.....”

PART FOUR – LAFAYETTE

The Trustees of Lexington and government officials, the Masonic establishment and the public were extremely proud of the social and patriotic activities they had successfully provided for Marquis de Lafayette’s visit. Lexington’s display honoring the Marquis was unsurpassed across the nation. It was thoroughly reported in a remarkable degree, on the front pages of Lexington’s *The Kentucky Gazette*. In addition, front page spreads by the *Louisville Public Advertiser*, *Argus of Western America* (Frankfort), *Western Citizen* (Paris) and the *Maysville Eagle*, reviewed the activities of the “Nation’s Guest” while in Kentucky.

Upon the Marquis and his companions leaving Lexington (May 18, 1825) many friends and dignitaries returned home to their respective states. Kentucky Governor Desha and a large group of Lexington citizens would continue along the Marquis’ travels to Cincinnati, Ohio. The ensemble would stop at the then small village of Shelbyville at Lafayette’s request, to visit Masonic brother U.S. Senator Colonel Richard Johnson (later Vice President of United States). The Senator provided a banquet in his honor and the night’s lodging. Not to be outdone by Lexington’s huge “castellated cake” a 500 lb. cheese was presented at the banquet.

The next day Lafayette and attendants headed towards Cincinnati, stopping at Covington around noon, possibly spending the night in that then small village of approximate 700 in population. Lafayette’s secretary Levasseur, notes in his diary of taking three boats across the Ohio River with fellow Kentuckians and arriving in Cincinnati at the foot of Broadway. Losantiville was renamed Cincinnati by the Major General Arthur St. Clair, Governor of Northwest Territory and President of the *Pennsylvania State Society of Cincinnati*, and therefore of great interest to Lafayette. A large contingent of Kentuckians also attended the recognition ceremonies and honors for Lafayette held in Cincinnati.

On the twenty-first of May around midnight, the Marquis and party boarded the river steamer *Herald*. Now back on the Ohio River in Kentucky territory, he made his way to Maysville, stopping there for lunch for two hours before continuing on to Pittsburgh. Maysville was an important shipping destination. *“History of Kentucky”* written by Judge Lewis Collins and revised by R. H. Collins states, that on May 21st, “Gen. Lafayette and his son, Col. George Washington Lafayette and the Governor of Ohio, reached Maysville on the Steamer Herald. There followed enthusiastic reception and ovation.” Judge Lewis Collins gave a full account in *The Maysville Eagle* of the visit, which included a procession and an interview with former Revolutionary soldiers, in what was described as ‘deeply emotional’ for both the Marquis and the old soldiers. *The Maysville Eagle* also included



an article on Lafayette’s heroic effort in the Revolutionary War and his being wounded at the “Battle of Brandywine.” He officially left Kentucky borders after passing the mouth of the Big Sandy on May 22, 1825.

That September 9th, Lafayette sailed for home from New York for France. Oddly the ship was named the *Brandywine*. The ship carried American soil for when Lafayette would pass away he would be laid on American soil. Lafayette expired on May 20, 1834, and was laid to rest on that American soil in Paris, France. Throughout the world funeral honors were paid to him. But news travels slowly and Kentucky first learned about his death about the end of June. On June 30, Lexington Royal Arch Chapter resolved to meet on July 26, 1834 and “perform the usual Solemnities of Funeral Rites in a Public Procession and that Henry Clay Jr., be appointed to deliver a funeral discourse on the occasion.” The Resolution went on to “invite all Chapters, Lodges, and brothers, together with the militia, the Clergy, and the State and County officers and all citizens to attend.... and the committee to fire minute guns and have the bells of the city tolled.....”

The announcement of Lafayette’s death in the Kentucky press was noted in the *Lexington Observer* on July 2nd adding “the death of this apostle of Liberty has indeed left a space that cannot be filled....” An announcement by Lexington Royal Arch Chapter concerning the planned memorial also appeared in the same edition. The Royal Arch Chapter then printed a circular which appeared in the same paper, outlining the time and place of the proposed procession. It was also sent to the members of the County Court with an invitation, to join the memorial service. The Lexington City Council would also fully participate. Thirty-nine units joined in the procession, meeting at 9:00 am at five locations, with five Assistant Marshalls, under the direction of Brother John M. Calla, Marshall of the Day. The one hour march began at 10:00 am with bells tolling and guns fired on the half hour. Ceremonies would last until one o’clock, and refreshments were then served at the Masonic Hall. The Masons were well represented. The July 30th *Lexington Reporter*, gave a complete review of the day.

Daniel Bradford, Chairman of the Lexington Royal Arch Chapter Committee, presented a full report at the August 2nd meeting. It was then agreed to write a letter of condolences to George Washington Lafayette and send it with the newspaper clippings of the Lexington activities, concerning his father’s death. Thank you letters were also written to those societies and groups who participated in the procession and service. One worth noting reads: “RESOLVED, That the Revolutionary veterans who officiated as Pall Bearers and marched on foot in the midst of dust and under a burning sun,

three miles, without refreshments of any kind, on the occasion of paying funeral honors to Lafayette, deserve the especial thanks of this Chapter, and that a copy of this resolution be furnished to each of them. Their ages averaged 76 years.”

Louisville also held ceremonies similar to those held in Lexington. Located on the Ohio River, Louisville had grown rapidly in population and was by 1834, considered the metropolis of Kentucky. Their procession was at that time, the longest ever in the city, all trades and professions were represented; the shops were closed, and those who participated were asked to wear armbands for 30 days. A eulogy was delivered by Mr. M.R. Wiggington. In 1852, historian Ben Cassidy in his *“History of Louisville”* wrote: “The whole proceedings of the day were highly creditable to the city, and highly worthy of the occasion.”

Perhaps President John Quincy Adams on September 7, 1825, in an address to Lafayette just before his return to France, said it best: “We shall look upon you always as belonging to us, during the whole of our life, and belonging to our children after us. You are ours by that more than patriotic self-devotion with which you flew to the aid of our fathers at the crisis of our fate; ours by that unshaken gratitude for your service which is a precious portion of our inheritance; ours by the tie of love, stronger than death, which has linked your name for the endless ages of time with the name of Washington.”




