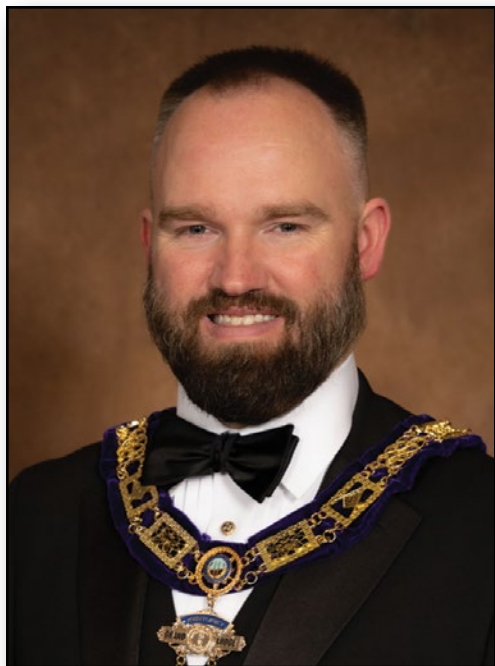

My Brothers,

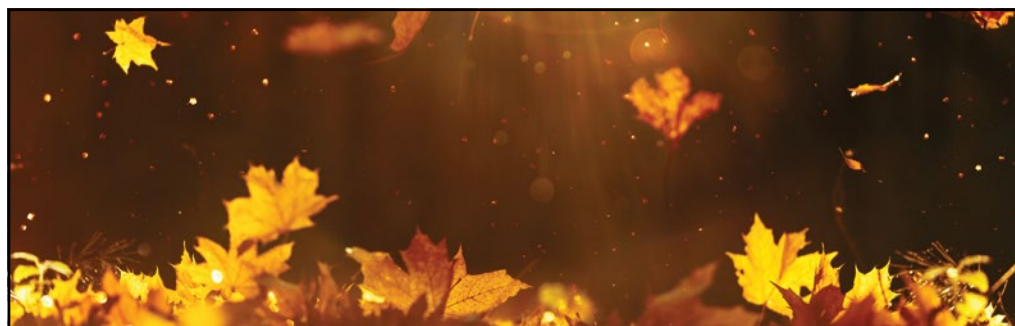
As a young boy growing up in the mountains of Eastern Kentucky, I was always captivated by the beauty of autumn. My grandmother often recalled how, as a toddler, I would be mesmerized by the vibrant reds, oranges, and yellows that painted the trees as the seasons changed. The falling leaves seemed to dance in the crisp air, evoking a sense of wonder and joy. Our home, surrounded by thick forests, became a living canvas, displaying nature's artistry at the start of every fall. It was a time of transformation, reminding us that change, though inevitable, is something to be embraced, for it carries with it both beauty and purpose.

Autumn is often considered a season of harvest, a time to reflect on the work we've completed and the blessings we've received. It is a moment to gather the fruits of our labor and appreciate the abundance life has to offer. For us as Kentucky Masons, this season is even more significant. As the crisp fall air settles in, we mark the close of another productive year; one that calls for gratitude and celebration. As we approach the 226th Annual Communication of our Grand Lodge, it is an opportunity to pause and honor what we have accomplished together, as Brothers united by common ideals.

This year holds special meaning as we commemorate 225 years of fraternal bonds – two and a quarter centuries of friendship, morality, and brotherly love. This is no small milestone. It is the culmination of generations of dedicated Masons who labored, not for personal gain, but for the betterment of one another and for society at large. The achievements we celebrate today are the fruit of their tireless work. This year alone, we've seen a surge of participation in Masonic education, with more than 500 brothers successfully completing the Masonic Scholars Academy, and more than one thousand completing the Constitution Quiz, a 16% increase over the previous record. Additionally, we proudly witnessed the publication of *The Craft of the Commonwealth: 225 Years of Masonic Light*, a book that stands as a testament to our enduring impact on Kentucky and beyond. Though it took more than a century to realize this goal, the labors of many Brethren have borne fruit. Further, the support of many lodges and individual Brothers have yielded huge dividends for the First Lady's Program: RiteCare, with tens of thousands of dollars being raised in support of children who cannot communicate, so that they may receive the therapy they so desperately need. Finally, last but certainly not least, we have initiated, passed, and raised countless new Brothers, while renewing old friendships and forming new ones.

