

REFLECTIONS ON WINTER HARDSHIPS, THE LEGACY OF ST. PATRICK'S DAY AND THE ACTIONS OF BROTHER MASON GEORGE WASHINGTON.

A JOURNEY FROM SNOWSTORMS TO CELEBRATION

As we emerge from the wild winter months of January and February, marked by relentless snow and ice, I feel truly grateful that all our brothers and their families have remained safe during these challenging times. Some communities witnessed a staggering 8 to 13 inches of snowfall, while others struggled with dangerous ice, prompting the Governor to declare a state of emergency to safeguard everyone. Deciding when to act and when to hold back during such crises can be an arduous task, as we strive to make choices in the best interest of those we care about in our communities.

The harsh winter weather serves as a reminder of both the unpredictability of nature and the resilience required to endure adversity. Many of us found ourselves digging out cars, shoveling driveways, or checking in on neighbors to ensure their well-being. These acts of community and mutual support are what bind us together, especially in times when the world seems frozen and uncertain. Through it all, our collective strength and compassion have seen us safely through another season of hardship.

Now, with March upon us, the gradual thaw brings not only the hope of spring but also the approach of St. Patrick's Day—a time of festivity, tradition, and reflection. For many, the anticipation of donning green attire, displaying shamrocks, and gathering with friends and family for celebration is a cherished annual ritual. Yet, as we prepare to revel in Irish heritage, it is worth pausing to consider the origins and deeper meanings behind these customs.

The story of St. Patrick is one of transformation, perseverance, and profound faith. Born Maewyn in 385 AD in what is now Wales, he began life as a pagan worshipper. His early years were marked by upheaval when he was captured by Irish raiders and sold into slavery. During his six years of servitude, Maewyn underwent a spiritual awakening, embracing the Roman Catholic faith. Upon escaping to the European continent, he sought sanctuary and education at Marmoutier Abbey in Gaul (modern-day Tours, France), where he studied under St. Germaine for twelve years. This period of study and reflection deepened his conviction to spread Christianity among the pagans, particularly in Ireland.

The evolution of St. Patrick's Day from a religious observance to a vibrant, secular holiday is a fascinating journey. The first American celebration of St. Patrick's Day took place in Boston in 1737, a city with a significant Irish population eager to honor their heritage. However, secular celebrations outside the church did not gain widespread popularity until 1756.

During the French and Indian War, Lieutenant Colonel George Washington, serving in the British Army, recognized the exhaustion of his troops, many of whom were Irish. In a gesture of empathy and solidarity, he declared St. Patrick's Day a holiday, granting his men much-needed rest and recreation. That year, a celebration and feast were held at the Crown and Thistle Tavern in New York.

Later, as a secular holiday, St. Patrick's Day's first recorded observance occurred when General Washington declared March 17, 1780, a holiday for the Continental Army quartered at Morristown, New Jersey. This was reportedly the first holiday the troops had enjoyed in two years and was meant to honor the Irish ancestry among his soldiers. Washington described the occasion as an "act of solidarity with the Irish in their fight for independence." This gesture contributed to the holiday's evolution as a symbol of Irish nationalism in America, broadening its significance beyond religious commemoration.

For Freemasons and all who cherish the values of faith, community, and perseverance, St. Patrick's Day holds special meaning. It serves as a reminder of the transformative power of conviction and the importance of embracing one's heritage. The American tradition of celebrating St. Patrick's Day owes much to General Washington's recognition of his troops' sacrifices and his willingness to honor their cultural roots.

As we prepare to celebrate, let us remember the true spirit of St. Patrick's Day—a day that honors a pagan youth turned Christian bishop, commemorates the conversion of the Druids, and celebrates the contributions of Irish-Americans in the fight for independence. Whether through gatherings, parades, or quiet moments of reflection, let us cherish the legacy of resilience, unity, and hope that this holiday represents.

So, as Masons and friends, we will soon don our green, display our shamrocks, and join in the festivities. In doing so, we not only pay tribute to St. Patrick but also to the enduring bonds of brotherhood and the shared journey from winter's hardships to spring's promise.



GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

KENTUCKY'S ROLE IN THE EXPANSION OF FREEMASONRY (PART II)

(this was first published in January of 1970 in *The Register of the Kentucky Historical Society*)

At the October 16th meeting, held in the same place, there were present twenty-one representatives of the lodges. James Morrison, of Lexington Lodge No. 25, being the oldest Past Master present, was invited to preside. A Lodge of Master Masons was opened; credentials and charters were produced; and it was agreed that each lodge should have one vote and the Past Masters, not representatives, should likewise have one vote. The Ahima Rezon of Virginia was observed in electing the following Grand Officers:

Other details were attended to and the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, Free and Accepted Masons, was launched slightly more than twenty-five years after the first known Masons made their way into the district.

The role played by the Grand Lodge in the spread of Freemasonry in Kentucky and in the West will next be considered. During the Grand Lodge's first forty years of existence it chartered a total of one hundred fifteen lodges. Of these, ninety-seven (including the five original lodges) were in Kentucky and eighteen in territory that either was or subsequently became a part of other states. Nine states were thus affected.

