Whereas, Brother Littlefield collectively served on the Board of Directors for 16 years; and

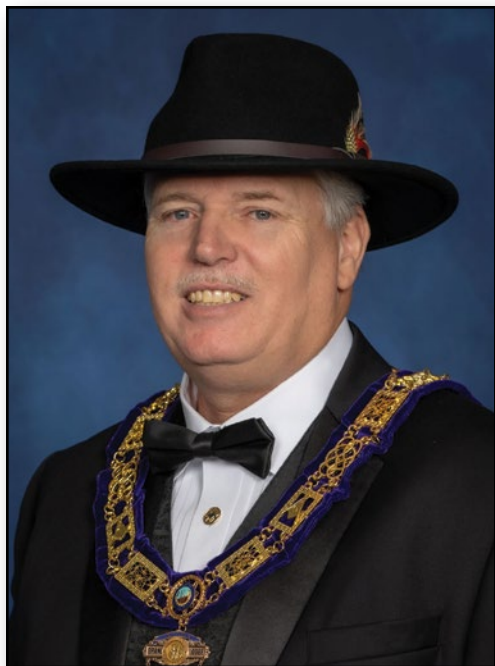
Whereas, Brother Littlefield served on numerous committees, including the Buildings/Grounds, Property, Nominations and Supplies Property, and

SEPTEMBER REFLECTIONS: KENTUCKY FREEMASONRY, LABOR, AND GRATITUDE

September offers Kentucky Freemasons a meaningful opportunity to look backward with gratitude and forward with renewed purpose. It is a month that holds a special place in the history of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, calls us to remember notable Masonic figures connected to September, and invites us to reflect on the dignity of honest labor. As summer gives way to fall, the Craft is reminded that every season has its work, every brother has his duty, and every act of service helps build a stronger lodge, community, and Commonwealth.

One of the most important September dates in Kentucky Freemasonry is September 8, 1800. On that day, delegates from several Masonic lodges in Kentucky met at Masons' Hall in Lexington to establish the Grand Lodge of Kentucky, Free and Accepted Masons. That gathering marked the beginning of organized Grand Lodge Masonry in the Commonwealth and helped shape the structure, leadership, and fraternal identity that Kentucky Masons continue to inherit today.

The founding of the Grand Lodge in Lexington reminds us that Kentucky Masonry was built by men willing to gather, deliberate, and labor together for something larger than themselves. Their work was not merely administrative; it was symbolic of the Masonic duty to bring order, harmony, and brotherly love into the world around us. Each lodge meeting, degree, charitable effort, and act of mentorship continues that labor first organized in Kentucky more than two centuries ago.

September also gives us reason to remember historical Masons whose lives and service are connected to this month. In Kentucky records, Most Worshipful Carroll M. Curtis, who served as Grand Master of Kentucky from 1969 to 1970, was born on September 1, 1931, in Robertson County. His Masonic journey included service in his local lodge, district leadership, Grand Lodge offices, and years of travel throughout the Commonwealth on behalf of the Craft. His example reflects the September theme of labor faithfully performed over time.

Beyond Kentucky, September relates to several widely recognized Masonic figures. Perhaps the most prominent September connection in Masonic history is Brother George Washington. On September 18, 1793, while serving as President of the United States, Washington took part in the laying of the cornerstone of the United States Capitol in Washington, D.C. The ceremony included Masonic participation and symbolism, connecting the building of the nation's legislative home with the Masonic ideals of order, virtue, and faithful labor. For Masons, Washington's September example reminds us that the Craft's teachings are not confined to the lodge room; they are meant to guide public service, civic duty, and the building of lasting institutions.

Labor Day, observed on the first Monday in September, honors the contributions of working people and the value of honest labor. For Freemasons, that message carries special meaning. Masonry teaches that labor is not only necessary, but noble. The working tools of the Craft point beyond physical construction and toward the building of character, the improvement of ourselves, and service to others.

