GRAND MASTER'S MESSAGE

Driving to and from masonic functions across our state, I am often confronted with scenes of both intrigue and concern. Recently, on a drive home late one night, Ada and I noticed a car sitting on the shoulder of the highway with a state police cruiser parked behind it. With the lights brightly flashing, the officer administered a field sobriety test to the operator of the motor vehicle. The officer that evening, like each of us, understood the necessity of operating the vehicle soberly. To do otherwise exposes both the driver and the wider public to potentially irreparable harm.

Late in the summer of 2023, as I sat with the incoming Worthy Matron of our local Eastern Star Chapter planning her installation, my stepmother called with gut-wrenching news. While driving home from pharmacy school, Ada, who was eight months pregnant at the time, had been struck by an oncoming car. The driver of the other car was so intoxicated a field sobriety test could not be administered at the scene. Intemperance in this situation could have easily ended the life of not only my wife, but also my unborn daughter.

We, as Freemasons, should be mindful of the lessons taught by the unfortunate circumstances of the driver along the highway, as well as the incident involving my wife and daughter. Temperance, one of the four cardinal virtues, is presented to us very early in our masonic journey. It is described as the “due restraint upon our affections and passions, which renders the body tame and governable, and frees the mind from the allurements of vice.” As we go about each day, it is important that we keep the components of our lives in their proper lanes. Too much of anything produces harmful effects. A good friend and brother of mine often reminds me of the importance of balance in life, and the lessons of the twenty-four-inch gauge. Excess in one area creates deleterious effects in another. Life should not be all work, but neither is it all play. We must soberly walk through the stages of life, and live in a manner that accounts for not only our duties as employees, husbands, fathers, and masons, but also honors our creator and respects ourselves.

Freemasonry, admirable though it is, should not infringe upon our duties with respect to the other aspects of life. Although I strongly encourage our Brothers to become and remain active in their lodges, in particular, and wider Freemasonry, as a whole, we should always guard against letting ourselves become bogged down with masonic duties to the point it creates harmful effects for our relationship with our Creator and family, or strains our position at work.

In short, even in regards to Freemasonry, we should remain temperate. To enjoy is encouraged, to overindulge is not. What good can we be for Freemasonry if we fail to practice it soberly? No dinner, no event, no degree is so important that we should feel pressured to act in a way that neglects our other duties throughout life.

May each of you embark upon the new year with the continued blessings of the Grand Architect of the Universe. When you encounter the flashing lights of a police cruiser, or any other emergency vehicle, take the opportunity to reflect. Are you properly balancing your life? Are you allowing duties in one area to negatively affect another? Faith, family, fraternity, work – each of these require our continued attention and devotion if we wish them to be successful. Make use of the gavel and continue refine your ashlar. Remember Brothers, with time, patience, and perseverance we shall accomplish all things!

GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

My Brothers,

I hope that each of you have had a Merry Christmas and are off to a great new year. This month I chose to highlight Most Worshipful Joseph Hamilton Daviess, Past Grand Master, who was elected Grand Master in 1811. Most Worshipful Brother Daviess was only in office a few short months before being killed in action at the Battle of Tippecanoe. His belongings were returned to the Grand Lodge upon his death, including a beautiful sword that we still have in our archives today. Included below is his biography, as recorded in the "Doings of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky 1800-1900" by H.B. Grant.

"Joseph Hamilton Daviess was born in Bedford County, Virginia on March 4, 1774, and came with his family to Kentucky in 1779, and settled near Danville. He attended school at Harrodsburg, studied Greek and had a remarkable talent for declamation. In 1792 he became a mounted volunteer, assigned to guarding transportation of provisions to the forts north of the Ohio River. This is where he had his first fight with Indians, and, with reckless courage, recaptured his own horse under a shower of bullets. On his return, he studied law and became as distinguished at the bar as any in history. He entered into the practice of law in Danville, removed to Frankfort, and was the first western lawyer to appear as counsel in the Supreme Court of the United States, where, it is said, being dressed in the buckskin suit of "The Wild West," he did not meet with attention until he spoke. Then the profound impression made upon the court and attendant counsel was marked. He married Anne Marshall in 1803, a sister of Chief Justice John Marshall, and moved to Lexington in 1809. He had few equals as an orator, and his associates, who had listened to Clay, said of him that he was the most impressive speaker they ever heard.

Daviess County, Kentucky and Daviess Lodge No. 22 (now defunct) were named in honor of him.

He prosecuted Aaron Burr at Frankfort for treasonable conspiracy, in which he opposed Henry Clay, as counsel for Burr, which a contemporary referred to as a "splendid intellectual combat."

As Grand Master he visited the lodge at Vincennes, Indiana, then under his jurisdiction, on his way to join Gen. William Henry Harrison, and participated in the Battle of Tippecanoe, where he lost his life in most courageously gallant action while in command of Kentucky troops.

At Tippecanoe, Daviess was ordered to dislodge the enemy with his dragoons. In his official report, Gen. Harrison said: "The Major's gallantry determined him to execute the order with a smaller force than was sufficient. He joined me as a private volunteer, and, on recommendation of the officers of that corps, was appointed to command the three troops of dragoons. His conduct in that capacity justified the choice. Never was there an officer possessed of more ardor and zeal in the discharge of his duties with propriety, and never one who would have encountered greater danger to purchase military fame."

Most Worshipful Brother Daviess was buried beneath the tree where he died. His sword and sheath were encased in a wooden box crafted from the same tree. This sword is used today on ceremonial occasions by the Grand Sword Bearer and serves as the Grand Sword of State of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, F. & A.M.

