

SEEKING NOMINATIONS

The Annual Meeting of Masonic Homes Kentucky will be held on Monday, Oct. 21, 2024. Five Directors will be elected to serve a three-year term.

Directors are expected to attend bi-monthly Board meetings every third Wednesday, serve on assigned committees and perform other duties as assigned by the Chair of the Board or Executive Committee. 



Fellowship is the Keystone of Masonry. Beyond all the symbols, lessons, degrees, programs and activities, what is it that speaks deepest to the very heart of us? Fellowship, within a Brotherhood of Man, and under the Fatherhood of God.

I recently came across a small book that brought this realization to my mind.

Ill. John Henry Cowles, 33°, who lived from 1863-1954, was installed as Master of Louisville Lodge No. 400 in 1892 and served for 4 consecutive years; Past Grand Master of Kentucky, 1909-1910; Sovereign Grand Inspector of the Orient of Kentucky from 1909-1912; and served as the Sovereign Grand Commander of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction from 1921-1952. During this thirty year term of office he traveled the world representing the Scottish Rite, and became known as its "Ambassador". He was honored throughout the world, and received many tokens of appreciation and honor during his travels, many of which are on display in the House of the Temple of the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite in Washington, D.C.

One such token of appreciation was a small book, of just eight pages in length, presented to him in 1917. Although its size and length are minute, the depth and power of the Masonic message it contains is as powerful today as it was 107 years ago.

This small book was presented to Brother Cowles by Ill. Gene T. Skinkle, 33°, in Chicago, Illinois. Brother Skinkle handwrote this presentation inscription inside the book:

Ill. John H. Cowles, 33°, Washington, D.C.

Dear Friend:

As a partial expression of my appreciation of your never failing kindness and courtesy to me and mine permit me to tender to you the sentiment herein, so beautifully expressed by my dear old friend, Wilbur D. Nesbit, and to assure you that to you this sentiment goes many times multiplied.

Fraternally yours, Gene T. Skinkle, 33° Chicago, September 28, 1917

I hope that its message speaks to you as it did to me, and that it brings you again, and often, to sit in lodge with your brethren, of whom I hope to be numbered. Randolph Starks, 33°, Secretary Registrar, Valley of Louisville Scottish Rite

(Wilbur D. Nesbit)

There is a saying filled with cheer, Which calls a man to fellow-ship, It means as much for him to hear As lies within the brother-grip. Nay, more! It opens wide the way To friendliness sincere and true; There are no strangers when you say To me: "I sat in lodge with you."

When that is said, then I am known;
There is no questioning nor doubt;
I need not walk my path alone
Nor from my fellows be shut out.
Those words hold all of brotherhood
And help me face the world anew -

There's something deep and rich and good In this: "I sat in lodge with you."

Though in far lands one needs must roam, By sea and shore and hill and plain, Those words bring him a touch of home And lighten tasks that seem in vain, Men's faces are no longer strange But seem as those he always knew When someone brings the joyous change With his: "I sat in lodge with you."

So you, my brother, now and then Have often put me in your debt By showing forth to other men That you your friends do not forget.

When all the world seems gray and cold

And I am weary, worn and blue,

Then comes this golden thought I hold
You said: "I sat in lodge with you."

When to the last great Lodge you fare
My prayer is that I may be
One of your friends who wait you there,
Intent your smiling face to see.
We, with the warder at the gate,
Will have a pleasant task to do;
We'll call, though you come soon or late:
"Come in! We sat in lodge with you!"

MASONIC LIBRARY AND MUSEUM ASSOCIATION
COVINGTON SCOTTISH RITE
"I Didn't Know That....."

According to Kentucky Masonic historian Charles Snow Guthrie, "Kentucky Freemasonry 1788-1978" Cryptic Masonry came to Kentucky with the organization of Royal & Select Master Council in Lexington, on November 3, 1816, by popular Masonic lecturer Jeremy L. Cross. Cross would also organize Shelbyville Council on January 15, 1817. On December 10, 1827, six Kentucky Councils met at Frankfort to form the Grand Council of Kentucky viz: Washington (Lexington), Warren (Hopkinsville), Centre (Danville), Louisville, Frankfort and Versailles. The General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International would not be formed until August 25, 1880.

