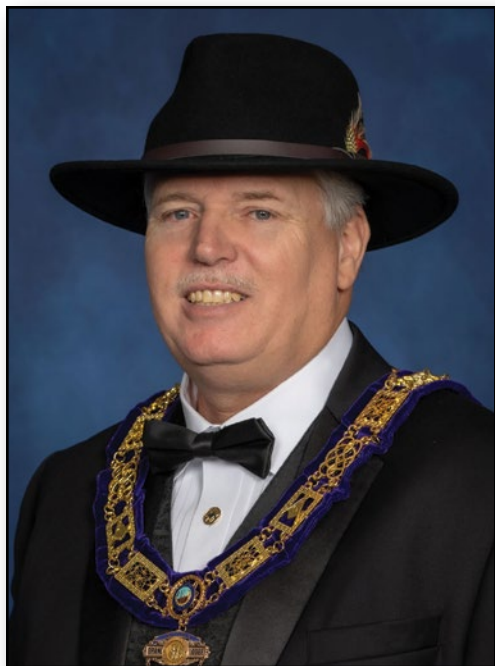

Brothers, families, and friends, Kentucky summer has a way of reminding us what perseverance feels like. The days are hot, the schedules are full, and yet our Masonic family continues to show up—with steady hands, generous hearts, and a clear purpose: caring for our youth, strengthening families at home, and serving the communities we love.

Thank you all for your support throughout this year. It is hard to believe how quickly my journey as Grand Master is moving toward our next Grand Lodge Session in October. What began as a year of travel, fellowship, and service now feels like a collection of stories—handshakes at lodge doors, meals shared around tables, encouragement from brethren, and reminders that Kentucky Masonry remains strong because our brothers remain committed.

Kentucky Masonry has deep roots. The first Masonic lodge in what is now Kentucky was chartered in Lexington in 1788, when the Commonwealth was still part of Virginia and the frontier was being shaped by courage, faith, and hard work. The Grand Lodge of Kentucky was formed in 1800, and for more than two centuries our lodges have helped build communities through brotherhood, charity, education, and quiet service.

That history is not just something printed in old proceedings or displayed in lodge halls. It lives when a brother checks on a widow, when a lodge supports a local family, when a young person is encouraged to lead, and when our members choose to make their communities better without asking for applause. The tools may be symbolic, but the work is very real.

June and July gave us wonderful memories with our Masonic youth. We celebrated with **Rainbow Assembly** in Shepherdsville and joined **DeMolay** at their Conclave in Cave City. These young people remind us why our support matters. They are learning leadership, confidence, service, respect, and responsibility—the same values Masonry has carried from generation to generation.

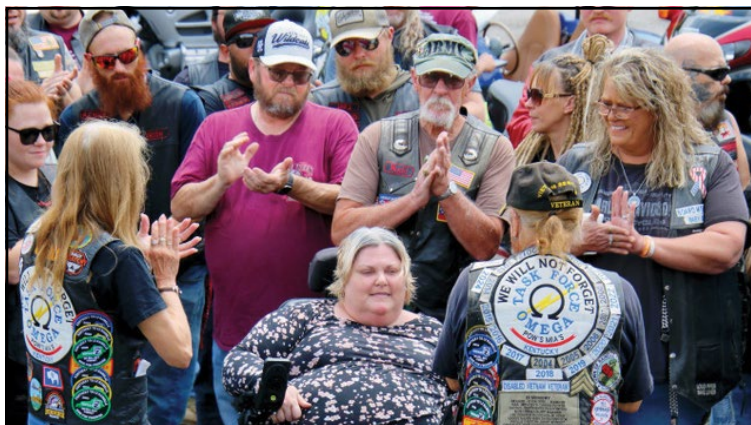

GRAND HISTORIAN'S NOTES

This month, we have a guest article from Brother Danny Rutheford. This was presented at the District #10 meeting on June 16th, 2026.

CEASE FIRE

On April 4th, 1824, a baby boy named John Elliot Hart was born to Benjamin Franklin Hart and his wife, Sarah Ann Copp Hart of New York City. The child's namesake was his maternal grandfather, John Elliot Copp, who was in the Navy and killed in the "forgotten war", the War of 1812.

In the 1850's, John Elliot Hart moved to Schenectady, New York, where he would marry Harriet "Hattie" Van Vorst, who was the daughter of the town's mayor, Abram A. Van Vorst, on January 27th, 1855. They would have three children together, with both a son and a daughter dying in infancy. The couple's only surviving child was a son named Abraham Elliot Hart.

In 1857, John Hart would join the local Masonic Lodge, St. George's Lodge #6. He was initiated on July 24th, passed on September 24th, and raised to the sublime degree of a Master Mason on December 21st, 1857. This degree would have been conferred in New York City. He would achieve the office of Worshipful Master a few years later in St. George's #6.

Brother Hart would begin his military career at the young age of 16 when he was appointed Midshipman in the United States Navy on February 23rd, 1841. By sometime in 1842, he is serving on the famous battleship "Old Ironsides" herself, the USS Constitution. In October of 1846, he was detached from the Constitution to educate himself at the United States Naval School in Annapolis, Maryland, which was formed the previous year in 1845. It would be renamed the United States Naval Academy in 1850. He there took classes that would be necessary for his advancement in his military career in the Navy. He would sail on various ships, advancing his rank in the process. He was appointed Lieutenant Commander on July 16th, 1862. His command would be aboard the small gunboat the USS Albatross, taking the helm on August 5th, 1862. This boat was part of the squadron of Flag Officer Admiral David G. Farragut.

