“Growing old in Kentucky Freemasonry”

Brothers, a little over four years ago I had the distinct honor of being the guest speaker for WB Mark Upchurch's District 22, district meeting. The main focus that year by our Grand Master was the status or state of affairs of the lodge which included the number of members, EA, FC and MM's along with deaths, initiations, advancements and raisings, basically the retention and activity of our members. I opened my presentation with the legend of the Apprentice Pillar that majestically stands within the Rosslyn Chapel in Scotland. Of the Master Mason who assigned an Apprentice to carve the Pillar while he, the Master, sailed to a foreign land to study a piece of work and return to create that, which the uninstructed Apprentice failed to complete. Upon his return he found that the Apprentice had completed the pillar and that he had done so with such skill that the Master Mason could never have hoped to achieve. In his anger and jealousy the Master Mason struck and killed the Apprentice with blow to the head. For ages now, the beautiful pillar stands in the Chapel, with the head of the murderous master carved on one wall, forever gazing at the Pillar and on the opposite wall the head of the Apprentice, forever gazing at his murderer. The story teaches three lessons that we should not forget. First, it is the duty of every Mason to empower another Mason to succeed. Second, that we are taught to circumscribe our passions and keep them within due bounds. We only succeed in an environment of those who best can work and best agree. Finally, that which comes from the Pillar: the lesson of doing what we are expected to do in the best way that we can, regardless of the consequences. The Master Mason set the Apprentice up for failure but the Apprentice did his best because he wanted to create a thing of beauty.

With the help of our PGM Keith Dreier, drawing from our database and using this analogy as a means of explaining our current statewide membership status at the time, I reported that our total membership was 38,354; 178 were 18-20; 1,604 were 21-30; 3,093 were 31-40; 4,359 were 41-50; 5,758 were 51-60; 8,316 were 61-70; 7,712 were 71-80; 4,720 were 81-90; 1,024 were 90-100; and 130 were supposedly 101 years of age. Less than 5% of our membership were below the age of 30. The average statewide age of our membership was 65 years of age and the median was 58.

Today, drawing that same information from our database our total membership is down 5,375 members and now 32,979 and our average statewide age is 64. Those between the ages of 18-20 are 107; 1,355 are 21-30; 2,563 are 31-40; 3,729 are 41-50; 4,744 are 51-60; 6,727 are 61-70; 7,195 are 71-80; 4,182 are 81-90; 1,103 are 91-100; and 75 are supposedly over the age of 101. We also have 1,199 members that have no dates of birth recorded in our database.

Brothers, please create your own member page if you have not done so by going to www.grandlodgeofkentucky.org and requesting membership. You can do your own change of address, DOB, phone numbers, email, etc. which would greatly assist not only the lodge secretary but the Grand Lodge Office. Secretaries please update our database and members.

Brothers, we are growing older and older every day without younger, vibrant membership to see to preserving our Ancient and Accepted Organization. We need to encourage these young members, allow them to participate in our ritual work by having them learn a lecture, re: Working Tools, Bible, and Apron Lectures. Allow them to be Stewards in the respective degrees working alongside a knowledgeable member who will see to their training. Make them feel as if they are wanted and needed. We should be conferring our degrees to the fullest as required by our Constitution, all sections and charges delivered. We need to be making the candidate feel important and that the night was all about them. We cannot continue to shorten our work for the sake of saving time. We must preserve what has been so graciously placed in our hands to pass on to future generations.

1. What can we do to improve ourselves in displaying and practicing the tenets of our profession?
2. What can we do to improve the way we educate and share our knowledge of Speculative Freemasonry as we teach those new brothers that come behind us?
3. What can we do and what steps can we take, as a Fraternity to reach out to the younger generation around us and draw their attention without making innovations to Freemasonry?

My questions and concerns; Are we driving off our new members by not mentoring them, encouraging them to proceed and making them feel as if they are needed and important? Are we not fully informing them and making them understand the time required to learn and advance or are we just casually taking them for the sake of an income and increased membership? I am sure that there are some that petition us thinking that it only requires a petition fee, yearly membership and when voted on and accepted that, that is all there is to membership? Nothing could be further from the truth.

Let us not be like the Master of olden day and we set our membership and ourselves up for failure? Remember brothers the night we were placed in the North East Corner of the Lodge to represent the Corner or Foundation Stone of the edifice we were to erect. My brothers the Temple we were charged to erect is not building in which we meet. The real lodge referred to throughout our ritual is ourselves, that which houses the soul given by God. So let us remember to walk uprightly throughout our lives as the men we profess to be and have obligated ourselves to be. We must be Living Stones, stone to build and to be built upon. We must see to the mentoring and instruction of our members, young and old. We have been charged to assist our lesser informed brothers, who should be willing to receive as we are willing to give instruction. Brothers, let us strive to be superstructures, perfect in all its parts and honorable to its builder.

My Brethren, we have all heard these peculiar phrases, questions and answers many times. But why do they say them and what do they mean? Have you ever received wages, or even seen the Senior Warden perform that part of his duty? Did not the Temple get completed? 
within your Symbolic Lodge. **IF** it was issued prior to the 1970's, it should say something of about Ancient York Freemasonry.

“I Didn’t Know That.....”

Kentucky’s Lady Mason, Catherine Sweet Babington, is probably responsible for the ‘lady mason’ stories found in North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Virginia, Maryland, Tennessee, and Alabama as she traveled with her husband Benjamin B. Babington, a ‘furnace man’ whose jobs took him to these states. Perhaps her obituary notice which appeared in the Shelby Aurora (Shelby, N.C.), June 28, 1886, can give a brief account of how Mrs. Babington became known as a Mason.

The obituary reads as follows: “BABINGTON. An aged and estimable lady, Mrs. Catherine (Sweet) Babington died in Shelby, on Monday evening, June 28th, 1886, and she died as she lived, a Christian. As the sun was marshaling his golden crimson and saffron hues in the West, and preparing for his departure, her sun set to arise on a fairer shore, and her soul took its flight to a land where there is no night. She was born in Kentucky, in 1815, and married in 1834, to B. B. Babington, who died ten years ago. For over a half century she was a gentle and true member of the Methodist church and frequently expressed in her last illness a willingness to die. At her death she as the only female Mason in the United States and was well versed in the mysterious workings of the Blue Lodge. Having overheard the secrets of Masonry when she was a girl of sixteen years, it was thought best to initiate her as a member and thus prevent disclosure.”

Her son, J. P. Babington wrote a biography of his mother, titled “Biography of Catherine Babington, the only Woman Mason in the World, and how she became a Blue Lodge Mason”. Both her husband and her son were Masons.

Born in Princess Furnace, Boyd County, Kentucky (now Princess, Greenup County) as a young girl, she spent much of her life living nearby at her Grandfather Benjamin Ulen’s home, where she was favored by her uncles. At least two of them were Masons. There is strong evidence that she could not be a Mason (no lodge listed near her uncle’s home) but much of this evidence can be explained away. Certainly many Masons in various states believed her story and she was incredibly knowledgeable, that at times, Masons would seek her out for Masonic advice. She is said to have instructed her husband in Masonry and used a Masonic sign which saved her and the children, when rafting out of control down the Ohio River. An in depth study will still leave you wondering!!