During the first forty years of its existence, the Grand Lodge of Kentucky established lodges from Greenup to Murray and from the Ohio River to the Tennessee line in Kentucky. The first lodge chartered in Kentucky after the original five was Washington No. 6 at "Bairdstown", February 10, 1801. In fairly rapid succession, lodges were then chartered at such widely scattered points in Kentucky as Louisville, Henderson, Glasgow, Columbia, Danville, Burkesville, Hopkinsville, Elkton, Bowling Green, Princeton, Murray, Somerset, Hawesville, and many others nearer the center of the state.

Outside Kentucky, the Grand Lodge established the first lodges in four states: Mississippi, Indiana, Alabama and Arkansas. The first extra-territorial lodge organized was Harmony No. 7, located in Natchez, Mississippi Territory, October 12, 1808. This was several years before Mississippi became a state in 1817 and before it had its own Grand Lodge in 1818. The next state whose first lodge emanated from Kentucky was Indiana with Vincennes Lodge No. 15, August 31, 1800. As in the case of Mississippi, this was some years before Indiana attained statehood in 1816. In addition, Kentucky chartered five more lodges and issued dispensations (the first step toward formal chartering) for two more there before the Grand Lodge of Indiana was formed on January 13, 1818.

August 28, 1812, the Grand Lodge of Kentucky issued a charter for Madison Lodge No. 21, in what was then Mississippi Territory, but is now Huntsville,

Alabama. Thus, Alabama received her first Masonry from Kentucky seven years before she became a state in 1819 and nine years before her Grand Lodge began in June, 1821. Across the Mississippi River, the first lodge in Arkansas had its beginning as Arkansas No. 59 at Arkansas Post, August 28, 1820. This was sixteen years before Arkansas became a state and eighteen before the Grand Lodge of Arkansas began November 21, 1838.

In addition to these places where the first seeds of Freemasonry were planted by Kentucky, it materially aided the Fraternity's growth in five other states where it established lodges that were not the initial ones. The first of these was Tennessee. The first lodges there had been established by North Carolina, but Kentucky chartered one, Philanthropic No. 12, in Davidson County (Nashville), September 18, 1805. This led to a dispute with the Grand Lodge of North Carolina and resulted in Kentucky's ultimate withdrawal.

North of the Ohio River, the first lodge in Illinois was established by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania June 6, 1806 at Kaskaskia. Nevertheless, Kentucky established a total of five lodges there, including her last extra-territorial lodge, Ottawa No. 114, September 1, 1840.

Meanwhile, in another state north of the Ohio River, Kentucky chartered Cincinnati Lodge No. 13, March 19, 1806. This was not the first lodge in Ohio (that state has a somewhat complicated history in that respect), but it evidently made its influence felt strongly because upon the organization of the Grand Lodge of Ohio in 1808-1809, a slightly modified version of the Kentucky Book of Constitutions was adopted.

Kentucky contributed to the growth of Missouri Masonry by the organization of Potosi Lodge No. 39, at Potosi, August 28, 1816. This lodge apparently lasted but a short time, but it was one of the very earliest there.

In Louisiana, lodges appear to have been chartered by several Grand Lodges. Among these, Kentucky established Feliciana No. 46 at St. Francisville, August 27, 1817. This lodge was geographically the most distant one that Kentucky chartered. Also it should be noted that a Grand Lodge of French-speaking lodges was in existence in Louisiana at that time, having been organized in 1812.

In this manner and by these events, Kentucky proved herself to be the pioneer western state in the organization and early spread of the fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons. With its pioneers, the first Masons came to the West and ultimately organized the first lodges and the first Grand Lodge beyond the Appalachians. From this Grand Lodge came the organization's growth into states, from the Great Lakes to the Gulf, and from the eastern foothills of Kentucky to the west bank of the Mississippi.

Next, there was a list of members who were at risk of suspension for nonpayment of dues and the same approach was used to make personal contact with each and truly to check and see if one of our Masonic Brothers was in financial distress or where we collectively, as a Lodge, were failing to

maintain enthusiasm for the Fraternity and to welcome our Brothers back. Last, there was a list of members who were less than two years in the Lodge, and a call requested to each to check on their well being and to offer the support of the Lodge.

As I was participating in the contact program I did not immediately perceive that the true recipients of encouragement and those who were assisted the most were those of us who were fortunate enough to assist with the contact list. I still use the contact list, during my times of winter blues, as a means of encouraging some of our members, a way of checking on some members who have not been to a meeting in a while, and just as importantly, as a means of reminding myself that Freemasonry Still Matters to me and to each and every Man who has had the great fortune of kneeling at that altar, placing his hands upon the Great Lights, and assuming Our Fraternities Oaths And Obligations.

I encourage you to take a few minutes during these next several weeks to reach out and initiate a conversation and simply share the Masonic Fellowship that is the hallmark of our Fraternity.