In the lodge, we speak often of labor and refreshment. That language reminds us that our work is both practical and spiritual. We labor when we improve ourselves, assist a brother, support our families, care for our communities, and practice charity. We labor when we preserve the traditions of the fraternity and pass them faithfully to the next generation. Just as Labor Day honors those who build and sustain the nation, Freemasonry honors the moral labor required to build better men and, through them, a better society.

This September, I also extend heartfelt thanks to First Lady Amber Martin for her support, encouragement, and dedication. The work of Freemasonry is strengthened not only by those who labor within the lodge room, but also by those who stand beside the Craft with patience, kindness, and commitment. Her support is deeply appreciated, and I wish First Lady Amber Martin a very Happy Birthday in September. In addition, I would also like to thank all the ladies around the state for their continued support; it is greatly appreciated.

A SEPTEMBER CHARGE TO ALL MY BROTHERS.

As September unfolds, may Kentucky Masons remember the labors of those who met in Lexington in 1800, honor the examples of Masonic leaders connected to this month, and recommit themselves to the work still before us. Let Labor Day remind us that every worthy structure begins with faithful hands and willing hearts. In that spirit, may we continue our Masonic labor with gratitude, humility, and brotherly love to continue the great things we do in the Commonwealth for the Grand Lodge of Kentucky.

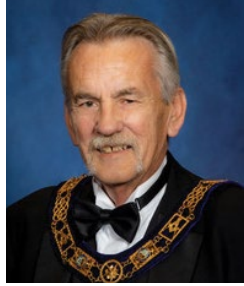

GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

INSPIRATION IN A BOTTLE: THE STORY OF THE DUQUOIN MASONIC DECANTER

In the late 1960's, rock and roll filled the airwaves, muscle cars thundered down the highways, and one visionary Mason in Southern Illinois looked at his aging lodge and saw an opportunity for change.

Nestled in the small town of DuQuoin stands DuQuoin Lodge No. 234, a well-known Masonic lodge with deep roots in the community. At the time, the building was deteriorating and posed accessibility challenges for members with physical limitations. It was clear that the lodge needed a major fundraiser, something far more ambitious than the usual pancake breakfast or chili supper. They needed a bold idea, one that could fund the construction of a new Masonic Hall that would stand for generations.

Enter Brother Gene Gallmeister. Inspired by the popularity of Avon's collectible decanters, he envisioned a unique "bottle" featuring the square and compasses atop the Holy bible. With help from Brother Curt Dixon, the two developed a prototype and presented the concept to the lodge – and the greater fraternity. The idea gained traction quickly. With the Grand master's blessing, DuQuoin Lodge partnered with a company in Kentucky to produce the decanter mold.

Soon, 30,000 brochures were printed and distributed across the community, the Masonic fraternity, and neighboring jurisdictions. The decanter was priced at \$10.00, with 50 cents in tax and \$1.00 for shipping and handling. The first batch of 5,000 decanters was picked up in person by lodge members – and sold out almost instantly. Orders poured in from across Illinois and neighboring states, prompting additional trips to Kentucky to retrieve more inventory.

Eventually, sales were capped at 15,000 decanters. With over 30,000 brochures circulated and the cast destroyed to preserve its exclusivity, the DuQuoin decanter became a true collector's item. The lodge secured the rights to all production and used the proceeds to build a new Masonic Hall – one that remains active and vibrant to this day.

In gratitude to the community, the lodge also erected a large metal square and compasses in front of the new building, a symbol of appreciation for the support, dedication, and labor of love that made the project possible.

Legend has it that three prototypes were originally made: one gold (which went into production), one red, and one blue. The latter two never made it to market, but whispers suggest they may still be hidden away – tucked into a closet, a trunk, or a safe – waiting to be rediscovered.

Over 50 years later, these iconic decanters can still be found in Masonic lodges, homes, antique shops, and museums throughout Illinois. This story is a testament to the power of a single idea – how it can ignite a lodge, inspire a fundraiser, and transform a simple meeting into a legacy.