These accomplishments are not the work of one man alone but of many. They are the result of Brothers, scattered across our Commonwealth, coming together in purpose and unity. I am reminded of a lesson I learned in elementary school one autumn day; one that has stayed with me throughout my life. Our local pastor, Reverend DeWitt Furrow, once invited a gentleman from the remote Kentucky Bend to visit our community. This man continued a family tradition of broom-making, crafting functional tools from simple materials: straw, rope, and a wooden handle. While visiting my elementary school, he demonstrated his craft, and in so doing imparted a lifelong lesson. Alone, each individual piece of straw was weak and inconsequential, but when bound together, they formed something strong, practical, and valuable, a broom capable of sweeping clean an entire home.

That lesson has always resonated with me, because it speaks to the heart of our Masonic values. As individual Masons, we may at times feel that our contributions are small or limited. However, when we unite in purpose, bound by our shared values and the tenets of our Craft, we become part of something greater than ourselves. Together, we have the power to effect meaningful, lasting change in our communities, our state, and even the world. It is in our unity that we find our true strength.

GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

Brothers,

As October is upon us, so is our Annual Grand Lodge Session. I have had much joy visiting with many of you this year and providing you these articles each month. For my final selection I have chosen to share with you the biography of one of our most well-known Past Grand Masters. Most Worshipful Brother Henry Clay was a Past Master of Lexington Lodge No. 1 and Grand Master 1820-1821. He is famously known as the Great Compromiser from his time in the U.S. Senate, Speaker of the House, and Secretary of State.

Henry Clay was born in Hanover County, Virginia, on April 12, 1777, the son of Reverend John and Elizabeth (Hudson) Clay. With no other heritage than poverty, Brother Clay attained distinction by force of ardent talents and honest effort. It is said of him that "a more honest man, or one more devoted to the best interests of his country, perhaps, never lived." He commenced the study of law at the age of 19 and came to Kentucky soon afterward.

Clay was initiated into Freemasonry in December 1799 in what was then Lexington Lodge No. 25, which worked under the auspices of the Grand Lodge of Virginia until the formation of our own Grand Lodge in 1800, at which time it was renumbered to "1." He was elected Master of Lexington Lodge No. 1 for a six-month term beginning in early 1820. He was an active, zealous Mason, as the records of the Grand Lodge abundantly prove. Brother Clay was elected Grand Master at the Annual Communication in 1820, and he served as a great advocate of a National Grand Lodge.

Much campaign material was created to exploit the fact Clay demitted from Lexington Lodge No. 1 and accused him of "recanting" his involvement in Freemasonry due to the "Morgan Affair." Though he did demit, it was a good two years before Morgan's disappearance and was due to much more honorable reasons. He had attempted to revive a desire within the fraternity to convene a National Masonic Convention for the establishment of a National Grand Lodge.

When those efforts proved fruitless due to his motives being questioned, seeking not to dishonor the fraternity, he demitted on November 18, 1824. However, even during the height of the Anti-Masonic fervor that swept the country following Morgan's disappearance in 1826, which brought forth the collapse of several Grand Lodges, Clay refused to denounce the Order. In fact, he continued to visit his brethren and attended the Grand Lodge Annual Communication in 1831.

His political career commenced in 1799 in active canvassing for the election of delegates to the Kentucky Constitutional Convention. He represented Fayette County in the Kentucky General Assembly and was appointed to the U.S. Senate in 1806. Again, elected to the General Assembly in 1807 and chosen Speaker. In 1808, he fought a duel with Humphrey Marshall. He was again elected to the U.S. Senate in 1809; and to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1811. He was elected Speaker thereof, to which office he was re-elected five times. He advocated the war with England and was appointed a Peace Commissioner in 1814, serving as Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Ghent.

He was elected to Congress in 1818 and delivered his famous speech on the recognition of the South American Republics. He advocated a national system of internal improvements in the protection of American industry and adjustment of the Missouri Compromise and retired from Congress. In 1823 he was again elected to Congress and supported the independence of Greece.

