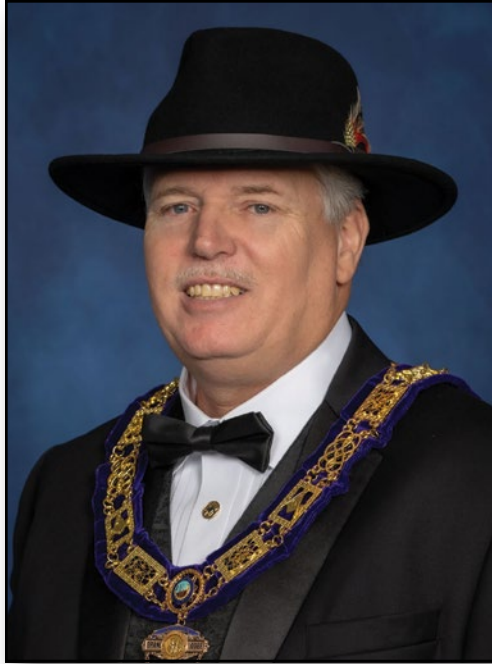

ENGAGING THE NEXT GENERATION OF FREEMASONS LISTENING AND ADAPTING TO OUR MEMBERS

One thing I have always tried to do is stand back and listen to our brothers and hear their concerns. Even if I can't change something or don't have a quick answer, I know that my friends and brothers just want to be heard. At the February Education Webinar for the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, a key topic was how to connect with the younger generation as we welcome them into our lodges and how to keep them interested after they join. We have implemented several initiatives: our website provides information on how to join, details about the craft, and ways to contact us for potential membership. The members-only section features a wealth of information, including educational videos and papers. We use social media to highlight the positive work we do in our community and lodges. Educational webinars keep members informed, and we stay connected through text, WhatsApp, GroupMe, and other forms of technology. But the question remains: what can we change within our lodges and through technology to increase membership and engagement, ensuring the younger generation is inspired to join our great fraternity?

To attract and retain younger Freemasons, it is essential to focus on the following strategies: Create a more relaxed and approachable atmosphere. Ensure the website or Facebook page is up-to-date and user-friendly. Regularly post updates and engage with the community, so that they see you are active with your lodge, your family and the community. Provide younger members with roles within the lodge to foster involvement and make them feel like they are wanted, needed and appreciated. Offer education, philosophy, guest speakers or even book clubs to deepen understanding of Masonic principles. The younger generation values loyalty, equality, and responsibility- the exact qualities central to Freemasonry, so let's strive to grow together.

If you're a younger Mason, I encourage you to get involved, share your ideas, and help shape the future of our fraternity. And if you're an older Mason, I urge you to embrace change, mentor the next generation, and trust that the future of Freemasonry is in good hands.

Let's work together to ensure that our lodges and appendant bodies remain vibrant and relevant for generations to come. Remember, we don't recruit in Freemasonry. But by creating a welcoming and engaging environment, by showcasing the best of what our fraternity has to offer, we can attract those who are seeking something more in their lives. Let fellowship be our guiding principle and let the public see the true spirit of Freemasonry.

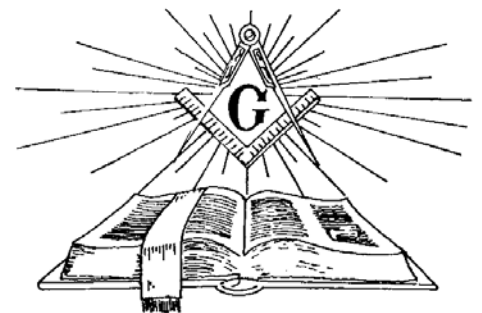

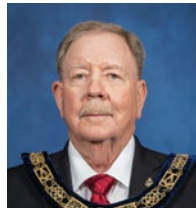

THE CRAFT AT WORK

A LEGACY OF FOUR GENERATIONS, AND COUNTING

In 2001, as a 16-year-old, I attended an open communication of Alford Lodge #925 to watch my great-grandfather receive his 50-year pin. I didn't fully understand the moment, I just knew it was important. Four generations stood connected in a room bound by tradition, memory, and quiet pride. I had been around countless men in my life attending monthly meetings, country breakfasts, and fish fries, but to see a man I thought the world of be part of an organization for 50 years, knowing that some of the greatest men in history had taken the same oath, filled me with awe. That night planted something in me, awe, respect, and a spark I would carry forward.