Though the Brothers who launched this legendary fundraiser have long since laid down their working tools, their vision and impact continue to live on.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Kentucky, Free and Accepted Masons, Most Worshipful Grand Master Brother Luke Martin, Right Worshipful Elected Grand Lodge Officers, Most Worshipful Past Grand Masters, Worshipful Appointed Grand Lodge Officers, Worshipful District Deputy Grand Masters, Worshipful Grand Lodge Committeemen, Worshipful Masters, Delegates, and My Brethren All of this 227th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky Free and Accepted Masons. Good morning!

The Committee of Jurisprudence submits the following report for your consideration.

We worked with the subordinate lodges to ensure it was in proper form to be printed and brought before the craft. Reminder, The Committee on Jurisprudence has taken the initiative and created a couple of templates to submit legislation for proposed amendments to our Book of Constitution. These templates are located on the Grand Lodge of Kentucky website. They are in the download forms section and are labeled Book of Constitution Amendment Template - Article & Section and Book of Constitution Amendment Template - Trial Code. Our hope is this will streamline the legislation submissions, and they will be in proper form on the first submission.

It is not our responsibility to decide what is good legislation and what is not. That decision rests with you, The craft of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky. Regardless of any recommendations we may make, we will ask you to move for the adoption or rejection of each piece of legislation that will be considered. Are There any Questions?

STANDING RESOLUTION NO. 23

Any Member of a Masonic Lodge within the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of Kentucky indicted on felony charges will be immediately placed on a temporary suspension of Masonic privileges within the jurisdiction of Kentucky and formal notice of temporary suspension sent to all other jurisdictions documented pending current legal investigation by the current grandmaster and if found innocent all suspensions removed and masonic privileges reinstated with no formal reprimands documented and all appropriate jurisdictions notified of the temporary suspended members reinstatement from his temporary suspension within 72 hours of the grand lodge being notified of innocence.

1. The temporarily suspended member must continue to pay dues during his temporary suspension in order to

stay in good standing.

- 2. If member does not pay current dues or has not paid dues he is to be suspended but will not have his masonic privileges reinstated until said investigation is completed and restored by the current grand master.*
- 3. If the temporary suspended mason is found guilty all dues paid during his temporary suspension are forfeit to his home lodge and will not be refunded.*
- 4. If found guilty the temporary suspension will lead to immediate expulsion from the Masonic fraternity as pursuant to any member found guilty of unmasonic charges or will move to formal charges and masonic charges and trial as appropriate.*

ARTICLE 15 (B) PETITION FOR MEMBERSHIP SECTION 2 - PLURAL MEMBERSHIP.

A Master Mason in good standing in a lodge of this Grand Jurisdiction, or in a lodge of a sister Grand Jurisdiction which does not forbid Plural Membership, may apply for affiliation to any lodge or lodges of his choice, or he may join in the application for the formation of a new lodge in this Grand Jurisdiction, and if such lodge be formed, he may retain his former membership, and also his new membership, but shall thereon and thereafter pay all dues and assessments required by each lodge, and shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of membership in each lodge. Suspension or expulsion from any lodge shall suspend or expel him from every lodge with which he may be affiliated in this Grand Jurisdiction, and reinstatement may only be made by the lodge that first suspended him, and upon his reinstatement in that lodge, he shall automatically be reinstated in all lodges with which he may be affiliated, providing he has paid his indebtedness to such other lodges.

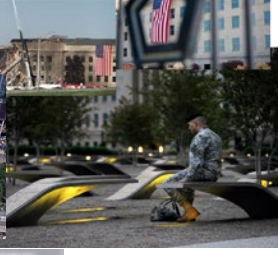

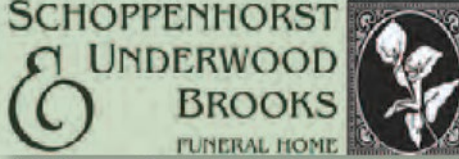