Clay served as Secretary of State between 1825 and 1829, under President John Q. Adams, during which his attack on John Randolph led to a bloodless duel between the two. In 1831 he was again elected to the United States Senate and commenced his tariff work. Clay was nominated for President but was defeated by Jackson in 1832. He was re-elected to the Senate in 1836 and continued therein until he resigned in 1842. In 1844 he was again nominated for President but was defeated by Polk. In 1847, he was baptized into the Episcopal Church.

In 1849, he was elected to the United States Senate, and he devoted his energies to the Compromise measures adopted in 1850. Due to ill health, he submitted his letter of resignation from his seat in the Senate, to take effect on September 06, 1852. He died on June 29, 1852, in Washington, D.C., chief among equals and probably the greatest of great Americans. His funeral was conducted in the chamber of the United States Senate. Clay is interred in a mausoleum in Lexington Cemetery.

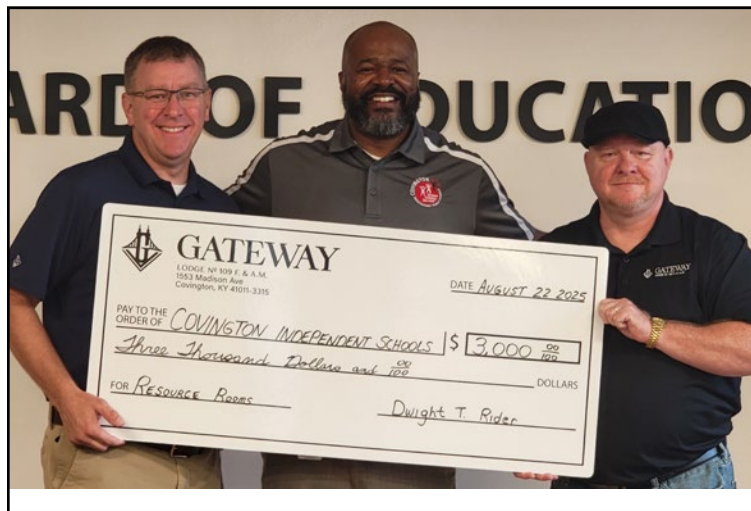

"I Didn't Know That....."

BOOK REVIEW: EXPLORING EARLY GRAND LODGE FREEMASONRY – STUDIES IN HONOR OF THE TRICENTENNIAL OF THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE GRAND LODGE OF ENGLAND - CHRISTOPHER B. MURPHY, EDITOR – SHAWN EYER, EXECUTIVE EDITOR

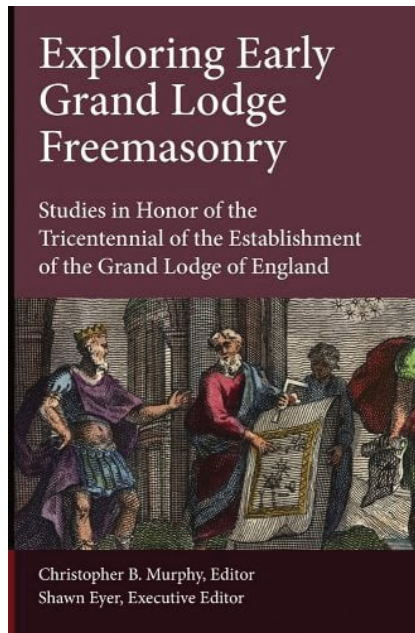
When an anniversary of a special event occurs, it almost always requires a new look at that noteworthy happening with a correlation of newer information concerning the event and the thoughts of the men who participated then and in the following years. And so it is, in this collection of scholarly presentations: "Exploring Early Grand Lodge Freemasonry – Studies in Honor of the Tricentennial of the Establishment of the Grand Lodge of England."

As a fresh review at previously researched material, this book presents a clear and concise understanding of the thoughts of the men who lived it, concerning such things as religion and science, the true secrets of Freemasonry, what happened within the lodges, and what the Masons of that era truthfully thought and felt about their lodges and their selves as Freemasons. This study enables the reader to grasp "the cultural realities of Masonic life and thought" in the early years of the first Grand Lodge.

Editor Christopher M. Murphy, who lectured at the 10th Anniversary of the 'MRF Symposium' held in Lexington (2019), offers the "Introduction" to the book. Murphy also presents two brilliant articles: "A Just and Exact Account of Freemasonry - A Survey of the Constitutions and Pocket Companions of 1723 to 1756"; also "Assessing Authentic Lodge Culture: Moving Beyond the Tavern Myth".

