



In the early 1950's, the Orient of Colorado was searching for a charity to assist the citizens of their State. The Search Committee can back with the suggestion of creating a Foundation to grant funds to pre-school children who were under the care of local Speech Pathology Clinics. This program was extremely successful by assisting children's language issues whom may not have had the resources to apply for treatment.

The Foundation in Colorado caught the attention of the Supreme Council of the Southern Jurisdiction and the rest in history. Every Orient of our Scottish Rite now has Speech Pathology Clinics to assist children that cannot pay for their treatment. Thus, the RiteCare Program was instituted throughout the Southern Jurisdiction.

Can you imagine hearing your child or grandchild say Mommy or Daddy or Mamaw or Papaw for the first time. Brethren, that should register with you on the highest scale.

In the Orient of Kentucky, we are very fortunate to have four RiteCare Foundations in each of our 4 Consistories. If you or someone you know as a child between the ages of 2 to 5 that need assistance, please contact your Consistory Office for more information.

Why does the Scottish Rite, Orient of Kentucky, Valley of Louisville, present the Jack London Supreme Council ROTC/JROTC Award to deserving students?

Simply said, "...few inventions could be more happily calculated to diffuse the knowledge and preserve the memory of illustrious characters and splendid events, than medals". These words, written in 1787, expressed the feelings of our Continental Congress when they instituted the tradition of medals. Medals can recognize bravery or gallantry, heroism or, in the case of the Jack London Supreme Council Awards - Education and Americanism - which call attention to two of the major focal points of the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry.

The Scottish Rite and its Members help communities across the nation every day through scholarships, The RiteCare Childhood Language Program and the Jack London Supreme Council ROTC/JROTC Awards Program. Dr. J. Phillip "Jack" London, 33 Degree, was the Executive Chairman & Chairman of the Board of CACI International, Inc., from

2007 until his death in January 2021. He was a NAVY Veteran, graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy and a strong advocate for ROTC/JROTC programs in schools.

This program, named in Jack London's honor, is approved by the Assistant Secretary of Defense and is awarded during the Spring Semester of Jefferson County Schools and the University of Louisville.

“I Didn’t Know That.....”

PART TWO – LOUISVILLE

The Marquis de Lafayette, his personal secretary, Andre-Nicolas (Augustus) Levasseur and son, George Washington Lafayette, his groom and a family friend had arrived in New York on August 15, 2024, left for Boston the following week, visiting most of New England before leaving for Philadelphia, and circling back through Richmond for a short visit with old friends Thomas Jefferson at Monticello and then James Madison in Montpelier. Virginia was a place that the Marquis loved. He had even named one of his daughters Marie Antoinette Virginie Lafayette in the state’s honor, as he had named his son, George Washington Lafayette in honor of his great friend and father figure. He spent much time in the Virginia/Washington circuit before heading south through the coastal states and then west to Montgomery, Alabama and onto New Orleans. Lafayette and his crew would then travel north on the Mississippi River, stopping for a visit at St. Louis and entering the mouth of the Ohio River to enter Kentucky territory passing Paducah and then onward, traveling the Cumberland River to Nashville, for a visit with future President and PGM Andrew Jackson, and while there, attending the Grand Lodge of Tennessee.

Everywhere that Lafayette had travelled, he had been met with much flourish and fanfare, and at last, after nine months the Marquis would be received by the State of Kentucky with a reception for *the ‘hero of two countries.’* Unfortunately, the beginning of his Kentucky visit would wait one more day, as the steamboat *Mechanic* coming from Tennessee would sink, leaving all aboard stranded on the shore. It was a harrowing experience for all, especially Levasseur who after making sure Lafayette was safely on shore, returned by skiff on several trips, to the sinking *Mechanic* to hunt for Lafayette’s son George, his traveling companion M. de Syon and his groom Bastion, while also rescuing many other passengers. Fortunately, no one was harmed and while breakfasting the next morning on venison, the event could be joked about. The steamer *Paragon* soon arrived and the owner ordered the captain to return to Louisville, so Lafayette and company could safely arrive at their destination. The whole event is detailed in Levasseur’s journal and made front page news in the *Louisville Public Advertiser*.