“I Didn’t Know That.....”


As a new year begins, possibly it is the right time to think about our newest members that recently entered the fraternity. In receiving the beautiful ceremonies and lectures of the three degrees, many questions naturally arise that should be answered and explained by his instructor in the classes that follow. The memorization of the catechism in his studies has at least three benefits. It is important in that the acquired knowledge may be required for the new brother to visit another lodge; secondly, it preserves the ritual to be communicated to future masons and thirdly, it allows one to one to know and review the Masonic lessons mentally, as he first observed in the ceremonies, thus imprinting upon the mind the wise and serious truths that were only partially remembered or comprehended. Fortunately, memorizing words has a good effect on the mind, but it is best when put into effect.

A trio of new Fellowcraft brothers visited the library one evening and I began looking for some appropriate Grand Lodge pamphlets (currently out of print) designed to help new 1st and 2nd degree members understand Freemasonry and to answer their questions about the Entered Apprentice and the Fellowcraft degrees. A friend and brother working with me joined in the discussion. My colleague advised that the Entered Apprentice should “daily make use of the lessons taught by the working tools until they were perfected.” He went on to say that the important lesson taught by the 24 inch gauge is the management of one’s time, allowing enough time for prayer and the practice good works, time for his profession, and time to enjoy proper refreshment and sleep. The lesson of the common gavel is to divest his thought process from unnecessary contemplation, thus clearing his mind to concentrate on his important needs. By practicing these two lessons daily, managing time and keeping one’s mind clear and not overloaded, will improve anyone’s life to a large degree.

Assuming the lessons of the Entered Apprentice working tools are well learned and practiced, upon receiving the Fellowcraft degree, the new craftsman should practice daily be an upright man, in both God’s eyes and his fellow man, dealing squarely in business or agreements, and remembering that our time on earth is temporary and we should prepare ourselves for that “undiscovered country.”

My learned brother did not elaborate on the Master Mason’s working tools as that was reserved for his lodge, but certainly all the tools previously mentioned should not be forgotten and be continuously practiced, in addition to the exercise of spreading brotherly love which is the tool that molds us into a “sacred band of brothers.”

I found my comrade’s remarks intriguing and thought provoking on several levels. There are many other parts of our ceremonies other than the working tools, that a newly made Mason should contemplate and put into practice: Faith, Hope and Charity; Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence and Justice; white lambskin apron; point within a circle, three Great Lights and three Lessor Lights, wisdom, strength and beauty, to name a few found in the Entered Apprentice degree. We know the words. We know the meaning. We know the importance of incorporating these lessons into our daily lives. Every Master Mason is somewhat a better person because of just passing through the ceremonies. It is what helps us to be a better husband, better fathers, better friends and brothers. All brothers should be cognizant of these truths. All brothers should make a concerted effort to include them their daily lives and improve themselves in Masonry. If we taught our new brothers to practise this, they would



not only be better Masons, but would likewise be teaching future Masons the same. After all, we came here “to learn” and “improve ourselves in Masonry.” My library co-worker was indeed wise in his remarks.

It may be somewhat disappointing to the newly raised Master Mason who came to the lodge to learn all about Freemasonry and how to improve himself as a Freemason, to learn that he is now on his own. Although some lodges do have educational meetings and guest speakers, most lodges rarely do anything in education unless required by the Grand Lodge.

Besides their proficiency, lodges are quick to teach a brother how to hold a staff, the proper way to conduct a candidate, dress code of officers/ members, when to give the signs, the correct knocks at the door, etc. These are what I call *ritual education* and should be learned. But for *Masonic education*, there are thousands of books on the Masonic Order a new brother can read, from history, to philosophy, to officers’ duties, to anti-masonic books, to research lodge publications, to state of Masonry, to women Masons (yes! you heard right), to famous Masons, to Masonic jurisprudence, to Masonry in other countries, to Annual Grand Lodge Proceedings, to esoteric Masonry, and on and on. These are designed to help you “to learn to improve yourself in Masonry.”

Having worked at the Covington Masonic Library for a number of years, I do have a few books to recommend to newly made Master Masons, viz: “*Freemasonry for Dummies*” authored by Christopher Hodapp gives a no-nonsense overview of Freemasonry in an uncomplicated read, that easily be laid down and picked up again; “*A Comprehensive View of Freemasonry*” or “*Freemasonry through Six Centuries*” both books by Henry W. Coil give an outstanding history of Freemasonry by a well-informed author; or my favorite recommendation for new Masons “*The Builders: The Story and Study of Masonry*” authored by Rev. Joseph Fort Newton. This book is written over 100 years ago. It is still relevant today and remains one of the most important Masonic books of all time. It is well written and an easy read. Of course there are much more titles, suitable to the new Mason.

One may also consider visiting one or more the six Lodges of research chartered by the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, the oldest *William O. Ware Lodge of Research* meets at the Phoenix Lodge in Walton, is internationally known and nationally respected for their outstanding presentations, their participation in bringing top Masonic speakers and well known authors to speak in Kentucky as well as their book reviews on their popular website. Possibly loser to you are *Ted Adams LOR* which meets in Lowmansville, *Marlin White LOR* meets in Cave City, *Henry Bannister Grant LOR* meets in Booneville, *Pickett Wilhelm LOR* meets in Paducah and *Hiram Bassett LOR* meets in Somerset. Check out their web site. You do not need to join these lodges, as you can visit any Research Lodge, the same as any lodge, but it is wise to let them know you are coming.