Both the Royal and Select Master Degrees are jam packed with meaningful information for the Mason, explaining the details of the manner in which the "lost word" of the Master Mason was preserved in a vault beneath the Sanctum Sanctorum of King Solomon's Temple as described in the Select Master. The Royal Master recounts the events leading up to the preservation immediately before and then after the death of HAB. These degrees run about 25 minutes each and both can be conferred back to back, including the opening and closing, easily within an hour. The high quality of these degrees, make them most desirable.

The origin of the two degrees is truly unknown beginning with theories varying from Stewart Masonry, Germany, France, Jamaica, and the United States, including the Scottish Rite. The Scottish Rite did confer both the degrees to honor certain brethren, but it is doubtful that they created the degrees. The 'Select Master of 27' is believed by some to have been conferred in Europe as early as 1767, while the Royal Master may have been created around 1810, possibly in New York. Jeremy Cross is no doubt responsible for putting the two degrees together and conferring them, while serving as Grand Lecturer for the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons for several states. Rob Morris, Past Grand Master of Kentucky, is credited with categorizing the Royal and Select Masters degrees under the classification of "Cryptic Rite."

The third degree of the Council, the Super Excellent Master, is not "cryptic" at all, but may be considered an expansion of the Royal Arch degree. It is considered by many to be a ceremony rather than a degree and is honorary. It is not required for one to take the degree to be part of a Council of Royal & Select Masters or even to hold office. According to historian Albert G. Macke, the three act dramatic Masonic legend, "refers to the circumstances which occurred on the last day of the siege of Jerusalem by Nebuzaradan, the Captain of the Chaldean army, who had been sent by Nebuchadnezzar to destroy the city and temple, as a just punishment of the Jewish King Zedekiah for his perfidy and rebellion." The officers section, before and after the drama is equally impressive, particularly the explanation of the square, triangle and

circle, the emblems of the degree. It is certainly the most dramatic degree in any Masonic system.

Confusion not only surrounded the origin of the Royal and Select Master degrees, but active discussion continued on whether the degrees should be conferred in a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, or independently; should the Select Master degree proceed or follow the Royal Master; should the Super Excellent Master degree be included; and should the degrees be limited to Royal Arch Masons or conferred on Master Masons? It seems everyone had an opinion. In addition Councils of unknown authority existed side by side, with some members belonging to as many as three Councils, each under different persuasions. All the above is thoroughly described in "Coil's Masonic Encyclopedia." The arguments for and against the various positions are noted in "The History of Cryptic Masonry, Volume 1," coauthored by scholars Eugene E. Hinman, Ray V. Denslow and Charles C. Hunt. The founding of the "General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International" in 1880 seemed to solve many of these problems.

Today, in the United States, only Virginia and West Virginia, still confer the Royal and Select Master degrees under the Royal Arch Chapter umbrella, but in the following order. First, they confer the Mark Master – an extension of the Fellowcraft, and then the 'virtual' Past Master, both are symbolic lodge degrees; then the Select Master and Royal Master – chronologically correct; followed by the Most Excellent Master - featuring the completion and dedication of the King Solomon's Temple. Climaxing these degrees is the Holy Royal Arch where 'that which was lost is found,' and richly capped by a detailed display of the destruction of the Jerusalem and the Temple, through the Super Excellent Master degree – as was stated in the Royal Arch. The business of the Chapter is conducted in the Royal Ach degree.

The Virginia and West Virginia system appears to be an excellent manner to confer the York Rite degrees, but then again, it could prove a burden to confer all seven degrees in a small Royal Arch Chapter whose membership is usually less than one-half of that of the lodge where they meet. It seems to be best to stay with two bodies, Chapter and Council, and dividing the degrees between them.