At last, on May 11, 1825, Lafayette and company arrived. Brother and Governor Joseph Desha had previously appointed an arrangements committee consisting of thirteen members, about half of whom were masons and from this group, a reception committee of six, of which five were known to be masons. Certainly many Kentucky officials were masons. In addition to the Masonic Fraternity, Lafayette was partial to the patriotic Society of Cincinnatus, both organizations he loved and shared membership. On Lafayette’s landing, appropriate welcoming speeches and responses were given and followed by a parade consisting of the Lafayette Calvary (Lexington); the Light Infantry; Committee on Arrangements; Lafayette and old friend Colonel Richard Clough Anderson (first Master of Lexington Lodge, member of Society of Cincinnatus, and Revolutionary war hero) in a carriage drawn by four horses; Lafayette’s suite in carriages; officers and soldiers of the Revolution; cavalcade of officers; citizens in carriages; and a cavalcade of citizens. Twelve Marshalls interspersed the groups. 10,000

people attended the event, more than Louisville’s population. It had been forty years since Colonel Anderson and the Marquis had seen each other, and upon meeting again, it is said they embraced and kissed each other in true brotherly love.

The two lodges in Louisville, Abraham #8 and Clark #51 joined forces to hold a reception beginning at 5:00 pm that evening at the hall of Clark Lodge with over 100 attending including visitors from Indiana, Ohio, Rhode and New York. Both the Marquis and son George attended, accompanied by members of the committee. They were welcomed into the lodge meeting by Brother the Reverend H.M. Shaw and the Marquis then replied. Later that same evening, a ball was held at Washington Hall (2nd and Main Streets) with 350 in attendance, including Masonic Governors Duval (Florida) and Ray (Indiana). The next day Lafayette spent most of his time at a circus in Indiana returning to Louisville that evening in time to attend the theatre.

On May 13, Lafayette and his companions left for Frankfort, spending the night in Shelbyville, and arriving at Frankfort to a welcome of artillery fire and a large crowd of officials, military, and the public. Masonic Brother and Governor Desha received Lafayette in the state capital with a welcoming oration to which Lafayette replied. That evening Lafayette attended “the most famous meal ever served in Kentucky” attended by approximately 700 people and held in the Frankfort Public Square. Kentucky historian Charles Snow Guthrie reports “Thirteen toasts were drunk and nineteen speeches made by various dignitaries. A ball at the Weisiger Tavern followed.”

Lafayette and staff left for Lexington Sunday, May 15th, stopping for lunch just outside of Versailles and then proceeding to Major John Keen’s home (Keeneland), about five miles outside of Lexington. Masonic Brother and hero of the War of 1812, General Leslie Combs welcomed the group to Lafayette County. The Lexington Board of Trustees had hoped to hold the ‘official welcoming to Kentucky’ for Lafayette, as the county was named for him when Kentucky separated as a new state from Virginia. The Trustees appointed T.M. Hickley and John M. McCalla (Master of Lexington #1 and future Grand Master), a committee to make the request to Governor Desha. Lexington was home to Transylvania University, the first Masonic Lodge, and the Grand Lodge of Kentucky which had its new quarters, the Grand Hall, nearly complete. The state capital winning out, the Lexington Trustees appointed a “Fayette Committee.” This committee would arrange “the most impressive Masonic ceremonies of his Kentucky visit.”

August 3, 1956, President Eisenhower signed a bill to pay tribute to the fallen unknown soldiers of the Korean War and World War II, by interring them with honors in a specially designated area in Arlington National Cemetery. The first ceremony was actually held in Arlington in 1921 for an American unknown who died in Europe during WWI. Soldiers were first assigned to guard the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier in 1926. In 1937, the guards became a 24/7 presence, standing watch over the Unknown Soldier at all times.