The 98 page "Just and Exact Account" article examines James Anderson's Constitution, with eight other early works presented within a period of 40 years, all of which were Grand Lodge publications, and puts forth the practices and the beliefs of early Grand Lodge Masonry; which enables the student to identify the essential themes presented, and in the words of H. L. Haywood, "think Masonry out for himself". Christopher Murphy also suggests that the mythical history of Freemasonry was for years important enough to be presented to each new brother at his initiation. So should it be reviewed with the same importance by the Masonic student.

In his second presentation, "Assessing Authentic Lodge Culture", author Murphy states the fact Lodges met in taverns, has given rise to the notion that Lodge meetings consisted of 'eat, drink and sing a few songs.' The mysteries were only what stonemasons practiced, and "the only secret is there is no secret" or Masons should of course 'keep the only secrets, the grips and words' private." Murphy unequivocally rejects this notion, and through thorough research, presents a convincing



case for a far more spiritual society, one that will "unfold the Mysteries of Godliness" to those who search its truth. Perhaps this is the most important lecture in the series.

The "Forward" of the book is offered the renowned Masonic scholar and Executive Editor of the book Shawn Eyer, who adds his article, "The Essential Secrets of Masonry – Insight from an American Masonic Oration of 1734. This "Dissertation upon Freemasonry" is remarkable for several reasons. It is the first known American Lodge oration and the third oldest surviving oration in the world. Eyer states the oration was not intended to be published, but was intended for lodge presentation only. It deals with the Master Mason degree, proving that the third degree was available soon after Masonry arrived in the colonies. It reflects that "the harmony of the tiled lodge reflects the harmony of heaven", and adds that hidden knowledge was available through Masonry, to those who wished to pursue it. This thought pattern is found among several other early Masonic sources.

"Genius of Masonry – The Preservation of Masonic Tradition in the Songs of Freemasons" by Nathan A. St. Pierre; offers a look at music, one of the seven liberal sciences, that is today often ignored. While there are some American Lodges who are currently reviving the singing of the songs that appeared in Anderson's Constitution, and elsewhere, music is mostly ignored by the majority of American Lodges. However, these songs reflect the culture and how Masons felt about their Masonry. More Masonic related studies should be done on this subject. St. Pierre says that music is not so much listening to a famous singer, but should be sang or played for the joy it provides to one's self, and it offers additional comradery when singing or playing an instrument as a group.

"John Desaguliers – The Balance of Religion and Science" by researcher Jedediah French is an interesting look at the third Grand Master John Desaguliers and his obsession in promoting the Newtonian philosophy in early Masonry. Desaguliers was a close associate with Isaac Newton through the Royal Society. Much research by Brother French brings forth new information on Desaguliers, who guided the Grand Lodge in the early years.

Other presentations included in "Exploring Early Grand Lodge Freemasonry" include two very popular authors: Ric Berman on "Freemasonry, the London Irish, and the Antients Grand Lodge" and "The Grand Lodge of All England Held at York – An Independent

Grand Lodge in England in the Eighteenth Century” by David Harrison. “Spiritual and Heavenly People in the Corners – Embracing Masonic Ethos through the Eyes of James Anderson” by Dana Scofield, rounds out the series of presentations. Each of these articles display considerable reference to Rev. James Anderson’s ‘Traditional History of Freemasonry’ which is also included in this book. Reading the complete series of the above research papers, has given me a far more favorable opinion of James Anderson than previously and a better understanding of early Grand Lodge Freemasonry and the culture behind it. If one thinks that Freemasonry in its Grand Lodge beginnings was shallow, and its secrets minimal, then he who reads “Exploring Early Grand Lodge Freemasonry” will have a broader understanding of the complexity of Freemasonry in its early Grand Lodge years.

This book is certainly one of the most important books on the subject of the early Grand Lodge and was written by new Masonic researchers and well known Masonic scholars alike. If you want to know what early eighteenth-century Freemasonry really was and what it truly meant to Freemasons, “Exploring Early Grand Lodge Freemasonry” is a must read. It will be studied by masonic students for years to come. I highly recommend it.What do you think?