Military records show Lieutenant Commander John Elliot Hart was killed on June the 11th, 1863, while on the Mississippi River South of Port Hudson in the state of Louisiana, which lies just north of Baton Rouge. The Albatross was part of a bombardment of the town of St. Francisville, LA. In the small town, there were said to be several Confederate soldiers in the area. The ranking officer of the Confederate forces was Captain William Walter Leake. Most of the shells being fired from the Albatross were able to reach the town, its courthouse, and the Grace Episcopal Church, which we will cover a little later.

During this bombardment, Lieutenant Commander Hart would perish. It is said he was suffering from a high fever, having contracted yellow fever. Being delirious, he took his own life by suicide with a pistol in his quarters. Other accounts say that wasn't the case. With his death, this was when the phrase you hear while researching this topic, "the day the war stopped" would be coined. Several of Hart's crew aboard the Albatross were also Masons. With Brother Hart making it known that he would want a Masonic Funeral if he were to die, his crew felt determined to grant the last wishes of their Commander, and Brother by trying to contact some local Masonic Brethren in St. Francisville. Paddling through the river with a white flag flying from the boat, some of the crew went ashore in St. Francisville. The local Masonic Lodge would be Feliciana Lodge #31. While researching this topic, I discovered that Feliciana Lodge #31 was Chartered by the Grand Lodge of Kentucky F&AM on August the 27th, of 1817. The Grand Lodge of Kentucky stated the name of the lodge located there as Feliciana Lodge #46, according to the Grand Lodge Proceedings of 1817. The lodge would join the Grand Lodge of Louisiana in 1828.

Two brothers who lived near the riverbank by the names of Samuel and Benjamin White, who were not members of Feliciana Lodge, but who had

visited it on numerous occasions, were contacted by the boat's inhabitants as to the possibility of a local Masonic Lodge being in St. Francisville. The Master of the lodge was Captain S. J. Powell, but he was currently away from home fighting for the Confederacy. Brother Powell would go on to become the Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Louisiana in 1877. The Lodge's Senior Warden, however, is Captain William. W. Leake and he likewise was also serving in the Confederate Army, but was in the area at that time. After the White brothers contacted Brother Leake, the Albatross's Lieutenant Commander, and the ship's Surgeon, who were both Masons and would vouch for Brother Hart's membership to entitle him to receive a Masonic Funeral, spoke with the two White brothers to "prove" themselves to them as well. When made aware of the situation, it is said that Brother Leake made the following statement, "as a Mason, it is my duty to accord Masonic burial to a Brother Mason without taking into account the nature of our relations outside Masonry. Go tell the Union officer to bring his Captain ashore. There are a few Masons in town; I shall find all I can. You two are Masons, I shall want you at the funeral service."

The ship's crew brought Brother Hart's body ashore, clothed in his Union blue officer's uniform. It was met by the White brothers, as well as four members from Feliciana Lodge #31 wearing their Masonic Aprons over their Confederate gray uniforms. After both groups of men identifying themselves to be Masons to the opposing side, the Last Masonic Rites were performed in the Masonic section of the graveyard of the aforementioned church, Grace Episcopal. A grave had been dug here by the Brothers in the area; this same graveyard would have had shells exploding in it that had come from the USS Albatross, the ship that was under the command of Brother Hart. Once the Masonic Funeral had concluded, the Union forces returned to their ship, dropped their colors from the mast, weighed anchor, and sailed off from the area on the Mississippi River.

When word reached Hattie Hart, John's wife, she expressed a desire to move his remains back to New York. There are no official government papers as to what happened after the request was made. Lieutenant Commander John Elliot Hart's body is still resting in Grace Episcopal Church in St. Francisville, LA. His grave was said to have been marked by a simple wooden board referred to as the Yankee grave. Sometime around 1900, Feliciana Lodge appealed to the United States Navy, and a proper marble headstone was erected. Captain William W. Leake, having survived the war, went on to become Master of Feliciana Lodge #31 and served the Craft for 55 years. Long before his death, he had begun making sure that Brother Hart's grave was properly maintained and keeping flowers placed on it, and upon his death in 1912, he was laid to rest next to his Masonic Brother that he had never actually met, but had shown the respect that every Mason should show one another. On January 8th, 1956, the Grand Lodge of Louisiana F&AM unveiled a new monument that covers the entire grave of Brother Hart.

Now, here we are 163 years since the death of our Masonic Brother Lieutenant Commander John Elliot Harp, and this day in history is still being memorialized even today. Beginning in 1997 on the second Saturday in June, the Brothers from Feliciana Lodge #31 in St. Francisville, LA, along with the Brothers of St. George's Lodge #6 of Schenectady, NY, reenact and memorialize this event. Hopefully, some of our Kentucky Brethren will be able to witness this in the future. I know I sure hope to.

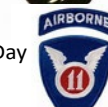
