



GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

KENTUCKY'S ROLE IN THE EXPANSION OF FREEMASONRY (PART I)

Kentucky was the pioneer western state in the spread of Freemasonry. After the reorganization of that institution in England in the eighteenth century, it spread in its modern form to the American colonies and from Virginia into Kentucky. Kentucky had some of the earliest explorers and military men who were members of the fraternity. She likewise had the first lodge established west of the Appalachian Mountains and the first Grand Lodge in the same area. Following this, the Grand Lodge of Kentucky helped the seeds of Masonry in nine other states in addition to Kentucky.

Freemasonry is supposed to have grown out of the medieval stonemasons' lodges which gradually began to admit other men who were attracted by the symbolism, philosophy, and fellowship of these organizations. Originally, these individual lodges were independent. However, on St. John the Baptist's Day, June 24, 1717, four of these lodges in London organized the Grand Lodge of England. This Grand Lodge began to charter lodges throughout the world. Although there is some controversy regarding the date of the establishment of the first lodge in Virginia by the Grand Lodge of England, modern research seems to indicate that this was done with the establishment of a lodge in Norfolk in 1753. By the time of the Revolutionary War, Freemasonry under the Grand Lodge system was well established in Virginia and included among its members such well-known citizens as George Washington, Patrick Henry, Edmund Randolph.

During the Revolution, the Virginia lodges organized the Grand lodge of Virginia, the Mother of Kentucky Masonry, and on October 13, 1778, elected John Blair "the first Most Worshipful Grand Master of Ancient York Masons in America." However, the exploration of Kentucky had begun at this time and some individual Masons had already penetrated the wilderness of Kentucky.

It may never be known who the first Masons in Kentucky were, but four are known to have been within the present boundaries of the state as early as 1775. Three members of the party who erected the first cabin on the site of Lexington about June 4, 1775, were Masons. They were Robert Patterson, Levi Todd, and John Maxwell. Maxwell named the town. Another Mason in Kentucky that same year was George Rogers Clark, who subsequently became the first Mason known to have been in Illinois.

The number of Masons increased in Kentucky until at last there were enough in the vicinity of Lexington to organize the first lodge established west of the mountains, ten years after the formation of the Grand Lodge of Virginia. Despite the fact that its first returns have disappeared and the names of the charter members are unknown, it is a matter of record that Edmund Randolph, a former governor of Virginia, signed the charter of Lexington Lodge No. 25 as Grand Master.

The proceedings of the Grand Lodge of Virginia for 1788 state:

...at a Grand Lodge, holden by appointment, at the Masons Hall in the city of Richmond, on the 17th day of November 1788, a petition of Green

Clay, in behalf of sundry brethren residing in the district of Kentucke was read, praying that leave be granted them to hold a regular lodge at the town of Lexington, in the district aforesaid. Ordered that a charter be granted to Richard C. Anderson, John Fowler, Green Clay and others, to hold a regular lodge of Free Masons at the Town of Lexington, in the District of Kentucke, by the name, title, and description of Lexington Lodge No. 25.

Thus, the first lodge of Masons in the Mississippi Valley was chartered.

The original charter of this lodge is still preserved by Lexington Lodge No. 1, which number it received when it went into the Grand Lodge of Kentucky. Lexington Lodge No. 25 under its charter had jurisdiction over the entire district called "Kentucke" until the establishment of other lodges began. It likewise built the first Masonic Temple in what is now Kentucky. It was located at the northeast corner of Walnut and Short Streets in Lexington.

Following the establishment of Lexington Lodge No.25, three others received charters from Virginia and another was organized but not formally chartered in Kentucky. The first of these was Paris No. 35, November 25, 1791. Georgetown No. 46 followed on November 29, 1796. Next was Frankfort-Hiram No. 57, December 11, 1799. Abraham (now Solomon's) at Shelbyville received a dispensation dated December 17, 1798, but did not complete all steps toward becoming fully chartered under Virginia. It did, however, participate in the organization of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky.

By 1800, then, there were five lodges and an unknown number of Masons in Kentucky. Statehood had been attained in 1792. Kentucky Masons found a Grand Lodge of their own desirable. The reasons for this were related primarily to the distance between Richmond, Virginia, the seat of the Grand Lodge, and central Kentucky. This distance, with its accompanying mountains and forests, made representation in the Grand Lodge difficult for the Kentucky lodges. For the same reason, visitations by Grand Officers to the Kentucky lodges were virtually impossible. Furthermore, it was hard to extend the benefits of the Grand Lodge Charity Fund to Kentucky Masons in distress.

As a result, Lexington Lodge No. 25 invited representatives of each of the Kentucky lodges to meet with them in "Masons' Hall" in Lexington at a meeting presided over by John Hawkins of Georgetown Lodge No. 46 on Monday, September 8, 1800, to consider the advisability of organizing a Grand Lodge. At this meeting, there were present fifteen representatives of the five lodges. They resolved that each lodge should have one vote; that a Grand Lodge should be established for such lodges as might care to come under its jurisdiction; that a committee should notify the Grand Lodge of Virginia of the proposed actions; and that a subsequent meeting should be held October 16, 1800. 