A few years later, on a cold night, March 4, 2008, I was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason at Temple Hill #276. That night, four generations of Burkeen men, born in 1915, 1944, 1964, and 1985, stood together in the lodge, connected by time and ancient ritual. No one present had seen anything like it before, four generations of Master Masons standing there in one lodge. The weight and significance of the moment left a lasting impression. The lessons I had glimpsed as a boy, of tradition, respect, and quiet pride, became my own as I learned the ritual, responsibilities, and the camaraderie of the lodge. In that moment, the family legacy of Master Masons continued, and I became part of the chain that I hope one day will extend to my son.

Twenty-two years after watching my great-grandfather receive his 50-year pin, now in the same lodge where I was raised, on November 7, 2023, I stood again for a 50-year presentation, watching my father honor his father. My seven-year-old son was there as a witness. Four generations of Burkeen men stood in that lodge room once again. Not the same four, but the same altar. Time had shifted the lineup, but the chain had not broken, only grown stronger, adding a new link. Earlier, in November 2016, I had the honor of presenting my other grandfather his 50-year pin, continuing the family tradition and witnessing the pride of generations firsthand. As I looked at my son, I hoped the same spark would take root in him. I hope that in nine years, if he chooses freely, we may stand there as five generations, and hopefully beyond...

There is one person I want to recognize who never wore the apron but was just as important, my mamaw, my great-grandmother. She was quietly proud of our Masonic lineage, purchased the first Masonic ring for all four of us, something she was very proud of. She played a huge role in shaping the men we became. Her support, encouragement, and pride helped ensure that the Burkeen family tradition would continue.

One thing that has always struck me is the number of remarkable men I've known to be Masons. Not just Presidents or historical figures, but kings, composers, astronauts. Yet when a man steps into a lodge hall, all of that disappears. Inside, we meet upon the level. Every title, accomplishment, and reputation is set aside. When I joined, I didn't know what I wanted to do with my life. Within a few years, I found my path as a police officer, due to several members of my lodge being first responders. Seeing men I admired step into the lodge and embrace the same principles I was learning showed me something profound. Masonry is not just about history or ceremony, it's about the men themselves, and what they carry into the world every day.

I began my degree work in January, February, and March, learning little by little each month. By April, when I completed my third-degree proficiency, it had become more than memorization, it was understanding, growth. Finally stepping into a lodge meeting as a full-fledged Master Mason, I experienced being part of the fraternity from start to finish, fully immersed, no longer just an observer.



One of the most memorable moments came while serving in the chairs alongside my family. As Senior Warden, I served under my father when he was Master. Later, when I became Master myself, I had one grandfather as my Junior Deacon and the other as my Senior Steward, with my father as Senior Deacon. Sitting in those chairs together, I wasn't just performing ritual, I was witnessing a family legacy.



I want to thank all the Masons who guided me along the way, those still with us and those who have passed on. From helping me through degree work to supporting me as Master, their guidance, patience, and example shaped the Mason I am today. Every lesson, every word of encouragement, every act of mentorship contributed to my journey. I am grateful to have stood on the shoulders of so many good men, and I carry their influence with me every day. I'd also like to thank Keith Dreier, PGM, for allowing me to submit this reflection into the Kentucky Home Journal.

I am proud to be part of this fraternity. Beyond the family I've mentioned, I discovered many of my ancestors were also members. Knowing I'm part of a long line of men who valued Masonry deepens that pride and gives me a sense of connection across time.

Moving to North Dakota means I can no longer attend my home lodge. I miss it deeply. I hope Temple Hill #276 continues the good work it has always done and grows stronger with each passing year. I am especially disappointed that I won't be there next year when the Grand Master of the state, a member of my home lodge, takes office. Even in my absence, I carry the lessons with pride, and the legacy of that lodge with me, and I hope that same spirit inspires younger men to step forward and keep our traditions alive.

One lesson from Masonry that I carry every day, especially in law enforcement, is simple, treat people the way you want to be treated. In the lodge, it's about respect and equality. Outside, it's about integrity, empathy, and accountability. Those principles have guided me through difficult calls, challenging decisions, and interactions, reminding me that character matters.

To any younger men considering joining, my advice is simple, do it. Not only do we need you, I truly believe the world needs Freemasonry. The lessons, the camaraderie, and the chance to be part of something larger than yourself are worth it, and they shape men in ways nothing else can.

Ultimately, Masonry has mattered to me because, just as the motto goes, it is about "making good men better." To close, I'll borrow the words of President Andrew Jackson,

"Freemasonry is a moral order, instituted by virtuous men, with the praiseworthy design of recalling to our remembrance."

For me, that is what Masonry has always been, a reminder of the men who came before, the lessons they taught, and the legacy we carry forward for those who follow.
